Plans Appeal In Smith Case

Doomed Man's Lawyer Will Seek Execution Stay in New Request

Bridgeport, March 18.—The first degree murder case of Francis C. Smith, 38, of Danbury, sentenced to die in the electric chair the week of April 21, will be appealed to the state Supreme Court of Errors for the second time, his counsel, former Governor James C. Shannon, said last night.

Shannon said he will appeal the decision of Superior Court Judge James E. Murphy who Monday denied Smith's petition for a new trial.

The state's highest court turned down an appeal last summer after the Superior Court here convicted Smith in the fatal shooting of Grover S. Hart, a night watchman, during a burglary at the Indian Harbor Yacht Club in Greenwich July 23, 1949.

Changed Testimony

Smith petitioned the Superior Court here for a new trial on the basis of alleged change in testimony of Edith Springer, now serving time in an Alabama prison, who testified against Smith in his trial.

Miss Springer claimed in a deposition taken in Alabama that she testified falsely in Smith's murder trial because she was mad at George London, an alleged accomplice of Smith.

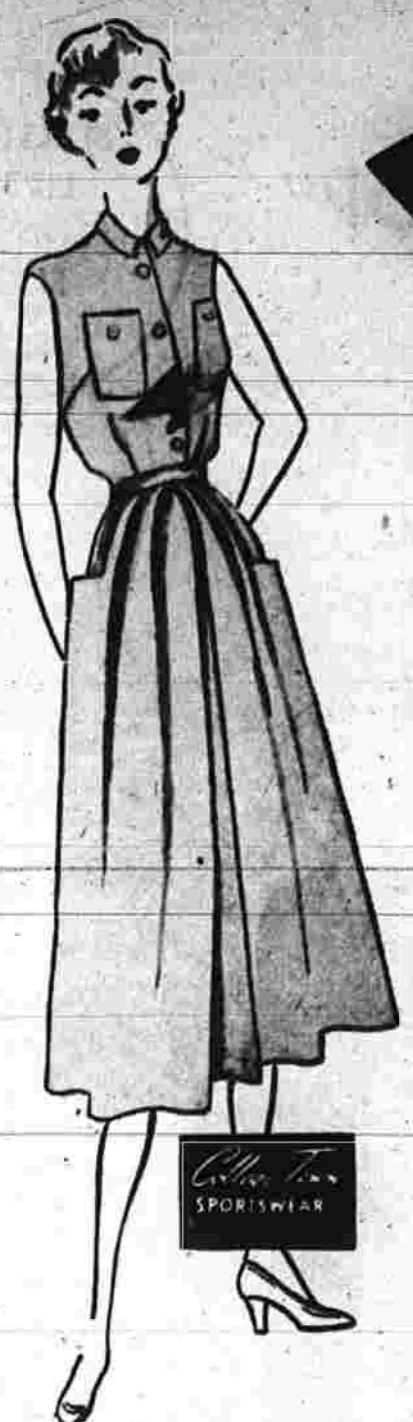
London since has been sentenced to life imprisonment for second degree murder.

In his decision Monday, Judge Murphy said, "It is impossible to rationalize her claim that she was getting back at London when she testified against Smith several months after London's trial had ended. There are other features of the deposition which made it impossible to believe the truth of her attempted recantation."

Smith, convicted June 7, 1950, was originally scheduled for execution Oct. 29, but he was granted a stay when Miss Springer brought her alleged false testimony to light. The new appeal will call for a new stay from the April 21 date.

