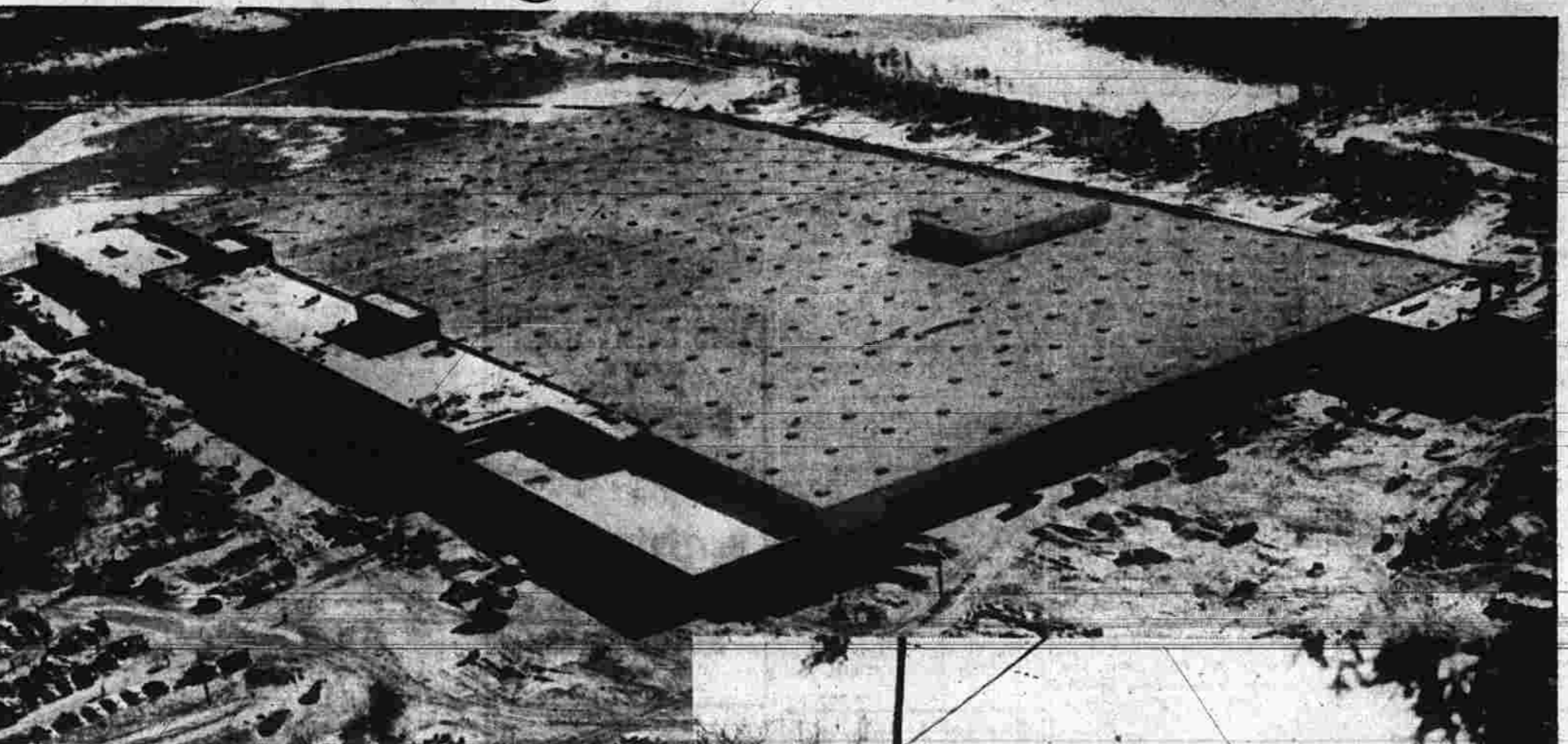

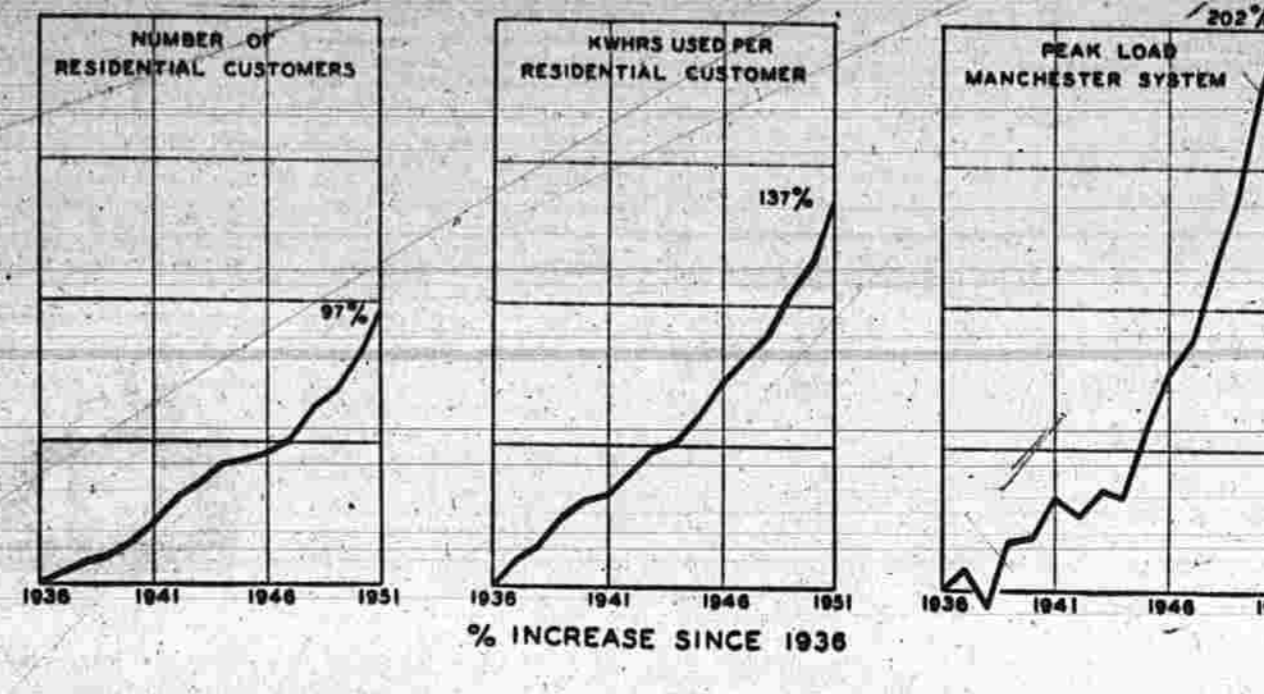

New 115,000 Volt Line and Substation Provides More Electric Power Connecticut Power Co. Provides For Manchester's Growing Load Line and Station Now In Service

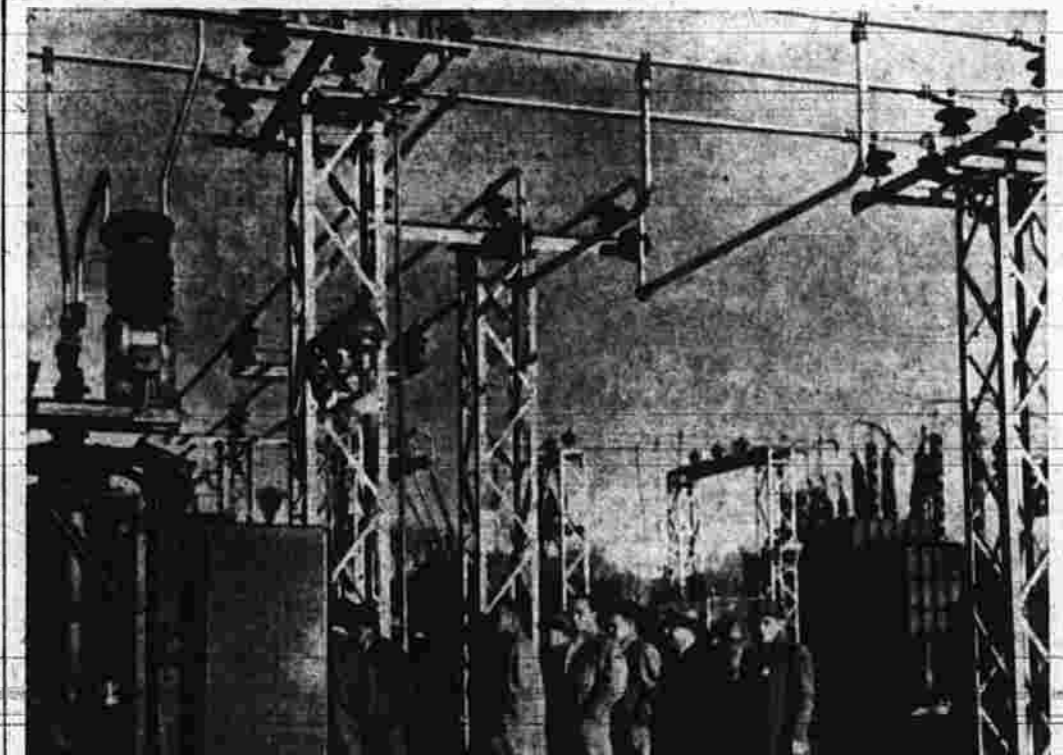
The new 115,000 volt line to Manchester and substation on Olcott Street have been in service for several weeks. In fact the substation and one circuit of the line were in service over the December "peak" when the Manchester load exceeded 15,000 K.W. However, just in case any "hugs" developed in the new equipment the company waited until February 12th before placing its new transmission facilities "in permanent service."



