### Text of LaBelle's Opinion On Use of Town's Monies

Following are excerpts from the opinion submitted to the Board of Water Commissioners last night by Town Counsel John D. LaBelle. Reference is made to the Charter of the Town of Manchester, Chapter 121, Section 2, which provides that the general manager prepare the budget, "all items of expenditure approved by the board of directors." (Emphasis supplied.) The budget, as finally adopted by the board of directors, appropriates the amount stated in the budget, "to the several objects and purposes therein named." Charter, supra, Chapter V, Section 7.

With the exception of the board of education, appropriations of public funds for a given object or a definite purpose can not be diverted to any other purpose. Charter, supra, Chapter V, Section 7. An appropriation of public moneys for one object can be used solely for that object. Del. Laripa's Appeal 88 Conn. 383, 388.

The approval of the board of directors, pertaining only to the board of education and its expenses is specifically authorized by the General Statutes. Accordingly, appropriations for a particular item can not be transferred or diverted to another purpose or different item without the express authorization by the board of directors. Charter, supra, Chapter V, Section 16.

### Order Norris Stop Paying Water Bills Out of Fund

The use of general fund money to pay water bills out of the fund was stopped by the Water and Sewer Department last night when the Board of Directors, sitting as the Water Commission, voted to instruct Town Treasurer C. LaSoy Norris to stop paying that department's bills out of the general fund until further notice.

The opinion held that while the Board of Directors can make an additional appropriation to any office or agency, this does not apply to the Water and Sewer Department, which occupies a unique position among town departments in that it is supposed to be self-sustaining.

The opinion also stated that the general fund, which \$103,000 due to the town apportioned the now more general issue regarding procedure should be subject to budget control.

**Gives Picture Of Drug Use**

Rivard Asserts That No Cases of Addiction in State's High Schools

There are no cases of drug addiction among any high school students in Connecticut, Glenn C. Rivard, state narcotics agent in the Bureau of Preventable Diseases, told St. Margaret's Circle Daughters of Isabella, in a lecture at the Knights of Columbus Home last night.

Maribanna "reefers" are now selling for \$1.50 each in Hartford and "drug peddlers" don't have to look for customers. He discounted reports of hiding drugs in candy bars in order to create new addicts or prospective drug buyers. All "pushers" needs is one contact in a territory and the addicts will seek him out to get the drug.

Although maribanna is habit forming, Rivard pointed out, it has no tolerance factor—which means the system does not require in-

creasing amounts of it for effect, and the body does not become dependent upon it.

The danger in maribanna, he said, is that certain types of personalities who use it may go on to more dangerous drugs.

There has been a slight decrease in the use of narcotics in Connecticut in the last 10 years, Rivard pointed out, but there has been an increase in addition of younger persons.

Rivard classified harpoid users into four groups, the most dangerous of which consisted of psychopaths who become addicted through association with other addicts.

Three quarters of the Hartford addicts fall into this group, Rivard said. Among them, narcotics is secondary to vice and social activity, he added. About one half of one per cent of them can be cured.

Another group is composed of moral personalities who become addicted through careless handling of drugs. Cure rate among them is high.

Another group consists of neurotic persons, particularly hypochondriacs, who take drugs "simply because they have to take something," according to Rivard.

The fourth classification he described as "border line mental."

## New Film to Upset Pilgrim Legends

By BOB THOMAS  
Hollywood, March 26—A lot of our schoolbook notions about the Pilgrim Fathers are going to be punctured by a new film from Hollywood.

The picture is called "The Plymouth Adventure" and it's being personally produced by Dore Schary, headman at MGM. Among the facts he relates about the Pilgrims:

1. The John Alden-Priscilla Mulliken romance—legendary—was strictly a figment of Longfellow's imagination. Bradford was a married man, and much older than Priscilla.
2. The Pilgrims didn't land on Plymouth Rock.
3. The Mayflower wasn't blown off its course, which was supposed to be to Virginia. A land speculator bribed the captain to deliver the settlers to New England. (This is supposed to be the first real estate swindle in American history.)
4. The Pilgrims weren't stiff-necked stolid people. They were warm human beings capable of having fun.
5. They didn't dress primly, with square, buttoned-up, haircuts. Their outfits could be colorful, and their hair styles were similar to those of today, including the crew-cut.
6. The Indians were not exactly friendly toward the settlers, but did them no real harm, either.
7. Only half of the Pilgrims were religious dissenters. The others were tradespeople and craftsmen.
8. Will Stress Voyage: The picture will take the Pilgrims into their first spring in the new land, but the emphasis will be on the voyage across the Atlantic.

"I don't think most people realize what a great achievement it was," said Schary. "Here were 102 passengers on a ship that was three months on a ship that had 102 feet long with a 22-foot beam. The weather was miserable, the seas rough; the supplies of food and water became perilously low. The privation and the embarrassment of having to live so close must have been terrific."

I asked Schary how he became interested in the Pilgrim saga. "It has intrigued me for a long time," he replied. "Twenty-one years ago, Don Hartman, now the Paramount production boss, and I were working on a musical show to be based on the Pilgrims. We were all set to go into production, but the project fell through."

"In recent years, there has been a lot of new material turned up about the Pilgrims. Books like 'Saints and Sinners' and 'The Plymouth Adventure' have thrown a new light on the founding fathers. The information has upset the impression school children get from books and old paintings that the Pilgrims were stiff, uninteresting people."

Annie Sugawho, the producer, admitted that he was assailing a Hollywood bugaboo in tackling the Pilgrim subject. Producers have long shunned films on early American history. "There are laws among producers which are supposed to be as permanent as the engraved on stone," he said. "One said that you couldn't make pictures about married people. But then came

"When you write on backache," writes L.F.B., "I wish to suggest that you emphasize the insidious nature of the disorder. In my case the discomfort developed slowly over a number of years."

The victim in such a case develops a tremendous tolerance of the discomfort, but not without cost. It affects the entire nervous system and personality, and is a constant drain on the physical and mental reserves, restricting social activities, etc.

"In my case it was a major factor in causing the loss of a very good position. I wound up with no employment, and after surgery and convalescence there followed a period of unemployment during which I lost my home and furniture. All this at a time when I was least able to cope with the situation."

This letter illustrates what a terrible problem backache can be, and even when it does not develop along such disastrous lines, this common affliction is responsible for much mental as well as physical distress.

The problem of backache is first to make a diagnosis since there are many possible causes and second, to outline the treatment which is most likely to bring relief. These problems are not easy.

Sprains, dislocations, fractures, bruises, or a rupture in the disc or cartilage which separates the bones of the spine may produce a backache. Bad posture can ac-

Human or animal bodies might supply successful transplants of thymus or thymic glands to other parts that would take root and stay alive or grow.

Dr. Eugene E. Clifton, a surgeon, transplanted the bits of thymus gland into the chest of a child who had a severe case of leukemia.
