There was certainly no other candidate in the Democratic party who could be considered competition.

Stalin made his statement on Germany in response to questions sent by a group of U. S. newsmen and radio men on March 24. Four days later, Adenauer, German Chancellor, announced that the U. S., British and French foreign ministers would meet with him in May to sign a peace contract—a way of life with western Germany. The signing of such a peace contract would formalize the East-West pact in Germany, and perhaps pave a settlement, block to block, for a vast market in the East. To increase this line, the USSR must try to convince western businessmen that it is not inevitable nor even likely—and that capitalism and communism can exist peacefully side by side.

Stalin also said he considers a third world war no nearer than his frequent pronouncements to westerners just at this time. It was published less than 24 hours before Gen. Dwight Eisenhower's first annual report on what the North Atlantic Treaty organization (NATO) has accomplished during his first year as its military commander and what the federal believes it still needs to do. The Kremlin may have hoped to take some of the headlines space away from the NATO record.

In short, there is no reason to assume that Stalin's statement is a real move toward peace.

As seemed likely, Senator Taff has gained some delegates in the Wisconsin primary, but has suffered a defeat in the vote.

The results give him 34 of the 54 delegates.

This unusual combination of results arises from the fact that the race in Wisconsin was a three-cornered affair, with Warren and Blanton dividing the opposition to the Ohio senator.

The voters of Wisconsin, particularly, had their clear formal chance to choose him, and the things he stands for ahead of all others.
