Fascists Gain, Ozark Cleric In Death Fast To Aid Reds

jubilation over the new heights to which their fascist brethren had pulled them, Achille Luro, president of the Fascist party, telegraphed ecstatic exclaiming "Un-bien! In Portugal!"

The great victory in Naples and southern Italy has opened a new road for victory in the forthcoming national elections. We shall continue... in the assurance, now already well founded that we shall restore to Italy by democratic means her king.

Some political observers said the Fascists were only using the Monarchists to build strength. De Gasperi a few hours before the election warned that the rightist alliance could only lead the Royalists to disaster.

Rome headed in the tranquility of the government victory. But in both temper and tone, the shadow of Venustino, worried and hunched, was seen in the call of the victorious Neo-Fascist-Monarchist alliance.

After a turbulent election campaign studded with stabblings, the Communist-led Fascist government was quiet as the results came.

Christian Democrats Win 323 2,400 fewer at stake showed the Christian Democrat bloc had won 323, the Communist-Socialist alliance 189 and the Neo-Fascist-Monarchist 45.

Though they held Rome, De Gasperi's pro-NATO bloc lost 2,400 votes there. With 1,600,000 more persons voting than in the 1948 national election, the vote-Christian Democrats 384, Communist-Socialist 214,243, Neo-Fascist-Monarchist—208,819 represented a loss of 70,000 for the government, gains of 60,000 for the Reds and 150,000 for the Rightists.

That was the story in much of the voting area—central and southern Italy, Sicily and Sardinia.

The government bloc lost some ground in the north, where Fascist major gains. The extreme right boom.

Fearful Exposure

Gill, completely exhausted, wanted to be helped, but his companions forced him to climb a steep bank side which to assist for fear of exposure.

Daniel Holt, North Haven Junior High School student, received the silver medal for his rescue of the three boys.

North Haven Feb. 7. He saw the boy disappear through the ice, got down on his stomach and, though crippled by influenza, crawled to him across the ice, seized him by the collar and held his head above water. Meanwhile, three other boys crawled into the water and were rescued by the humane group.

A report made to the humane group, Daniel was "depressed by the other boys' risk his life, but never hesitated."

Does Not Swim

A bronze medal was presented to Mr. Martin Dworkin who rescued his son, Warren, who fell into a well filled with 13 feet of water near his home on Marshall Lane, Derby.

His wife, Jeanne, Jackie Lawrence, also a well swimmer, saw the boy in the accident scene.

Father's screams attracted the mother who rushed out, jumped into the well and held her son afloat. Although the boy did not swim himself, her cries attracted the attention of two men, William Vaughn and Ronald Applebaum, who rescued the boy and child from the well. They were given certificates of award for their part in the rescue.

Rainmaking Continues To Cause Controversy

By HURON THOMPSON
 (Second and last of a two-part series on rainmaking)

Denver, May 28.—Rainmaking, again being done on a large scale in the west, is a hot issue among residents.

Some believe clouds can be seeded with dry ice or silver iodine to increase rainfall or control hail. Others are unconvinced. Some even up in the middle.

"Most of the cattlemen feel that the rain has been 'done' and that the rain is not natural," said Norman A. Good, secretary of the Southwestern Nebraska Water Improvement Association (SNWIA).

But he continued, "the majority of the people who went into this thing in the spring were possibly too enthusiastic."

Chas. C. Rydov, manager of the Northwest Nebraska Water Development Corporation (NNWDC), said many when farmers "paid more after seeding started gave them one of the best yields they have ever had."

A preliminary report of a Colorado and N. Dakota evaluation of cloud seeding in northern Colorado concluded "there was a perceptible increase in precipitation," but the report also stated "no proof that possible good results cannot be brought about by artificial cloud seeding."

Cloudy Conditions
 The research organization of the commercial seeding company which operated in the period between 1948 and 1950, because of cloudy conditions were poor for seeding but even so, there was a "probable" increase of zero to one per cent over the normal yield would have fallen "naturally."

"At least 15 tanks in northwest South Dakota and southwest North Dakota urged cloudy seeding be tried again because it showed "considerable merit," said a survey of 1951 operations, the South Dakota Natural Resources Commission and State College reported.

"At least one meteorologist in the state claimed that the seeding rain clouds by over-seeding them with silver iodine. In parts of west and central Texas, a heavy rain fell while watching their land burn up for lack of moisture—contracted for rainmaking with a "What have we in store?"

Other Texas rain nature left alone. One reader wrote the Big Spring Herald that cloud seeding is "messing with the Lord's blessing."

"Some wrong the West Texas Herald that rain increases better look out for the wrath of God."

Welcome Rainfall
 H. C. Miller, Jr., chairman, Oklahoma rancher and head of the Oklahoma-Texas-Cansas Water Improvement Association (OTCWA) said rainfall in the period contracted last year was only half an inch above the normal 13.89. But he continued, "the welcome and credited to the rainmaking contractor. This is a bumper crop."

On the other hand, Leslie Hogg, Great County, Okla., public market administrator, whose area is covered by a new irrigation project—sponsoring association, is critical.

"After all," he said, "let God handle the rainfall as he sees fit and let the farmers put their land in the best condition possible to receive rainfall."

Pear growers in Oregon's Rogue River Valley are satisfied that cloud seeding prevented hail but

Electric research chemist whose experiments set modern-day rainmaking efforts in motion, sounded a possible mid-way at the Great Plains Council.

"Now will be up to the farmer, I think... whether or not he just has another experience like we have had so many times in the past when so-called rain makers would drive up with their covered wagon... start out some out-meriting chemicals, and then take credit for anything that might happen along about that time."