Because of its proximity to the Rentschler Field in East Hartford approval of the location and design of the line in that area had to meet the requirements of the Civil Aeronautics Administration. Approval of the location of the line and its design which included the use of low flat top towers near the airport was not secured from its Boston office until July, 1951.

Manchester's Future Needs Cared For. New Facilities Cost \$1,300,000. Capacity of Substation Can Be Increased. Each of the two transformers in the new substation has a rating of 21,000 K.W. and with the addition of oil circulation and fan cooling the rated capacity of each can be increased to 45,000 K.W.

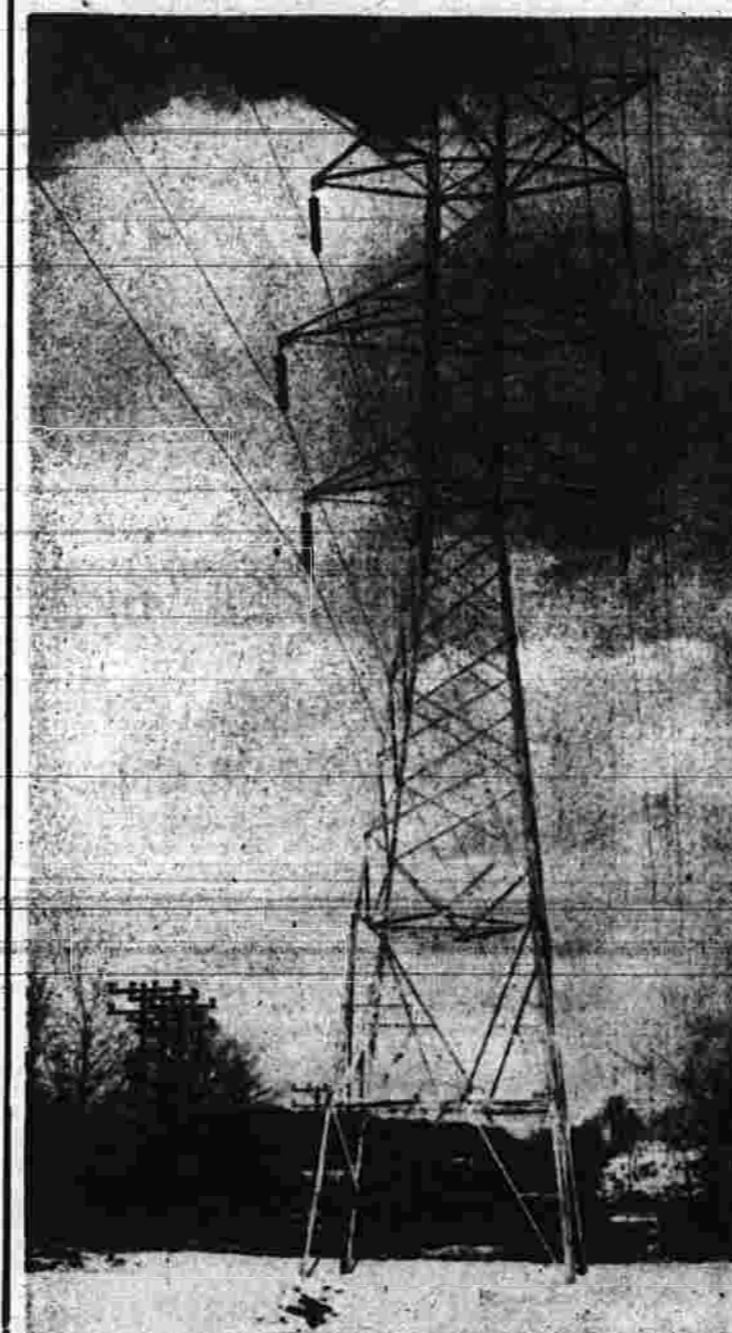
Safety Record Good. No Men Hurt. Three Service Interruptions. In spite of the fact that the new line was constructed without a single interruption of service, both of which caused short interruptions of service. One was caused by a workman accidentally tripping a switch in the substation and later on the same day a rope broke allowing a conductor to swing into the 115,000 volt circuit.

