Bailey Urges Lodge Disclosure State Tax Plan

Hartford, May 1.—John M. Bailey, Democratic state chairman, called on Gov. John Lodge and the Republican party today to disclose what tax plans they have in mind for the future.

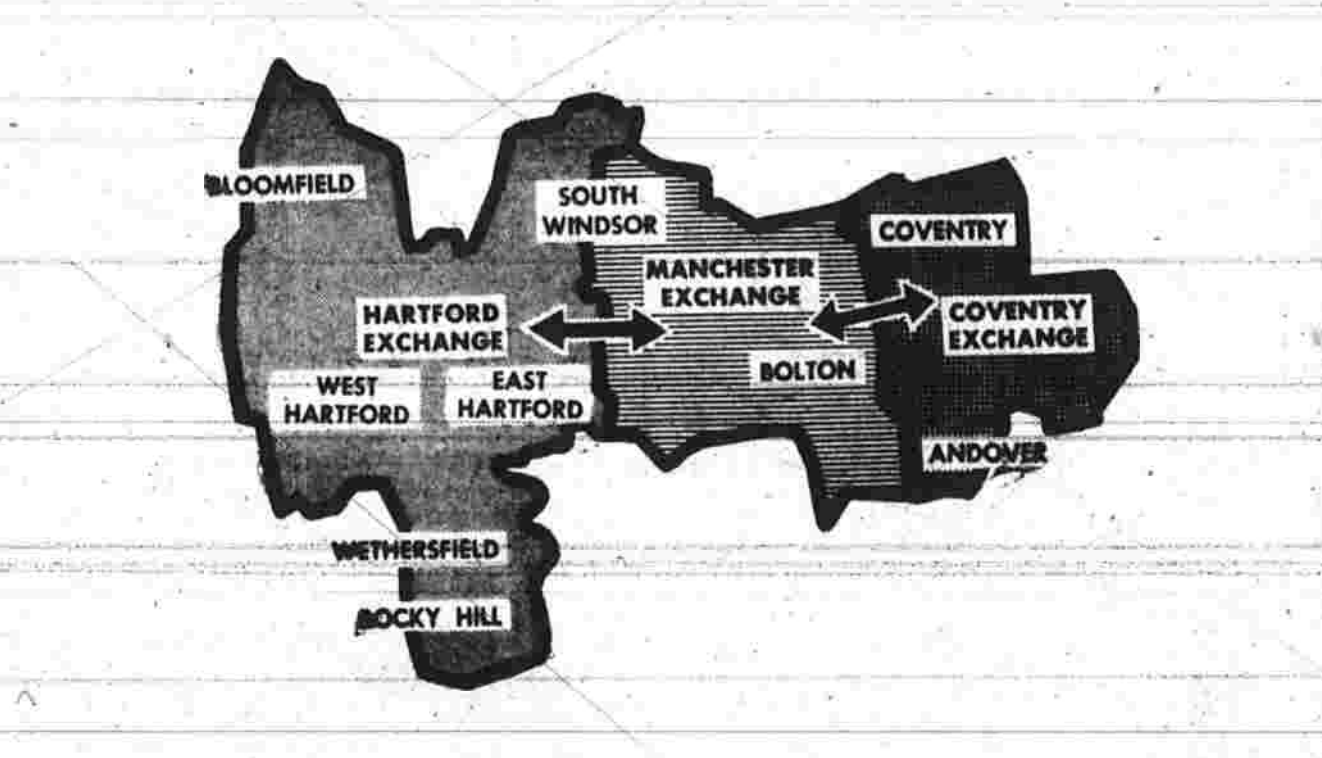
