Outside a combined force of about 200 British military police

soldiers and German police maintained their siege.

After a full day of silence toward the British action, the entire Russian-controlled press in Berlin chanted denunciations of the British "provocation" and the Russian Communist party, termed the British action "an attempt to injure radio broadcasting in the German Democratic Republic."

The station's chief political commentator, K. A. L. Eduard-von-Schmitzer, interviewed by telephone, declared cockily that the radio's staff would hold out against the blockade.

"We are only sorry that we can't have you and our British friends (blockading soldiers) in to lunch today."

The total authorization now is about half a billion dollars less than the minimum urged by Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower before he quit his European command to return here as a candidate for the Republican presidential nomination.

The compromise restored about 250 millions for European Military and defense support aid that the House cut out.

The agreement also makes setting reductions in a number of aid items for other global areas that the House approved intact but the Senate rejected.

General Provisions

The compromise carries \$1,498,750 for Europe; \$741,430,500 for Asia and the Near East; \$268,250,000 for the Far East and Pacific areas; \$78,014,750 for Latin America; \$2,287,500 for moving European populations to less crowded areas; \$2,287,500 to pay costs of transporting aid to underdeveloped areas; and \$16,481,000 for the United Nations International Children's fund.

Stricken from the bill were a number of House and Senate provisions on operation of the foreign aid program.

The House had directed that a billion dollars be spent for arms manufactured in Europe but this was knocked out when officials said it would not be possible to spend that much during the next fiscal year starting July 1.

munists attempted protest-walks.