New Substation on Olcott Street, Manchester, which is fed from the 115,000 volt two circuit steel tower line. From it, Manchester's power supply is taken over three 22,000 volt lines and a part of the Hartford Electric Light Company's load in East Hartford is carried by the two circuit 22,000 volt line running back to East Hartford on the tower line right of way.

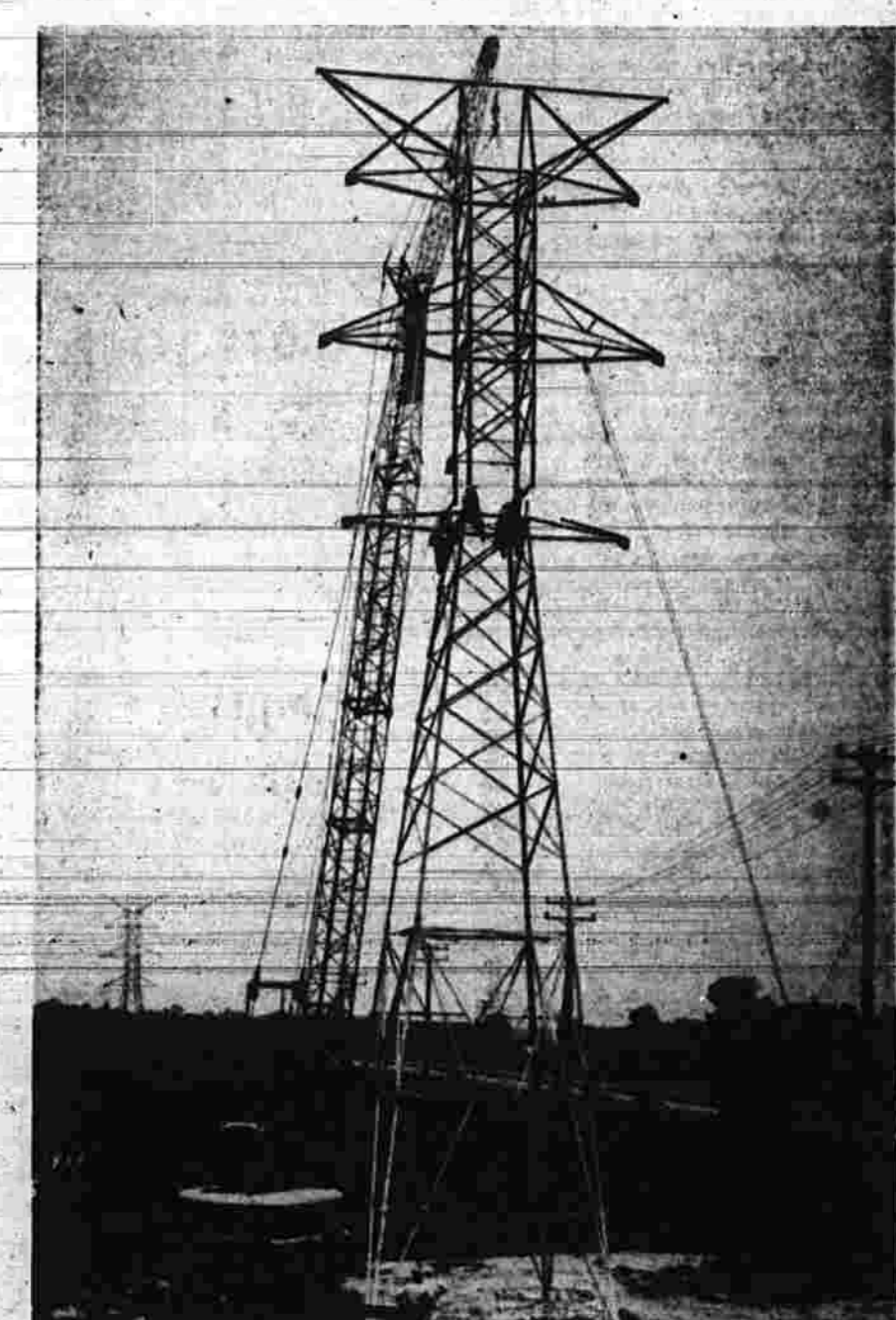
Part of the Line of High Tension Towers Carrying Electricity To Manchester



A straight away section of the two circuit 115,000 volt tower line. Each circuit consists of three phase wires and there are two wires on the top of the tower which protect against lightning.



