Ike, Kefauver Hit On Racial Issue
(Continued from Page One)

should not shake public confidence in the military leadership.

Mr. Kefauver was in the Far West campaigning broadly and talking about everything from potatoes to foreign policy.

Moving into Idaho, Taft said the recent price order on white potatoes—has been in Idaho—was an example of "federal meddling in industry."

Speaking in Boise and Pocatello, he said (1) workers and farmers deserve government aid but only to give them equality with a free enterprise system, (2) the GOP won't use a "no-loo" policy, and (3) the administration's Far East policy is wrong and the Chinese Nationalists should be armed. Today he moves to Cheyenne, Wyo.

Kefauver was in New Hampshire on a campaign to build up his strength in the state's primary, first in the nation. He met a lot of people, shook hands, and took a stand on the controversial Vietnam question.

Various Veterans Events

The Tennessee state fair is favoring a personal envoy to the Veterans National Convention, as proposed by President Truman.

Gov. Earl Warren of California, another GOP candidate, is implied in New York he does not believe Gen. Douglas MacArthur is the man to lead the Republic's convention and should not favor any special candidate. MacArthur has been re-elected and should not be denied. He has neither confirmed nor denied it.

Warren also said, "I can't say that I find myself in any great disagreement with Gen. Eisenhower on his foreign policy."

Down in strongly Democratic Louisiana, the state's handful of Republicans were holding the political headlines. An Eisenhower faction demanding a voice in the pro-Taft GOP State Central committee said a court decision today may play a role in the Presidential race.

The Eisenhower faction wants the court to force the Taft forces to accept a "difficult decision" to recognize returns of a Jan. 15 primary in which the GOP unexpectedly won 10 committee seats.

Raps Mac, the Alamo Harold E. Stassen, former Minnesota Governor, backing Taft, Eisenhower and Warren for the GOP nomination, said in New York he favors a world-wide program to combat Communism. He said he is for neither MacArthur's "Asia-first" policy nor Eisenhower's reported "Europe-first" attitude in buildup of strength.

In Washington a sampling of Senate opinion indicated Democrats are sharply divided on whether President Truman should run again. Truman said yesterday he faces a "difficult decision" in making up his mind.

How many Democratic Senators were interviewed by Jack-Bell Associated Press political writer. His count: Two said Truman should run, one called him the "most logical candidate, two said he should not run, two predicted he will not, one said he favored Senator Russell (D-Ga.) and one would not comment.

One Republican—Senator Martin of Pennsylvania—said he hopes Truman does, as it will draw the campaign issues sharply.

Another Republican, Sen. A. L. Bridges of New Hampshire, said it doesn't make much difference—so that the Republicans are going to win anyway.

Church-State Debate Discord on Issue Grows Louder

(This is the fifth and last in a series of stories on Church-State issues.)

By GEORGE CORNELL.

New York, Feb. 14.—Although most of the country's religious bodies have formed closer alliances in recent years, discord is flaring in some quarters today.

Several modern issues, most of them revolving around "Church-State separation," have precipitated the collision, chiefly between Roman Catholics and other faiths.

The President's move to send an ambassador to the Vatican set off the latest outbreak. It has wandered far afield from the specific issue.

Charles V. Glock, manager of Columbia University's Bureau of Applied Social Research, said: "This issue can sometimes act as a spark for others. They can retard the assimilation of people and segment them into opposing groups. What starts as a narrow trip can lead to broad plumbing."

No Contact Points

Dr. Reinhold Niebuhr, professor of Applied Christianity at Union Theological Seminary, commented: "Protestant and Catholic relations have almost never been worse. There are practically no points of contact between the two."

Father Moorehouse Miller, chairman of Fordham University's Department of Political Philosophy, said that the trouble is "a lack of a great need for clarification of what is fact and what is fable."

Many Protestant publications and speeches have treated with broad accusations against the Catholic Church. Catholic journals have recorded their replies and counter-attacks. But the respective audiences usually hear only one side.

Here are some of the areas of argument, summarized from printed materials and statements by church leaders.

Claim: The Roman Catholic hierarchy seeks a Church-State union in the United States.

Reply: The official position of the Catholic Church is that Church and State are two distinct institutions. The church is spiritual, temporal, and that neither should encroach into the sphere of the other.

Demise of the Church-State union, which is contained in various papal encyclicals and pronouncements of the past, condemning Church-State separation.

Reply: In such instances, the Holy Fathers speaking in a historical climate that has no reference to our own, and which does not apply to the democratic states which have evolved in the Anglo-American world.

Claim: Many Protestants have made the practical policy of Church-State separation a shibboleth of doctrinaire secularism, which would exclude all concentration between government and religion.

Reply: Protestants see religion as the base of our secular institutions, but hold that religion

Nunan Faces 2 Tax Probes

Washington, Feb. 16—(AP)—Joseph D. Nunan, Jr., today faced possible investigation by the Justice Department and Congress into his relations with firms having tax troubles.

The Revenue Bureau said Nunan, after resigning as U. S. Tax Commissioner in June, 1947, sought and obtained permission to represent such firms.

The fast-moving case brought these late developments: Senator George (D., Ga.) announced the revenue bureau had advised his Senate Finance Committee that it turned over to the Justice Department for prosecution all nine tax cases in which Nunan's name appeared.

Senator William (R., Del.) of Delaware inquired whether a potent factor in unearthing tax evasion schemes would be to insist that Nunan repeat under oath the details of his involvement in the Indianapolis Brewing Co. case.

This newest, many-sided income tax probe was given a boost by a Senate speech Thursday in which William (R., Del.) said that the Indianapolis Brewing Co. case, which involved a \$35,000 fine and a \$100,000 tax penalty, was a case of "tax evasion."
