Ethics of Newbold Morris
 Newbold Morris is a nice fellow, something of a symbol, an American public morality case, the honest, independent individual. Yet, thanks to his obvious toleration of certain professional codes of conduct, he looks sick as he is on the stand in the investigation of the oil tanker deal.
 In one part of his testimony Morris proclaimed that he personally had not made a cent on the oil tanker deal.
 Later, he was forced to admit that his law firm had received \$108,000 in fees for its work in the intricate transactions involved in the deal, and that his personal share in that was probably \$30,000. Still he maintained that he had not personally profited. The \$30,000, he said, was a fee.
 The thin line Morris was defending in this instance was this: that the fact that the \$30,000 was in the nature of a professional fee removed all possible taint from the money.
 In another part of his testimony, Morris, seeming to admit that the tanker deal was a thing from the point of view of the government and the public interest, attacked Congress for having allowed such operations to be legal. What ought to be done, he said, was to pass a law which would make such operations illegal.

Connecticut Yankee
 By A. H. O.
 A carefully planned boom aimed at high strategic purpose in the state Republican picture, encountered sudden and unexpected collapse over in Eastern Connecticut the other night.
 The situation, in advance of the sudden collapse, seemed to be one in which at least one powerful political factor, which is controlling the state party leadership of Governor Lodge and Republican State Chairman Baldwin, not only on general state policy, but also on the question of state delegates for Eisenhower, had found the clever maneuver for organizing and deploying its strength.
 The plan of operation, apparently originated by State Comptroller Fred Zeller, was to place Congressman H. R. Seely-Brown, Jr. in the race for the nomination for the United States Senate, thus contributing to the possibility of a deadlock in the Republican State Convention on the senatorial nomination, which might in its turn be resolved only by a concession from the state organization on the matter of some delegate to the convention.
 It was a clever scheme, sound politically.
 Furthermore, Comptroller Zeller had, as his prospective instrument for carrying it out, the Eastern Connecticut Republican Association, which he organized several months ago precisely for the purpose of binding Eastern Connecticut into a cohesive unit for effective defense of the Zeller position.
 When a meeting of this association was called, and it was announced that the purpose of the meeting would be to endorse Congressman Seely-Brown, Jr. for the senatorial nomination, it seemed that the strategy would be successful. The Zeller forces in the state had begun to move in terms of a concrete political strategy. It was recognized, of course, that the Seely-Brown candidacy was to be a strategic move, and not really in the nature of a serious aspiration on his part.

Increase Noted In Idle Claims
 State Labor Department figures show that unemployment in the Manchester area during the week that ended March 8 jumped 10.9 per cent, an increase that has been attributed to layoffs in the garment and textile industries. The 10.9 per cent increase represents a total of 218 persons filing claims for unemployment compensation benefits as opposed to 198 last week. Of the total, 110 were women, who generally constituted more than half of those filing for benefits, and there were 27 initial claims. Despite the sharp increase in Manchester unemployment, the employment situation throughout the state remained fairly stable, with an increase from 37,777 to 37,886 being noted.

Out of The Rut
 The pattern of the Eisenhower victory in the New Hampshire primary confirms the best hopes of his supporters. It was a fresh wind blowing through Republican ranks—the kind of fresh wind the party needs if it hopes to become a real contender for national power again.
 In the New Hampshire voting, Eisenhower carried every city except one. Of the 221 communities classified as small towns—in which Taft was supposed to be strongest—Eisenhower carried 148. In summary, Eisenhower carried both the industrial and the rural centers of the state. He doing, he confounded all the analysis and forecast of professional observers.
 Within the Republican party itself, then, there was a rebellion against preconceived allegiances. Individual Republicans refused to have the way the professional politicians expected them to behave. They were making up their own minds in their own way, and the reasons they were doing it were two. First, they were tired of the routine political offering. Second, they were willing to reach out for something better.
 That Republicans themselves, within their own ranks, should be so stirred by the opportunity they think Eisenhower represents is an affirmative answer to the worst peril the Eisenhower candidacy faces. That has been in the possibility that organization Republicans themselves would not have the opportunity to give the people of the nation a chance to vote for him for President. It is rash to make such a long range prediction, but the picture has indeed seemed to be one in which Eisenhower would face much more difficulty in gaining the nomination from Republicans than he would in gaining election from the nation as a whole.
 This is because he has not bothered to speak the language of professional politicians, because he has not blanketed the country with inferred promises of political reward if certain leaders do support him.
 But, even more importantly, it is because there is a standing faction within the Republican party which is instinctively for Taft, a hard core of reactionary isolationism which admires Taft as its own natural champion, and which admires him so fervently that it would sooner go down to defeat with him than go ahead to victory with anyone else.
 There is no section of the Republican party anywhere in the country which does not have this kind of faction, and very often this faction is in control of the organizational picture.
 These Republican groups, who are comfortable with Taft and uncomfortable with anyone else, are certain to give battle everywhere. For this is once again, the time to determine just what kind of party the Republican party shall be, a party rooted in the past, or a party capable of dealing with the future.
 The one party will be worthy of victory in November—a victory which Eisenhower, one would think, could most certainly win. The other party would invite the expectation that 1952 would be another hopeless cause.
 Eisenhower, and the kind of party for which he stands, have the advantage. He has to win the crucial battle, which is within the party itself. And if Republicans themselves are willing to move out of their rut, the nation as a whole will not fail to respond to its opportunity to do the same thing.

attempt of the major power company in Virginia to grab the two best power projects in the approved federal Reano river program.

In his attack on "the power industry campaign," Truman said an extensive advertising campaign by the power industry is largely paid for by taxpayers because the power companies can deduct the costs of the advertisements for income tax purposes.

"Until recently," the President said, "the power industry's propaganda campaign was largely aimed at the public authority idea. . . . The industry undertook to show that government ventures in the power field were inefficient and wasteful."

"Then suddenly," this propaganda changed. It is easy to see why it changed. It wasn't convincing anybody because it wasn't true.

"The people were convinced, by concrete results, of the value of the federal power program, and their representatives in Congress who had learned of the college people felt repeatedly voted down every attack on that program."

"The private power interests shifted to a new line of propaganda. They raised the voice of 'realism.' Apparently on the theory that if you can't persuade people, maybe you can frighten them."

"You can hardly pick up a newspaper or a magazine these days without seeing an expensive full-page advertisement denouncing 'socialism' or our public power program. . . . It looks to me as though that advertising campaign itself is pretty close to 'socialism,' because it is costing the power companies so much of the cost."

"It is cynical because it assumes the people of this country are so stupid that they will be misled by a few facts which are not their own. It is cynical because it undermines the faith in the free enterprise system itself."

"If the people are misled to the point that they free enterprise system means they have to pay tribute to private enterprise in order to enjoy the great natural resources that are abundant in our country, then they are going to begin to think about the free enterprise system itself."