"I personally think we are bringing in that stage. I think we know enough about precipitation mechanisms that if we want to, we can eventually do most anything we want with the weather (but)... we are not going to get very far unless every one is willing to go at it in the right way."

John Battle of Beaumont, Calif., claimed that seeding for 20 water, irrigation, and municipal agencies accounted for 20 per cent of the December rainfall in San Diego County.

Some are downright skeptical:

Reasons Listed
 "From pure scientific reasoning... we are unable to state that a seeding operation will produce increased precipitation," said R. A. Dightman, Montana section director of the U. S. Weather Bureau.

"Rainmaking hasn't been proven...," said E. F. Ridgeway, director of Washington state's Pollution Control Commission.

"I don't think it has been demonstrated that any substantial increase in rain has been achieved by any rainmaking method," said Richard Garrett, head of the Kansas section of the U. S. Weather Bureau.

War Dead Held in Honor By Nation-wide Program

Emphasizing the sober and reflective traditions that surround observance of Memorial Day, a spokesman for the permanent committee in a statement today pointed to the true meaning of this most sacred of national holidays and urged all to uphold it as one of the country's "great traditions."

Recalling the efforts of local servicemen who sacrificed their lives in our nation's battles, the speaker told of Manchester's part in the general war and listed the obligations of a saddened citizenry in remembering the honored dead of battle.

"On Memorial Day, May 30, our nation will assemble to honor its heroic dead. This day is sacred with the almost visible presence of those who have gone before us."

"At the GAR monument in Center Park the veterans and citizens of Manchester gather to honor the men who served their country. Each flag at the base of the monument symbolizes the grave of a local service man or veteran who lies buried at rest in other parts of the world. The flags are arranged in the most fitting manner to represent the Revolutionary War and each state in turn representing the years of 1812, 1848, 1860, 1868, 1871 and 1881."

"We honor the memory of those who gave their lives in the service of their country, and of those others who, since the different wars, have dropped their burdens by the wayside of life, and are gone to their eternal rest. Those who of battle, and in distant lands, defend the story of their valiant

guard them here. Never before has our liberty in this country been more seriously threatened both from without and within. As the students of today and the citizens and soldiers of tomorrow, it will be your duty to uphold the great traditions of our country as those men we honor on this day have done."

Under the quiet and, be it noted, the murmuring waves, their bodies sleep in peace.

"Nothing is really ever forgotten. No battle is ever fought that does not continue to vibrates through all time. And no prayer is ever whispered that is not indubitably stamped in the records of the Almighty. Memorial Day is a day when memory of battle and the comfort of prayer are intertwined. Our tribute of floral wreaths upon the graves of the men who died to preserve America's freedom must be accompanied by our prayers of gratitude."

"By the grace of Providence, this nation up to the present has had the valor and skill to emerge victorious from the ordeals imposed by alien military aggression."

The luncheon will be at 12:30 when the style show presented by Boyle will also begin. 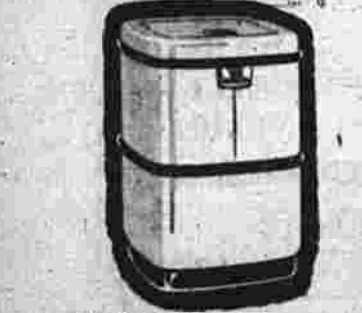

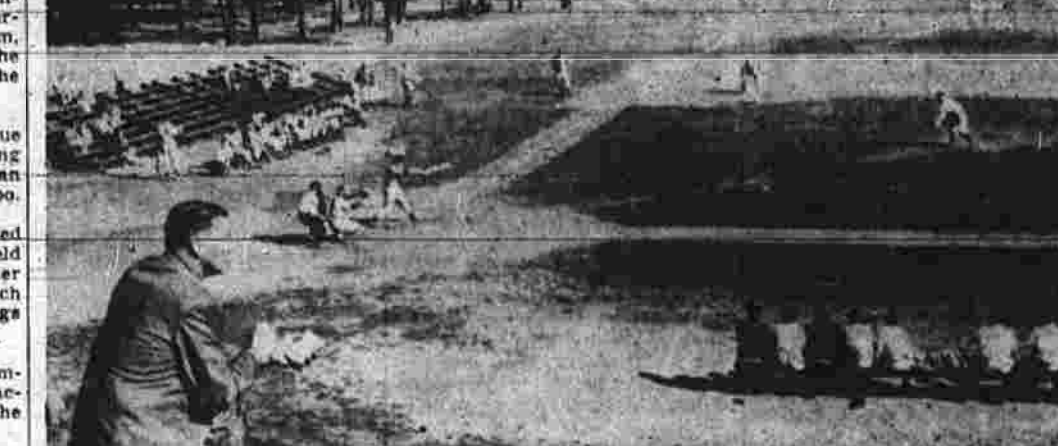

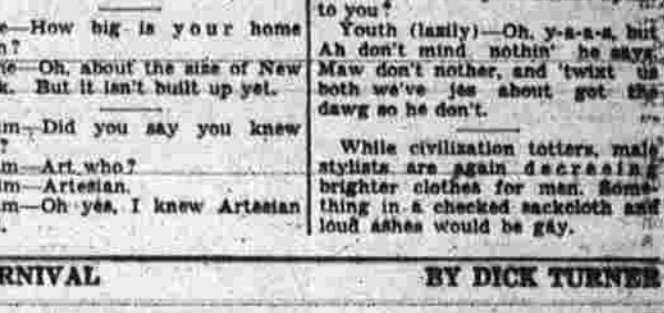
