Pick Architect

Industry Sues Over Seizure

(Continued from Page One) Philip Murray, union president, announced last night the CIO steelworkers would work for the government. Secretary of Commerce, Charles Sawyer was served with summons in three suits brought by the Bethlehem Steel Co., Republic Steel Corp. and the Youngstown Sheet and Tube Co., challenging the seizure order. "It may even be that the Congress will feel that we should permit a shutdown of the steel industry, although that would immediately endanger the safety of our fighting forces abroad and weaken the whole structure of our national security. It is not believed that the Congress will favor any of these courses of action, but that in a matter for the Congress to determine." Will Continue Production In this situation, the immediate outlook for continued production of the steel vital to defense industries and thousands of consumer products was confused and uncertain. It was plain, however, that steel executives had their backs up. They were smarting under the tongue-lashing the President gave them in a radio broadcast last night and were disposed to fight for what they consider their rights.

It told employees to contact their foremen for schedules. Mottel told Sawyer that J. & L. is scheduling "an orderly resumption of work" although it believed there is "no basis in the Constitution or laws of the United States for the action taken by the President and you," he added. "Such operation will be under the terms and conditions of employment and with the sales prices which this corporation had in effect on April 8, 1952."

Steel Setup Cuts Action On Controls

Washington, April 9 (AP)—The Senate Banking committee today recessed its consideration of a bill to extend wage, price and other economic controls. Chairman Keybank (D., S.C.) said the committee would be "a dreadful mistake" to consider it against the background of the steel dispute.

Keybank said after a 20-minute closed door meeting, that the committee would meet again a week from tomorrow to consider whether to hold hearings. He declined to speculate on what form the hearings would take.

The controls law, on which the government's anti-inflation effort is based, expires on June 30, and the committee is expected to make an attempt to extend the law.

"I hope the country will not be fooled," he said. "This is no time to try to give the people's already weakened protection against profiteering and sky-high prices."

Chairman Keybank (D., S.C.) urged the committee to avoid "passion of the hysteria of the moment" in its deliberations.

Senators Bricker (R-Ohio) and Caperton (R-Ind.), members of the group, led a revolt they believe the weeks ahead will give the wage and price control legislation "their greatest test" and bring strong moves in Congress to ditch them.

Caperton said he believes the committee, or a companion House Senate group—the Joint Committee on Defense Production—should all witness to explore handling of the steel dispute before making any recommendations on changing or terminating wage-price control powers.

Expires June 30

The act will expire June 30, and the entire control program is lapsing unless Congress extends it or writes some extension law.

The controls were voted by Congress to curb inflation in the defense effort. Maybank in a speech yesterday counseled against any extension of the law, saying it would let loose a runaway inflation, such as a runaway experienced during World War.

Sen. Bricker (R-Ohio), a committee member, told a group of reporters yesterday that the committee will receive deflationist reports from the measure all authority for wage and price controls.

Bricker said he would vote for such a proposal, adding "several of us feel that way."

Before the group is a demand by Sen. Dirksen (R., Ill.) that Congress force a revision of the Wage Stabilization Board (WSB) membership as a result of its handling of the steel wage dispute.

Responces WSB

Bricker said this might open up expected attacks on wage and price controls. The Chairman yesterday denounced "wage board meddling" in a Senate speech, and he will propose a revision of Dirksen's amendment if he is going to keep wage controls.

The board now is set up by law with 18 members, six each representing labor, management and the public. Dirksen has demanded that the public spokesmen be placed in absolute majority, and that the board be forbidden specifically to make any recommendations except on take-home wages.

In the steel case, the board recommended the union should which would require all employees to join a union, in addition to a 37 1/2-cent-an-hour wage increase and other proposals.

Bricker said he will suggest that if there is a wage board, all its members represent the public only, and that all of them be subject to Senate confirmation. He said he will support Dirksen's proposal to check the board's field of action if it is contained.

No Defense for Public

Bricker said the present system "puts the public members in the middle, and leaves the public with no defense."

He said he is ready to junk wage and price controls "because they have been subjected to political manipulations—they have not been used for the public interest."

Maybank told a reporter he believes the board exceeded its jurisdiction but that the steel workers are entitled to a raise—they have been patient. His quarrel with the board, Maybank said, is that it went "too far."

See No Pattern

A Senate labor-management subcommittee headed by Sen. Humphrey (D-Minn.) released a sharp analysis of testimony by Nathan P. Feininger, Wage Board chairman, defending the board's handling of the steel dispute.

