**Tardy Nationalism**  
 As General MacArthur analyzed China, accurately we think the dominant fact about China today is not that it happens to be Communist, but that it is nationalistic. For the first time in modern history, China is united under a government which is feeling its nationalistic oats.

Under such nationalistic impulses, the new China has two main instincts.

The first is to be rid of all traces of foreign-imperialistic domination in the past.

This second instinct, and, if possible, expand its own borders.

Under the second instinct, China reacted to the approach of Western troops to its border with Korea. Under this instinct, China is determined to regain Formosa. Under this instinct, China has reestablished its claim of sovereignty in Tibet. Under this instinct, China is leading all the movement which is trying to expel the French from Indo-China. And, for all we know, the new force that is new China may develop an even more dangerous dynamism of an imperialistic sort.

Under the present aim of securing and guarding China's nationalistic borders may evolve into the effort to expand its borders at the expense of other peoples.

A unified, resurgent China would be behaving this way regardless of the particular ideology which happened to be dominant.

Similarly, in the new China's first instinct—to be rid of all traces of foreign domination and influence inside China itself—the motivation is more nationalistic than ideological.

Thus, the decision of British business interests to withdraw from Communist China is exactly parallel to the situation in Iran, Arabi, where we are being pressured with demands that we give up our contract for a monopoly because of Communist influence, but because China is not united and dynamic and full of a sense of power and national dignity.

This instinct is exhibiting itself, first, against the western nations who happen to be opposed to the present ideology of China. But the long range, guess is that, in time it will exert itself as well against Russia, which happens to be ideologically friendly.

The fact that British business has found it cannot do business in China, has under the philosophy Britain follows in its diplomatic recognition of other governments, little to do with British diplomatic recognition of China. That never meant anything more than that Britain admitted that the present government of China is in control of China. There would be no more valid reason for withdrawing that recognition than there would be for withdrawing recognition of Iran or of Egypt, or for us to withdraw recognition of Saudi Arabia, if the Saudis happened to bargain too toughly for us, or to our American company out of his oil fields.

It is difficult to mount a fundamental quarrel with this instinct on the part of nations who are just finding their own sense of national unity and dignity in the world to have done with foreign ties, to establish their own right to the exploitation of their own resources.

One can regret it, and one can regret that these resurgent nationalisms are unwise, when they often sacrifice their own well-being along with that of the foreign interests they are trying to get.

One can point out to them that the kind of world they are trying to create—that of tight nationalistic economic compartments—is just as dangerous and just as evil and just as much out of keeping with the world's needs today as the worst kind of imperialism ever was.

But in all these instances, it is obvious that the instinct of tardy nationalism has to be run through, first, and national pride satisfied, before the principles of the world, including the former imperialisms, has learned to get recognition from these new nationalisms. These principles are that nationalistic barriers are outmoded and impractical in a world such as ours, and that the old-style nationalistic economic outlook, which so abhors China and Iran today, is an anachronism. It is the world's misfortune to have several new and troublesome nationalisms rising at the very moment when the thing the world needs to practice is internationalism.
