### Connecticut Yankee

Two years ago, at the dead end of a dynamic Republican state convention, the "Yankee" remained one of the few platforms that was not abandoned. It was the familiar Republican dog, coming to offer German aid to the German people, and that all Germans must stand long as Russian diplomacy sticks to the dove mood, on the German question, it will inevitably be most effective in German minds. It is when Russia retreats to threat and bluster and violence that Russia's conviction even the Germans that we are doing the only thing, we can do even if it is not perfect. Fortunately for our diplomacy, Russia usually helps us along by alternating bluster and threat with its pliancy. Russian threats have come to the point where they merely solidify the outside world. But, for the moment, the ceremony at Bonn, the Russians used a different reason, which still has the power to drive us up the wall.

While the Russians played this role, the last minute Western diplomats who, under the leadership of the secretary at Bonn, revealed the basic weakness of the structure Mr. Acheson is an instant upon building.

The signing at Bonn leaves the responsibility of the West still where it was before the signing. That responsibility is to put Russian offers about German unity on the real test of negotiation, and to try to answer them by Wednesday or Wednesday.

### Describes Life of Writer In Hollywood Movie Job

Bradford Ropes, well known author, gave an autobiographical sketch in allegory of his own adventures in "The World of Books" to the Women's Club of Manchester last night at the South Methodist Church.

Mr. Ropes' background as a dancer, novelist and screen writer gave him a wealth of experiences to recall, as his talk, the synopsis of the trials and tribulations of writing a book "compared" with raising a child. He compared the publisher in a "godfather" who helps guide the brainchild to its appearance before the public. He said the public must not be offended in the publicity program following the publication of a book when autographed copies are in such demand.

When a writer goes to Hollywood, he becomes accustomed to the unusual life there. Contrary to what the writer says that he does not have too much to say about his story is presented on the screen, stated the author.

The speaker said that writing for comedians is the most difficult thing to do because comedians often sound much different when delivered on the screen. ### Employer Rights Upheld by Courts

Washington, May 27—(AP)—The Supreme Court yesterday ruled that an employer's right to insist during collective bargaining talks on a "management prerogative clause" in the labor contract is not unconstitutional. The case is included in the contract signed by American National Insurance Co. of Calumet, Ind., which gives the firm the right to decide on work schedules and hiring, discharging and disciplining of employees.

Upheld 7-1 a Federal Trade Commission order requiring the Rubber Co. to cease asserted discrimination in prices on roofing materials; rejected by a 7-1 vote a commission claim it was entitled to an injunction to enforce the Rubber order, regardless of the fact there was no threatened violation of it.

Affirmed 8-0 an anti-trust judgment against the Beasler Manufacturing Co., an Alpena, Mich. firm, which builds machines used in making concrete blocks.

Upheld 6-2 a Federal Power Commission order against the Pennsylvania Water and Power Co. The order required it to pay a 7,000,000 annual electric rate cut for the Baltimore area.

Granted a hearing on claims by labor organizations that the United States should pay for their priorities in Manila which were destroyed by the U. S. Army in 1941 when Japanese troops invaded the Philippines. The claims have been estimated to total more than six million dollars.

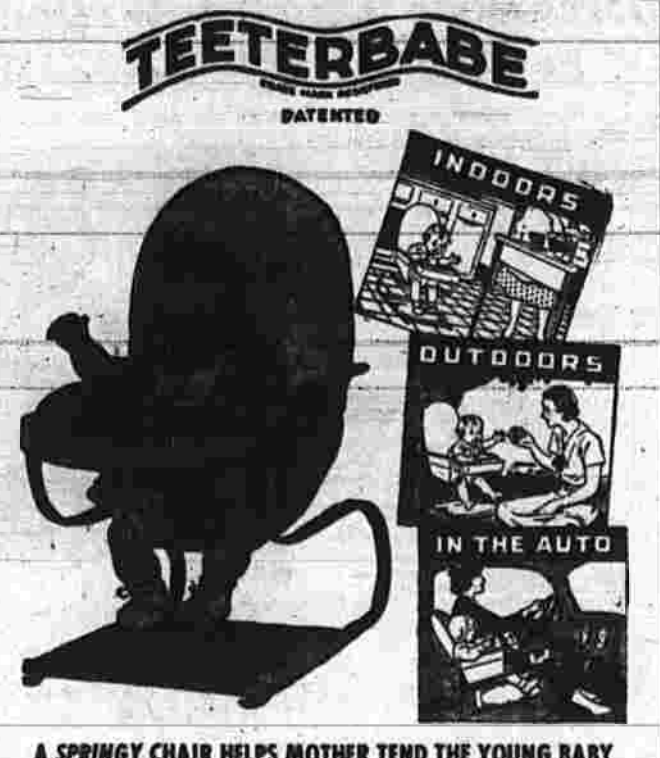