Humphrey, who acknowledged he was trying to build "a backbone" against the board's critics, did not, however, release a transcript of Feininger's close 6-10-0 or testimony.

The staff analysis reiterated that Humphrey had said previously—that the proposed wage increase for steel workers "is not a pattern for other industries and follow and will not initiate a new round of wage booms."

The staff said the proposals would help steel workers to "catch up" with increases in other industries and that the board's recommendation does not violate the War Relocation Act and is not inconsistent with any other federal or state legislation.

New Outlook on World Seen as Best Progress

Dr. Neumann outlines 3 necessary steps in Education of People For World Citizenship.

"The greatest progress we have made in educating for world citizenship is the progress we have made within ourselves by learning to look at the world differently than we did before and by being prepared for the world which is constantly occurring."

Dr. Neumann, professor of government and social sciences at Wesleyan University, the final in the series of TWCA public Affairs committee lectures yesterday afternoon at the Community Center.

Dr. Neumann's lecture was the first in a series of three on the theme "United States and Our World Responsibility." Dr. Neumann's topic was "Educating for World Citizenship."

In educating for world citizenship, there are three steps, first, know the facts, secondly, realize that each individual should not be content with just knowing the facts but should realize that he is the decisive person, and should make his own mind up as to what he believes; and thirdly, learn to articulate what he believes.

Wilson Approach

At the beginning of his talk, the professor—Woodrow Wilson stressed that people are now living in a very complex and difficult world and that it is not easy to find a quick simple answer to the questions of the day. The approach of Woodrow Wilson to the problem was the approach of an idealist. Wilson's period from 1918 to 1920, the type of approach was attempted through the League of Nations.

The Doctor Says

Preventive to Head Lice. Written for NEA Service by EDWIN F. JORDAN, M. D. Mrs. M. E. and several others have asked how to get rid of the head lice on their children. This pest has a more or less universal distribution, although people who live in less crowded parts of the world and those who are accustomed to the liberal use of soap and water are less likely to have trouble than the rest of humanity.

experience, there are several highly satisfactory methods of eliminating lice from the human body. The newer methods include the use of DDT powder, a substance known as benzyl benzoate, and formalin, which can be sprayed over the entire surface in a few seconds, providing a suitable place for use in a washbasin. In order to make any of these treatments successful, however, it is important to follow directions closely and in the case of head lice to guard against injuries to the eyes. Lice lay eggs, or nits, on the body. These hatch in about seven days. The nits are not destroyed by most treatments, so that they must be destroyed in some other way—usually a second treatment after the nits have hatched. The female louse lays from 50 to 150 eggs a day and the average individual louse will live from 30 to 40 days. In addition to discomfort and general annoyance, the lice do not always work, and their application is carried by lice and the more people have them, the more risk there is of spreading these diseases. Some people seem to have a special attraction for lice. It is known that lice will leave the bodies of those who are less attractive to them for those who seem, for some unknown reason, to be more attractive. There are several kinds of lice. Most of them prefer the human scalp except the crab louse, which likes the groin region. The principal method of control are prevention and treatment of the unfortunate person who has acquired vermin. Personal cleanliness is the most important part of prevention. There is no doubt that bathing in warm water and the use of soap at least once a week, together with frequent changes into clean clothing means the chance of acquiring lice.

Senator Russell at Best As Director of Strategy

By WADE JONES

Washington, (AP)—The successful career of Senator Russell, Georgia's new candidate for the Presidential nomination, is a triumph of parliamentary procedure.

While still a political youngster in the Georgia legislature, Russell made it his habit to be one of the loudest speakers of the House.

When he was elected to the U. S. Senate back in 1938, he again set as his first task the mastering of the long and complicated rules. That has paid off.

The only two times that Vice President Alben Barkley has been overruled while presiding over the Senate have been on appeals and motions by Russell.

Sen. Paul Douglas, of Illinois, dominating the floor with Russell while the latter was leading the southern bloc's fight against Civil Rights legislation, said at one point:

"I yield to one of the ablest field generals who ever appeared on the floor of the Senate."

Behind the scenes Russell is and has been a behind-the-scenes operator in the Senate, marshaling and leading others make the big speeches and take the credit.

The building, blue-eyed, 64-year-old Democrat shows the social life of the Washington cocktail circuit, although as a bachelor and a top figure in Congress, he has been continually angling for him.

He is probably best known outside of Washington for his leadership of the southern bloc's fight against Civil Rights. And here, again, his tactics are to halt such legislation by pulling out all the parliamentary tricks in the bag to keep the measure from coming to a vote.

