Blame Pilot For Crash At Queens

(Continued from Page One) As it reared away from Idlewild airport after missing in an attempt to land in a morning rain and misty evening.

Wattley said the pilot, Capt. William H. Crockett, 37, of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., was "apparently staying under the overcast to come around for a landing when he crashed."

The pilot had been instructed to climb before making a second landing approach, investigators said.

Six of the scores of persons injured in the crash remained in hospitals today.

The crash was the fifth such accident in the metropolitan area in less than four months.

Three airplanes, Elizabeth, N. J., took a total of 440 lives—41 on the ground—since Dec. 16.

The plane which crashed Saturday was owned by U. S. Airlines, a cargo carrier.

The National Air Transport Commission committee met yesterday and said it had rejected "preliminary reports" from groups investigating the crash.

The committee, headed by Capt. Eddie Rickenbacker, president of Eastern Air Lines, offered its report to the CAB. The committee is composed of representatives of major airlines.

In addition to Pilot Crockett, those who died in the crash were the co-pilot, John Woderhor, 29, and a 10-year-old child.

Moyles and Coyne were killed in houses wrecked and set afire, and Boylan in the wreckage of a police car.

Gordon Dean, chairman of the Atomic Energy commission, said in an interview last week that the commission is "still pushing very hard" on its hydrogen bomb program.

But he said amendments are no substitute for disarmament. "Because eventually armaments and armaments races lead to consequences which we have got to do something about," he said.

Witnesses scheduled to appear at the open hearing, expected to last about 40 days, are Secretary of State Acheson, Gen. Omar Bradley, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and Gen. Curtis LeMay, chief of the Strategic Air Command.
