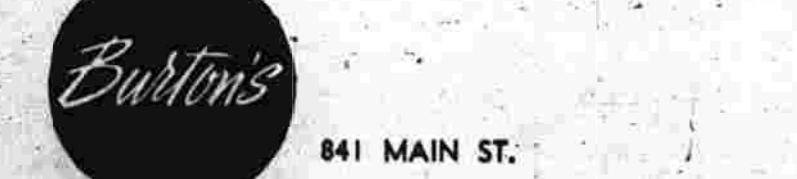

November Accident Source Of Hartford Man's Woes

A Hartford man really got himself into trouble when he had an accident on Hackmeck street last November. Plumbers' Move May Spark Complete Revision of Code

Request by a group of meter-traversing a street on a green light has the right of way over all traffic making left or right turns.

The board last night also voted to hold a joint public hearing with the Town Planning Commission on March 4 to accept the subdivision map of the area bounded by the proposed eight-acre subdivision of the Bess-Burn realty company which would be located on Green road near White street and is expected to contain 28 houses.

Director Harry Pirato, who has been making a comparative study of the Manchester building code and other in the state, made the motion, stating that our building code is in need of review.

The study that the committee will undertake will be broad in scope, taking in all aspects of the building department.

In making his motion, Pirato said that if such a review were undertaken, it would satisfy the plumbers' request for revision of the plumbing ordinance.

Less Prolonged
But the plumbers, who had been asking for months that the ordinance relating to the licensing of plumbers be brought into line with others in the state and who had submitted a list of recommendations for changes in the ordinance, an out of patience, a study and reports back to the board on the matter.

Little had told the board that any plumbers from neighboring towns coming into Manchester to do a job could get combination plumbing and heating license for \$20, while plumbers have to pay \$45 for license to do similar work in most of the other towns in the state.

Heating Proposals
At the same time that the board takes action on the plumbers' recommendation for licensing of master plumbers, it will take under consideration a list of proposed regulations for oil burners and boilers submitted by a group of heating-equipment outfits in town. This list has been waiting action since June.

In other matters last night, the board was told by Chief of Police Herman O. Schenkel that in his opinion it would not be feasible to install a "wall" signal in the traffic light at the corner of Oak, Main and St. James streets.

Director Katherine Bourne had raised the question of installing such a signal at that center at a meeting two weeks ago. At that time she said that it was difficult for pedestrians to cross Main street at Oak on the green light because of traffic turning south from St. James and Oak streets.

Chief Schenkel, however, said that the light on Main street are set for progressive traffic and a "wall" light would disrupt the flow of traffic.

He added that, in any case, according to state law, the pedestrian has the right of way.
