ENDORSER FATHER'S DAY

Hartford, June 15—Father is becoming a more important member of the family all the time, said Governor Lodge today in a statement endorsing the observance of Father's Day on Sunday.

The observance of Father's Day is a natural and fitting tribute to the father, said the Governor, rather than to the mother.

At the same time, a father's contributions to the protection of the family and to the upbringing of children are more significant than ever today in a world which increasingly needs to understand and practice those responsibilities which are inseparable from the enjoyment of rights and freedoms.

Rescuing Acheson?

Mr. Acheson went to Europe and got his signature on the pact permanently partitioning Germany and dividing the half of Germany with the West. That was a high presided diplomatic triumph.

Now the inevitable reaction is manifesting itself. The most important in this reaction is the fact that the French Cabinet has formally instructed Foreign Minister Schuman to seek an early Big Four conference on the subject of free elections in Germany and Austria.

The instructions of the French Cabinet seek to eliminate the strategy Mr. Acheson would prefer, which would be to enter a long struggle with Russia which would, of course, make it more difficult ever to get a conference opened. The French move is to propose a conference on the specific two issues involved, and let the conference take a wider scope if it so wishes.

This French move is to the detriment of Acheson's position. In Washington, Mr. Acheson is pressing for our ratification of the pact.

In Germany, Chancellor Achenbach is encountering increased political pressure against his effort to obtain a quick ratification. He has now been relieved by both houses of the Reichstag of his demand for speed, and evidence is that the Germans themselves are intending to allow time for negotiation before they ratify it if they eventually ratify it.

In Britain, Foreign Secretary Eden has given Chamberlain a hint that he, like the French Cabinet, is considering an early Big Four conference.

Neither the French nor Mr. Eden have any sufficient idea of what is in the Big Four conference. It is the only solution of the German problem which could bring by permanent stability.

This interference by the diplomatic and political forces of Europe, with Mr. Acheson's plan, is something to be welcomed rather than deplored. For Mr. Acheson is on the issue of Germany, rashly devoted to an historic impossibility, which he needs to be rescued.
