the world "idea" to describe what the Communists believe in and what they advocate, and it is quite obvious that Eisenhower himself does not accept the Communist creed or way of life as an "idea" in his own thinking. But he is capable of seeing how these things appear to the Communists themselves. He is capable of admitting that, so the Communists, their own beliefs are "ideal." He is able to state that, on the other side of the present world division, there are idealistic and sincere things which are valid for Russians, even if they are merely propaganda to us.

In short, Eisenhower's mild and his concepts are all one thing. In his own mind, he believes in having opposing interests try to seek out and understand opposing points of view, and he would use firmness and strength not to enable one side to change the other, but for protection until some adjustment of views, and recognition of common interests above the differences, could come about. This idea of conceding the Russians their ideals, and sincerity in them, is so old with Eisenhower as his writing of his book about his campaigns in Europe, and in a measure of a mild broad enough to view the world passively, from the point of view of America, and to let the world come to its own conclusions, and to study the world picture to see how peace might be achieved. To be able to look on the enemy without their fear or hate—that is the capacity free world leadership must have. It is ever ready to find a solution other than the destruction of both the free world and the slave world. Eisenhower is talking about peace. The whole world is seeking a more peaceful and better world. There is some chance of making good of whatever possibilities for peace still exist.

**Our Friends Are Uneasy**

Some of our friends in the world who will probably not be considered our real friends for the time being, are trying to rescue us from the deadlock we have created in Korea by their handling of the prisoner exchange issue. The suggestion made by several leading delegates to the United Nations that the matter of formal returning some prisoners to the Communists and formally refusing to return the others, was just what they needed. They are not only important but possible, and we are glad he has not fallen into the cheap trap of the Truman position about potential meetings with Stalin, which is that Stalin must come to Washington if he ever wants to talk peace. It may be dangerous nonsense to talk too loudly and too politically of every man's peace. It is equally dangerous, however, to talk of peace as if it were nonsense, as if it were impossible, as if anybody who happened to believe in the possibility of peace were, notwithstanding, an irresponsible, or traitorous, weakling, or fool.

Later in the same press conference, Eisenhower specified when he thought peace might be possible. Asked whether he thought the differences between the United States and Russia could be negotiated, he replied:

"They are not negotiable as long as the Soviet doctrine insists that Communism may not exist in the world with a free system of government, and therefore by every means open to them—subversion, bribery, corruption, threat of force—that they are going to destroy our form of government because we are not perfect. They are not negotiable because you have not direct clash of two ideas. My own opinion is that we can produce a situation in the world where they may modify that statement, that intention, and therefore get to a position at least where we can work out a method of living with them."

This has, it should be said, been the foreign policy theory expressed by Acheson. But closer we have come to that moment, the more Acheson has feared it, and run from it, into the arms of a disastrous and prolonged armament race. It is now a matter of serious doubt whether Acheson would ever be capable of cashing in on the policy he claims to be following.

Why might Eisenhower be different? The key may lie in the fact that he is both partisan and non-partisan in the field of foreign policy, that while he is dedicated to defend us and our designs in the world, he is also capable of some understanding of how the enemy feels in his own position. It is to be expected, therefore, that the paragraphs just quoted, he referred to a clash of "two ideas." It is a long time, we suspect, since an American spokesman has used

### Connecticut Yankee

With Governor Lodge and Republican State Chairman Baldwin continuing neutral to the end, or to be precise, growing more neutral toward the end, the battle for the senatorial nomination resolved itself into an independent and unincorporated fight between the two major candidates, William Purtell of West Hartford, and Prescott Bush of Greenwich. The reasons why Purtell won are as follows:

Purtell was in exactly the opposite situation. He had fought for a nomination, a chance to run for office, in the 1950 convention, and had lost in the convention. He had been a good loser. ### Many Towns Fatality Free

Manchester Among 21 With No Deaths for First 5 Months of '52

Hartford, June 10—Twenty percent of the 44 towns over 10,000 population have not been charged with motor vehicle fatalities this year as of June 5, according to a report by the Connecticut Safety Commission, based on figures furnished by the Motor Vehicle Department.

Norwich is the largest town in this group, having recorded no fatal accidents since Dec. 8, 1951, a period of 174 deathless days as of June 1. The other 21 towns fall into a period of five months of fatality-free for the first five months of the year.

In the 5-10 thousand population group, 18 of the 20 towns were fatality-free as follows: Bethel, Bloomfield, Canton, Farmington, Glastonbury, Griswold, Guilford, New Britain, North Haven, Plainville, Plymouth, Portland, Rocky Hill, Torrington, Westford, Windsor, and Woodbury.
