had disappeared without anyone getting a look at it.

Winnie Ruth, now 48, escaped the gallows by 72 hours in 1933 when she was adjudged insane after being convicted of first degree murder.

Mrs. Judd told Dr. Conway she had escaped by sliding down an improvised rope from a third-story tower storeroom of the ward in which she was confined. She said the rope, fashioned from restraining harness and clothing, broke about 15 feet from the ground and she fell. Her back was bruised.

Mrs. Judd, in contrast to her usual condition upon recapture four times previously, seemed composed. Dr. Conway took her back to her ward through a back gate. She was given a sedative and put to bed.

"I'm quite sure she came back because of the grand jury situation," said Dr. Archer.

Tuesday night, an unidentified woman had telephoned the sheriff's office and said Mrs. Judd would surrender if assured she would be given an opportunity to appear before the grand jury.

Wednesday morning the acting foreman of the jury announced Mrs. Judd would be subpoenaed when she was recaptured or released.

waterfront, adding he sometimes puts a few walls in the way of the river—or throws a dam across it to change its course.

This seemed to be another indication that if he believes the river is running toward the nomination of a man he doesn't want, he will step in to direct its flow either to the man of his choice or to himself.

The President made it clear he intends to take an active part in this year's campaign, even if he isn't the Presidential nominee.

In response to a question as to whether he would campaign for Senator Benton, (R-Conn.) whether that was part of a set plan—Truman said he wanted the reporters to have a clear understanding of the situation.

He will do everything he possibly can to help elect the Democratic nominee no matter who he is, the President said, and if he is invited to any special meetings he will do whatever he can to elect Senator Benton. He is a good GOP supporter, he added.

At another point, Truman was asked if he would vote for Senator Russell (D-Or) if Russell should receive the Democratic Presidential nomination.

If Senator Russell is head of the Democratic ticket this fall, the President said, he would vote for him.

workers and at the same time actively persuade them that it is the right and just and wise thing to do.

"I mean sharing the profits with every worker and employ of a company . . . to include everyone from the office boy and janitor to the head of the company."

**Two Sessions Still in Doubt**  
**Hinges on MHS Enrollment and Classroom Space, Bailey Declares**

Whether Manchester High School will go on double sessions next fall and what kind of double sessions will be organized depends upon the enrollment and the classroom space available for high school use, according to Edson M. Bailey, high school principal.

"Next year will be the highest enrollment in the school's history," Mr. Bailey predicted today. He pointed out that the local increase will come in the face of a nationwide downward trend expected to continue for a few years. "The influx of people into Manchester" he explained, "has offset this downward trend."

As a result of this out, each session would probably contain six to eight sessions. It will mean a cut of about 20 per cent in the time each student spends in school, Principal Bailey pointed out.

**Green School Job Assigned**  
**Sheekey Appoints Lawrence to Draw Plans For Modernization**

The fourth of the five projects in the town's current school-building expansion program was assigned to Lawrence, who is acting as general manager of the project.

James H. Sheekey appointed local architect Arnold Lawrence to draw the plans and specifications for the modernization of the Manchester Green School.

This marks the second school project assignment given Lawrence, whose office is at 569 Main street. Last month he was appointed to draw the plans for the two-room expansion to the South School. His preliminary plans for this project, which have already been approved by the Board of Education and the State Board of Education, are scheduled for completion by the School Building Committee on Monday.

As called for by the Board of Education, modernization of the Green School includes the addition of a new auditorium and the conversion of the present auditorium into a classroom and principal's office, as well as the construction of additional sanitary facilities.

The project now awaiting the assignment of an architect is the proposed 2,000-student high school to be built on Memorial street at an estimated cost of \$2,500,000. Last month, besides appointing Arnold to the "South School" project, Sheekey appointed Arthur W. Dunbar, representative of the firm of C. L. Mainelli and Associates to prepare the plans.