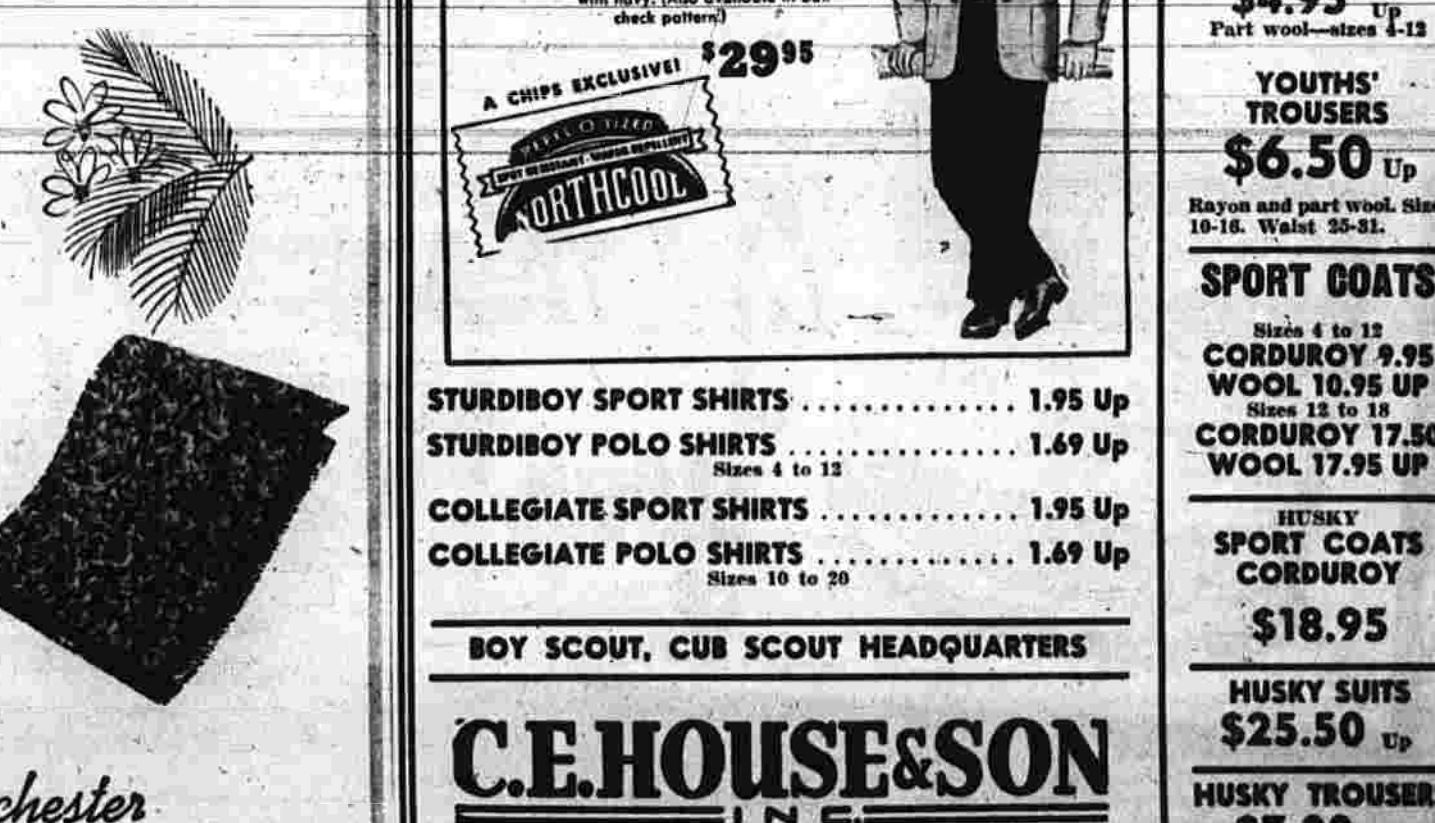

AVC Speaker Hits Compulsory Insurance Views

Keynotes in our traditional free enterprise system are the doctors and their right to practice medicine privately," stated Dr. Charles Jacobson in a timely talk concerning compulsory national health insurance before a discussion intended audience at the meeting of the AVC held Monday at the Community Y.

Dr. Jacobson further carefully attempted to answer point by point the claims that the standard of the nation's health and medical care would be raised by adopting compulsory national health insurance. He emphasized that privately administered insurance plans alone to expand their coverage and increase their benefits would financial conditions. Recognizing that there is much to be done, said Dr. Jacobson, "It is a program of evolution not revolution."

AVC's national position favoring compulsory health insurance but locally the membership is divided. Therefore, in discussion as much was said in opposition as in favor of the speakers' statements.

Oil Burner Code Hearing Date Set

A public hearing will be held April 1 to consider changes in the oil burner code. The hearing was voted by the Board of Directors at its meeting last night, after the proposed changes were presented to the board.

In other actions the board voted to table indefinitely the question of a house of comfort, and heard reports from acting General Manager James A. Shepley.

Shepley reported that Arthur H. King, superintendent of schools, is filling out applications for federal aid for school building costs. He also submitted a letter from the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad to the effect that the Hilliard street underpass and the crossing at Woodland street and Middle Temple street are under consideration.

