Washington, June 17.—(AP)—The Army disclosed today that it has sent anti-aircraft batteries to defensive positions about strategic industrial plants, big cities and Air Force centers.

An announcement said the move "has no special significance" but it came on the heels of Air Force orders for possible enemy planes to attack U. S. cities.

### Continuing Probe Of Ellington Fire

Ellington, June 17—State Police today continue their investigation through the Fire Marshal's office of the blaze that leveled an uncompleted private dwelling in this community Sunday.

A police spokesman stated that nothing new has developed in the case which was brought to the attention by Fire Chief Joseph DeCarli of Ellington after firefighters under his command stood helplessly by and watched the home of carpenter Jacob Leitcher go up in smoke. The chief told inquiries that when he arrived it had gained such headway. The house was located on Spruce Lane road, near Route 83.

United Nations, N. Y., June 17—The United States says it welcomes an opportunity in the Security Council tomorrow to discuss the "realization" of "propaganda" in Russia's continued use of charges that the U. S. and the UN are waging germ warfare in Korea.

The American position was made clear in a short but sharp statement issued last night by Ernest A. Gross, acting head of the U. S. delegation after Russia's Jacob A. Malik called the Security Council to meet for a round on germ warfare.

**OPS Lifts Ceilings After Freight Hike**

Washington, June 17—(AP)—Department stores now may boost prices on most of their goods starting next Monday.

The increases allowed range from a penny or two on small items to a dollar or more on furniture, radio and television sets.

But the Office of Price Stabilization (OPS) doesn't expect most price tags to be upped. It said many products now are selling below ceilings and the actual prices are determined by competition.

OPS authorized the increases yesterday to offset a rise in freight and parcel post rates since May, 1951.

The increases allowed range from 4 to 25 per cent in many areas, more in others. Rates for shipment of less than carload lots of some furniture have risen 25 to 100 per cent.

A number of large appliances, such as washing machines and freezers are not covered by the price order. OPS said it is drafting separate orders covering these.
