Britain's Manchester Guardian
 has printed some graphic descriptions of the use of the atomic bomb in Korea. It says that the bomb should be used, but for the atomic bomb, it has indulged in an editorial discussion which, for our British readers, is unusual for its failure to decide what it really means.
 "One thing," says a characteristic passage in the editorial, "seems clear. Again, because a single bomb can turn a whole village within seconds, it is wider in its effect than explosives. All the more care, therefore, must be taken in deciding when to use it. And in a particular case there is no doubt, surely it should not be used."
 As for us, we are afraid we react to such inspired violence with some of the same scorn exhibited by some of the Guardian's own readers, who, without even mentioning the atomic bomb, suggest that the Guardian might just as well get horrified over the use of trenchcoats, which also burn people to death, or phosphorus grenades, which are also horrible weapons.
 There is some slight ground for the Guardian's sense of delicacy for the nappin bomb, as it has been made a major weapon in Korea, has been responsible for countless civilian casualties, often without valid military justification.
 But the point is that all this business of being squeamish about a particular weapon, which helps to stir our imaginations about something particularly horrible, is completely unrealistic. The horror of modern war is slaughter, and that slaughter automatically includes the slaughter of civilians. Modern war is operated on the theory that the more civilians are killed the more swiftly and completely the enemy will be defeated. That is the practice of nations. And that being so, what difference does it make whether civilians are killed with atomic bombs or with conventional bombs, or even with an atom weapon, slow starvation plus disease?
 Instead of worrying our consciences about nappin, or conventional bombs, perhaps we ought to congratulate ourselves that we have not used atomic bombs to kill civilians, because they show our mastery of our own code of war in our own times.
 The Guardian's point of view, true, is not entirely consistent. It was a little bit worried last somebody, some day, might use nappin against English villages. But, again, why not? Surely the civilized nations of the world have no right to expect that the uncivilized nations will wage a brand of war more humane than they do?
 Surely all of us, in the spirit of modern war, must be prepared to reap what we sow, take what we give?
 The Guardian's controversy is pointless. This is what modern war is, and, so long as war remains an accepted institution, even the most civilized nations will specialize in making it still worse. If we want to engage our consciences, or conduct a controversy, why not pose the question, whether war itself is not the basic crime, the unforgivable sin? This is the problem mankind must deal with if it wishes to survive.

The Monitor On Korea
 Editorial minds sometimes run in similar channels, and somebody at the Christian Science Monitor was writing about what we called the "Tait" school of analysis of the situation in Korea at the same time we were. We like his job better than our own.
 The Monitor editorial was titled "The Victory Behind the Stalemate," and reasoned as follows:
 "Day after day the state of ceaseless stalemate continues in Korea. The war that is not a war waits uneasily on the truth that looks like a different kind of war. The news veers between hope and pessimism. Public opinion veers between apathy and indignation. Perhaps never has a more important action been less adequately explained. In general, however, people tend to say, 'Something drastic must be done.' But what? Especially must the question be asked: 'What would critics who criticize both the war and the truce-making, for criticism which does not suggest alternatives as worse than useless.'
 "Would these critics be willing to say that the United Nations never should have undertaken to stop the initial aggression in Korea? Then they must consider the shattering blow that aggression would have dealt to our own stability of the Far East and the morale of the free world.
 "Would they and that the United States never should have agreed to negotiate for a truce? Then they must consider the heavy American casualties that would have been the cost of a continued and uncertain push toward the Yalu River.
 "Would they drop negotiations now and have the UN forces withdraw from Korea? This would be to reward aggression after already having paid a tragic price to repel it.
 "Would they force the issue by threatening to carry the war into China?
 "Here is the alternative most attractive to many Americans, who believe that by bombing, blockade, and possibly American-mounted Nationalist forces on the Chinese mainland Peking could be quickly brought to its knees. This proposal, however, has examined these proposals in some detail and has set forth the reasons why the best military opinion considers such a hope dangerous, unrealistic. Unless Americans are prepared to be drawn by this sort of action into a far greater war, demanding far greater casualties than in Korea, they had better re-examine carefully all such proposals for a 'cheap' victory.
 "This suppose the truce-making is all a bluff used by the Reds to build up their power in North Korea? Then Americans must be reminded that during nine months of negotiations UN power has also been built up in South Korea, while the Chinese have been effectively prevented by the military stalemate from using their power elsewhere in Asia.
 "Is it the very fact of stalemate which is so peculiarly galling to a United States unused to thinking except in terms of total victory? Then perhaps the greatest lesson to be learned from the present situation is that American cannot expect to have it all their way in Asia any more than the Chinese can be allowed to have it all their way.
 "Yet behind this is a greater fact—and a greater victory. Aggression has been successfully resisted by a force which 'comes closer than ever before in history to being an international police force operating under world law. The cooperation is far from complete; the results are far from perfect; the 'war' is far from estab-

 says that because of limited resources these payments should be confined to assets held in surplus—excess labor and unused plant capacities.
 Under the security treaty, the United States is giving the right to keep military forces in and around Japan. An administrative agreement already has been signed covering the facilities to be used by these forces.
 Japan also agrees not to grant military bases to other nations without U. S. consent.
 Although no reservation was made in the Senate ratification of the agreement, the Foreign Relations Committee did attach one stipulation which will have to be sent to other signatory powers for approval.
 This states that the Senate ratification does not mean approval of provisions of the February, 1945, Yalta agreement giving the Kurile Islands and South Sakhalin Islands to Russia.
 The Soviet Union took over these islands from Japan soon after the war and still holds them.
 Sen. Watkins (R. Utah) protested that the Senate was acting too hastily in voting on the treaty. He said he might ask reconsideration of the vote later.
 Opposition Heated
 Supporters of the treaty contended it would help to prevent Japan from drifting toward the Communist orbit in Asia.
 An anti-group of Republicans led by Sen. Jenner (R. Ind.) offered several reservations to the treaty and security pact and all were beaten.
 The Senate vote was a big victory for a former Republican Senator, Ambassador John Foster Dulles who handled the negotiations in the drafting of the pact. Dulles watched most of the six hours of debates yesterday from the Senate gallery.
 Shortly after Senate approval of the treaty, Dulles telegraphed his appreciation to Gen. Douglas MacArthur for the "inspiration and suggestions" which he said thrust him in sweating up the pact.
