Most were calling regulations gear increases to the cost of living.

A formula under which an employer and a union would be allowed to agree on an annual productivity increase and the productivity index would be inflationary.

Output Up Yearly

Productivity over the past year, economists say, has gone up at least two per cent per year. In other words, the average worker has been able to turn out two per cent greater production each year. Better equipment, faster production methods, and the skill and health of workers are reasons given to explain this.

Organized labor contends workers should get automatic wage boosts to compensate for the increased output.

Industry, however, says that productivity varies greatly from year to year and has resisted any formula approach which would allow automatic wage increases.

More than a million auto and farm implement workers are now getting annual productivity increases of four cents an hour. They were granted a similar increase in January, 1951.

The WSB is prepared to keep working on its formula, but that might not be for several weeks.

Key members of the WSB, which is composed of six members each representing the public utility and labor, were said to favor an across-the-board approach, rather than one compelling an employer and a union to come to the WSB each time a separate productivity agreement was reached in collective bargaining.

Democrats will be pledged to support "such necessary" tax increases proposed by the Governor as seem most fair and equitable provided that all reasonable economies in state government have been effected.

The legislative platform, made public yesterday, proposes many governmental reorganizations designed to promote efficiency and economy.

The platform takes issue with Lodge on the Fairfield county throughway question.

The Democratic party has instructed the Highway department to proceed with the immediate construction of the all purpose throughway to relieve congestion on the Boston Post road.

The Democratic platform would postpone construction until the General Assembly has the opportunity to reconsider the entire project.

The new Democratic State Central committee is slated to meet immediately after the convention. The prospects are that John M. Bailey will be re-elected state chairman, a post he has held since 1946.

Reliable sources say that Mrs. Gertrude O'Donnell of Elizabeth will be named vice chairman to succeed Mrs. Bell, who does not seek re-election.

Approve School Proposal At Spirited Town Meeting

Rockville, June 12 (Special)—At a spirited meeting held last night in Town Hall with some 350 citizens in attendance, it was voted to build and equip another elementary school.

Winfred Kleider was named chairman of the meeting, which lasted two hours and was marked by freewheeling appeals to the Town Council Attorney Harry H. Lutz for rulings on correct parliamentary procedure.

The first item on the agenda was the Board of Selection and Town Treasurer to borrow \$200,000 for the special meeting held in the spring and this was done by Town Clerk Kerwin Elliott. Following further questions by Robert Usher, the sum was voted. At the previous meeting, the Board of Selection had no authorization being given.

The matter of disposing of Vernon Depot, which no longer used for school purposes, was also voted on and it was decided that it would be sold either with sealed bids or at auction.

Selections were authorized to construct Birch road and a road to be known as State Aid Funds, of which \$50,000 is available at the present time.

Item four was to see if the town favored erection of a new elementary school. Campbell presented a resolution that the town erect and equip such a school. The longest discussion of the evening followed, sparked by a question who had the right to vote at the meeting.

Wanted to Speak

Superintendent of Schools Arthur Chatterton, a non-voter, asked permission to speak. Kenneth Smith, Robert Usher, and Lucien Martin objected. Attorney Lutz stated that the town could speak at a meeting with the unanimous consent of those present.

In his reply to the question for the town to withdraw its objection, Smith said that he had no objection to the report compiled by Superintendent Usher.

The Board of Education, under the leadership of Alex Hammer, has statistics of enrollment including the fact that 96 children are in the sixth grade this year, 183 in the first grade, and 188 registered for kindergarten in the fall.