An opinion from Town Counsel John D. LaBelle advised the board that highways within the municipal limits are under the supervision of the town, and that subdivision regulations should be adhered to.

The directors received a letter from the Board of Education informing them that double sessions would be in effect at Manchester High School next September and the board is taking action on the appointment of an architect for the proposed new high school.

Precautions May Avert Serious Home Accidents

By GAIL DUGAS

New York—(NEA)—The place for the home handyman is, naturally, in the home. And the time for him to make a safety check-up on your home is now, before the winter that's known as spring cleaning gets under way.

The purpose of such a check-up is, first to make your home as accident-free as possible, and second, to get your husband out of his easy chair. Any woman knows how irritating it is to see a man settle down to enjoy himself. Break it up. Get him on his feet.

Tell him that home maintenance is his job and if he doesn't want everyone in the family to break his or her neck singly and collectively, he'd better do something about the stairs.

Stairs provide the most logical spot for many falls. Seriously enough, they cause about 25,000 unnecessary deaths each year, according to the National Safety Council. They also account for numerous broken bones and other injuries.

Loose Carpets. Here, then, is a good spot for your Mr. Fix-It to start. Stair carpeting that's loose or curled-up is dangerous. Ask him to tack it down securely, so that it can't possibly slip. Stairs should be well-lighted. There should be a light switch handy to each door.

This will keep your husband busy until it's time to start spring cleaning and then you can make him really uncomfortable. Any way, just tell him when it's all over, he'll have a safe, clean home in which he can relax.

These are just some of the things for which you should watch floors slippery from wax, telephone cord trailing on the floor where it may trip someone, defective and overloaded electrical sockets and frayed wires, loose window screens, scatter rugs that aren't anchored, poisons left about where children or pets can get at them, bathbats and shower stalls, handbills and non-skid mats.

Disorder causes one out of every six home accidents. This means that when working and walking areas are cluttered, the odds are in favor of an accident about you. It's easy to step on, or to strike against, objects that cause falls, burns, cuts or scratches.

Faulty Equipment. Equipment that's not in good repair hospitalizes five per cent of the injured each year. Electrical appliances, cords, kitchen utensils, laundry equipment and garden tools should be checked at regular intervals.

Poorly planned housing features take their toll, too. This means insecure porch railings, for example. Better put your handyman to work here, since nine per cent of all accidents arise from such built-in hazards.

Lack of proper light produces four per cent of the injuries. Be sure you have adequate lighting for stairways, halls, and all work areas. There should be a light switch handy to each door.

Job Training Aids Disabled

J. O. B. Teaches People To Use Assets, Fits Them Into Positions

By SHIRLEY BOWEN

New York—(AP)—If accident or disease suddenly left you crippled, how would you feel? What would happen to your job? What would you work for wages, run a business or care for a home, that is no idle nightmare.

There are about 25 million people in the United States with serious permanent handicaps. And a high percentage of them are sure they can't work effectively.

"They just don't know," says Henry Viscardi. "They don't know what they can do."

Viscardi runs an agency in Bellevue Hospital, New York City, to get the disabled and job opportunities called "J.O.B." for "Just One Break."

The idea began with Dr. Howard A. Rusk's work in the Air Force in World War II.

"Let's forget what these men lost," Rusk said. "Let's find out what they have." He got hundreds of men out of bed and on their feet—sometimes artificial feet. He knew they could work effectively. But when they tried to get jobs they were told they were useless. They times, so believe it or not, they were told they were useless.

With the end of the war, Rusk found the war-disabled were only a fraction of the number of civilian-disabled.

He worked with Bellevue Hospital, New York University and The New York Times to do something about it. He could and did train people to use muscles and senses they had and to use them well. But jobs were still the bottleneck. So he began to talk to businessmen. And he got Viscardi to open J. O. B.

Teach Pay Customers. A highly-paid personnel man, took a pay cut to do the job. Crippled himself, he knew the problem first hand. Withered legs at birth made him 3 feet, 8 inches

After several residents of the Boston street area complained pointedly about the backing up of sewage on the street and in their cellars and about their repeated attempts to get town officials to remedy the situation, the Board of Water Commissioners at its meeting last night instructed the superintendent of the water department to survey the situation and to recommend steps necessary to correct the problem.