A corner tower in the 115,000 volt line requires especially heavy construction. When the line runs straight away the pull of the wires on one direction is balanced by the pull of the wires in the opposite direction and the wires "hold" the tower up.

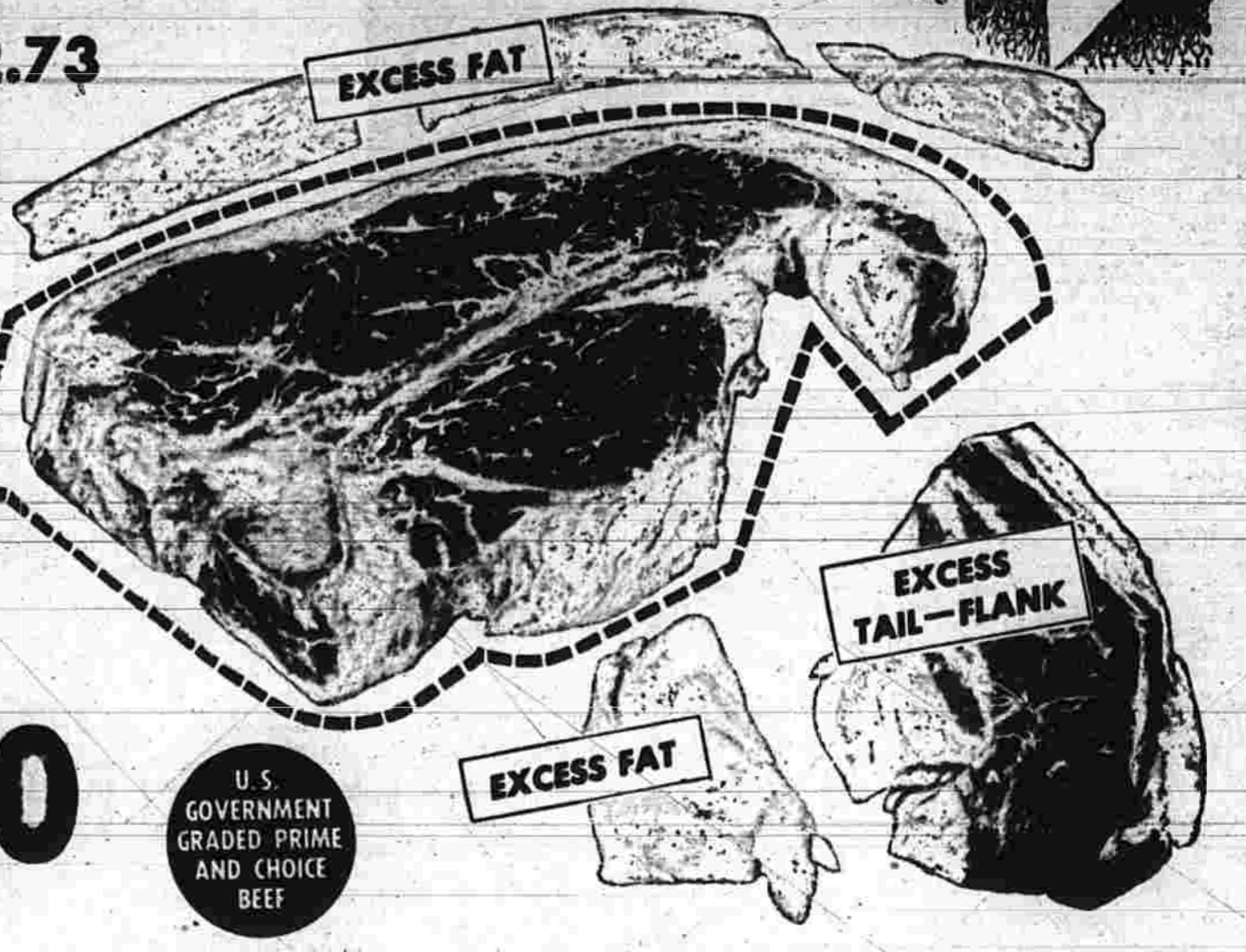