It is not generally remembered that at the Democratic convention before the 1948 elections, Russell received a nominating vote in Truman's party. (The other half vote went to Paul McNutt, of Indiana.)

Russell hadn't sought the nomination. He wasn't even in Philadelphia. Further, he did not join the Democrats after the convention was over. In fact, he helped Truman carry Georgia.

Russell thinks of himself as an independent Democrat, and his being re-elected has been generally speaking, he voted with the New Dealers. He co-sponsored the Tennessee Valley and Rural Electrification legislation.

But he was against the St. Lawrence waterway plan, and in the latter connection they tell a story about Russell and President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The phone rang one night in Russell's hotel room only a short time after he had come to the Senate, and a voice said, "Hello, Dick. This is Frank Roosevelt."

"Thinking it was some drunk, Russell hung up. In a moment the phone rang back. A Western White House secretary wanted to know why Russell had hung up on the President.

Roosevelt wanted to persuade Russell to let him talk about the St. Lawrence waterway, and he talked 20 minutes trying to do so. But he didn't get a word out.

"Suggested, Russell, Secretary He has supported Social Security—program and played a large part in keeping the Farm Security Administration alive. But, as with Civil Rights, he has balked at a large part of the Roosevelt-Truman foreign policy.

Senator Russell at Best As Director of Strategy

By WADY JONES

Washington (AP)—The successful career of Sen. Richard Russell, Georgia, now candidate for the presidential nomination in a number of party primary elections, is a study in political strategy.

While still a political youngster in the Georgia legislature, Russell made it his business to master the rules of that body. It helped make him speaker of the house when he was elected to the U. S. Senate back in 1932, he again set as his first task the mastering of its long and complicated rules. — This has not left too.

The only two times that Vice President Alben Barkley has been overruled while presiding over the Senate has been on appeals and motions by Russell.

Sen. Paul Douglas of Illinois, debating on the floor with Russell while the latter was leading the southern bloc fight against Civil Rights legislation, said at one point:

"I yield to one of the subtlest and one of the most able tacticians who ever appeared on the floor of the Senate."

Behind the scenes

Essentially Russell is and has been a behind-the-scenes operator in the Senate, master-minding the political strategy and letting others make the big speeches and take the credit.

The leading blue-eyed, sea-green Democrat in the Senate, Russell is probably best known outside of Washington for his leadership of the southern bloc's fight against Civil Rights Acts here, again, his tactics are to halt such legislation by pulling out all the parliamentary tricks in the bag to keep the measure from coming to a vote.

It's not generally remembered, but at the Democratic Convention before the 1948 elections, Russell received 283 nominating votes to Truman's 947. (The other half vote went to Paul McNutt, of Indiana.)

Russell hadn't sought the nomination. He was chosen in Philadelphia. Further, he did not join the Democratic after the convention was over. In fact, he helped Truman carry Georgia.

Russell thinks of himself as an independent Democrat, and his voting record backs him up. Generally speaking, he voted with the New Dealers. He co-sponsored the Tennessee Valley and Rural Electrification legislation.

But he was against the St. Lawrence waterway plan, and in the latter connection they tell a story about Russell and President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The plane rang one night in Russell's hotel room only a short time after he had come to the Senate, and a voice said, "Hello, Dick. This is Frank Roosevelt."

Thinking it was some drunk, Russell hung up. In a moment the plane rang back. A frustrated White House secretary wanted to know why Russell had hung up on the President.

Roosevelt wanted to persuade Russell to his way of thinking on the St. Lawrence waterway, and he talked 20 minutes trying to do so. But he didn't. Russell stuck fast.

Supported Social Security

He has supported Social Security programs and played a large part in keeping the Farm Security Administration alive. But, as with Civil Rights, he has backed at a large part of the Roosevelt-Truman foreign policy.

He was for the Marshall Plan.

Takes Long Trek Through Klondike

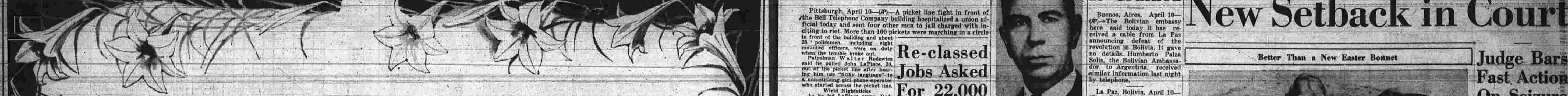
