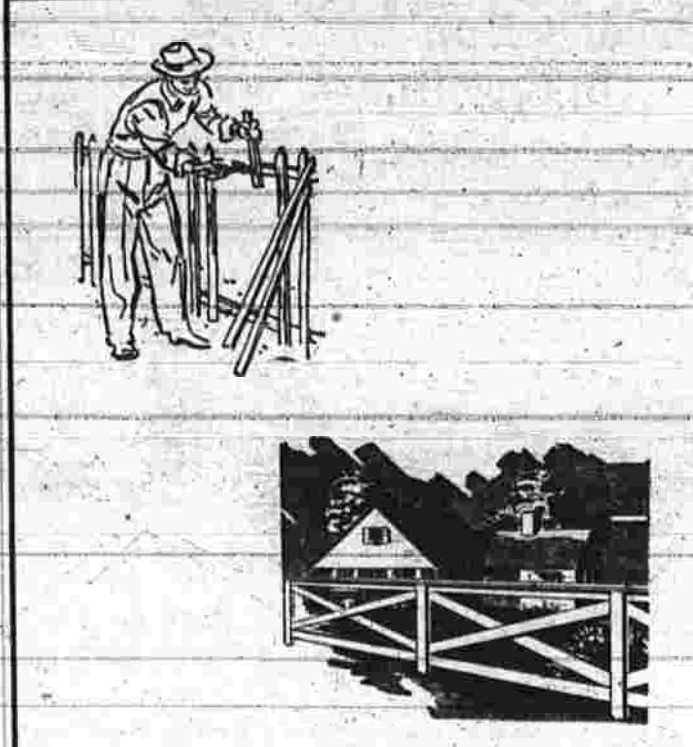

Tokyo, April 30—Eight American airmen were killed in two transport plane crashes in southern Japan within 10 hours, the Far East Air Forces announced today.

A C-46 transport on a routine investigation flight crashed into the rim of Mt. Am, 530 miles southwest of Tokyo this morning. FEAF said all four crewmen were killed.

A C-119 cargo-transport hit a ridge last night on an instrument approach to Ashiya Air Base on Kyushu island. FEAF said its four airmen were killed. Names of all crewmen were withheld.

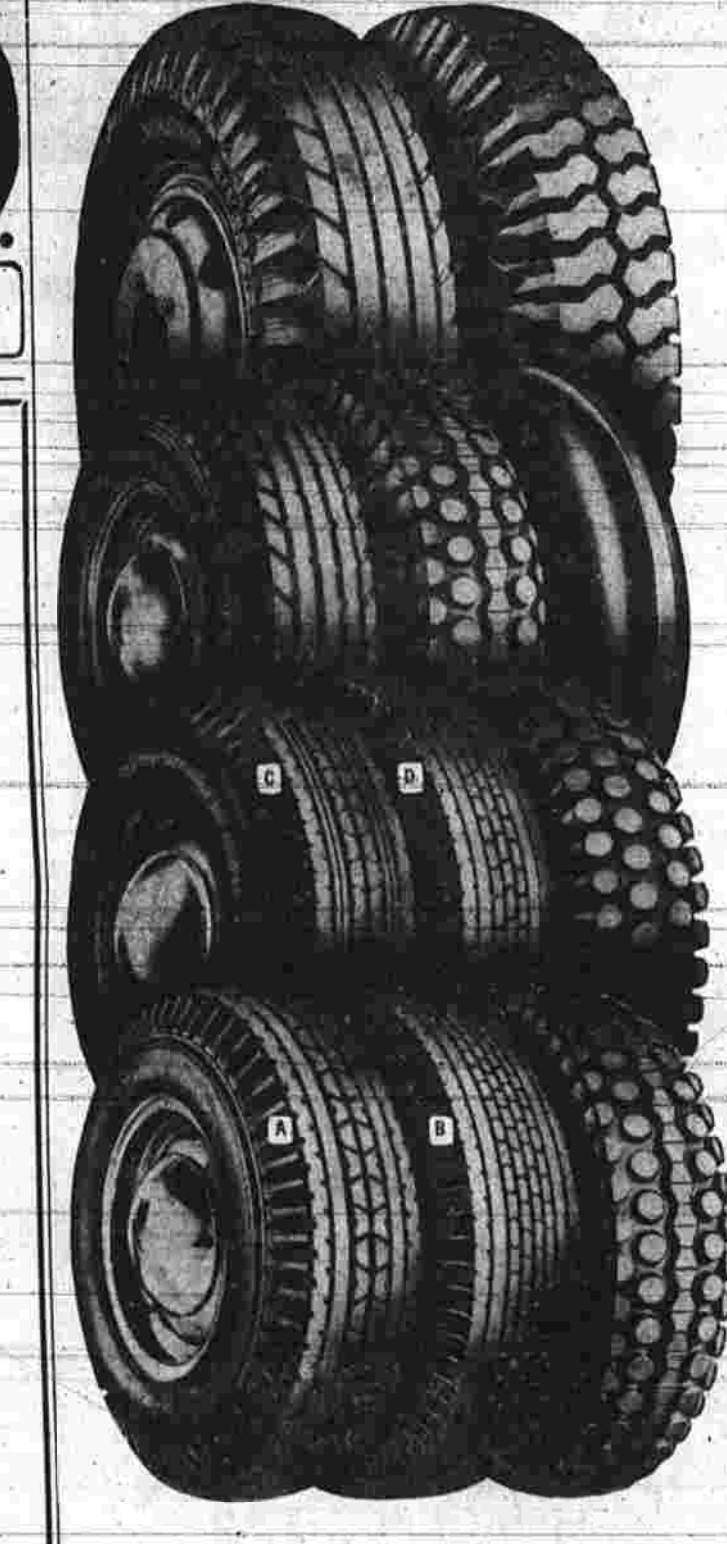
