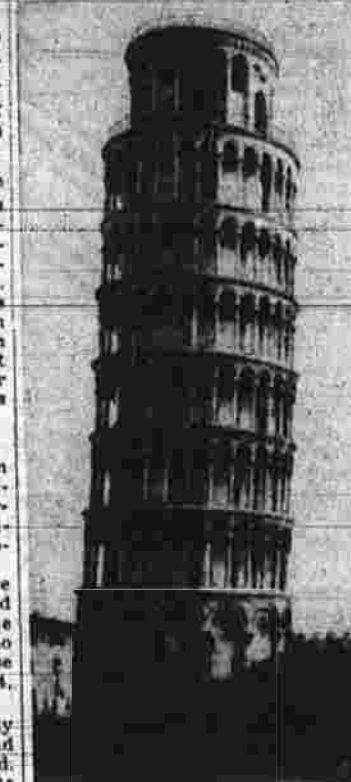


### Leaning Tower of Pisa May Fall in 2100 A. D.

Pisa, Italy.—If you want to do what thousands of other Americans have done and be photographed in front of the Leaning Tower of Pisa, do it before 2,100 A. D.

Why? Because although the tower has shown no dangerous new tilt today, normal deterioration is expected to bring it tumbling down in about 100 years unless new restoration work is done.

However, for the moment, it is as safe as the tower has been in years. Reports from the recent North Italy floods, after the recent North Italy floods, that the tower had tilted further to a dangerous point.



Tilting Tower of Pisa

**No Immediate Danger**  
The old and solid tower is in no immediate danger of collapsing," said Dr. Nicola Salvadori, who daily checks the delicate seismographs and inclinometers inside the tower.

Some years ago, an extensive survey was made of the ground on which the tower is built. The danger, that there is no conclusion was that there is no danger that the tower would collapse for 100 years.

The tower, leaning dangerously in 1874, when its construction had reached 33 feet from the ground. The ground gave way on its southern side for about 5 inches in depth. Architect Romano tried to correct the inclination until the fourth order of arches, but he did not succeed and gave up the construction.

Norwalk, June 18.—Outgoing districts of this city will remain without police protection because voters defeated a referendum by not turning out in sufficient strength at the polls yesterday.

Only 4,064 persons voted in the referendum. By law, it takes 51 per cent of the total registered voting population to make a referendum legal. ### Investigate Death Of Carnival Hand

Norwich, June 18.—Erwald Allen Snyder, 41, of Capitol Heights, Mary., a carnival worker attached to the World of Mirth Shows now playing here, was found dead under mysterious circumstances in one of the sleeping cars this morning. Coroner Edward G. McKay ordered an inquest after it was found that Snyder had a cut on the top of his head and there was evidence of some blood in the car. The Coroner also received information that Snyder had had an argument with other carnival workers early Tuesday night and that one of them had then made a threat to "get him." Alvin Pradol reported that he had heard the argument in the business section of the city but was unable to identify the men involved other than that they were all carnival workers.

In the course of the investigation Coroner McKay learned that Snyder was found lying on the floor of the sleeper shortly after

### midnight by Theodore Berry, 28-year-old porter employed by the carnival management. Berry, according to the coroner, put Snyder in one of the bunk beds he was then under the impression that the man had fallen out of the bunk and was merely intoxicated.

The death, according to the coroner, was reported this morning by Albert Moody, one of the carnival foremen, after he found Snyder dead in the bunk.

Dr. H. Peter Stewart, acting medical examiner, expressed the opinion that Snyder was found several hours when he was dead. He will direct the autopsy at the W. W. Backus Hospital.

**The Impossible Comes True**  
 With action by the Italian Chamber of Deputies on Monday an impossible dream of Europe which is all to the good, came true.

The Schuman Plan has now been ratified by Italy, France, West Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg.

Representatives of these six nations will meet in Paris June 30 to put the Schuman Plan into effect.

This is the wisest thing nations of Europe have ever done together. It is, with all due deference to the joint military strength these same nations are engaged in creating, the strongest thing they have ever done.

Routine statements are still inclined, we suspect, to look at the Schuman Plan with an attitude of disbelief. For the Schuman Plan consists of the internationalization of the coal and steel resources of the six nations involved. One thing it means is that the nations involved will not be capable of finding the industrial capacity for war against each other. Another thing it means is that they will have no army, navy, or right for economic war with one another, either. Another thing it means is that they have united themselves, in one key respect, for the twin ideals of peace and prosperity.

The strength of the Schuman Plan is not only that it realizes an age old ideal. It also contains the seeds of peace for the world of our present moment. It threatens nobody. It merely creates a principle and a practice which are psychologically stronger than any army could be. An army cannot be created without carrying, in itself, some threat of offensive possibility, some threat that it itself must eventually be used. The reliance upon force for security inevitably carries a challenge with it, which inspires the creation and amplification of opposing force. The reliance upon force is a negative reliance. The Schuman Plan is positive, aiming to build peace and prosperity rather than prevent war.

No one knows whether such measures alone would build and preserve a peaceful world. They have never been tried. What we have always tried is the reliance upon force, and what we have always had is war.

But, in the present era, one imaginative piece of statesmanship which dares try something new because men have realized that old methods have failed has at last come into fruition.

One effort at building peace is a new way, from a new approach, has finally been launched. Its own basic spirit demands a wider application than it is now getting. It faces competition from other, and older ways of trying to maintain peace. But, at least, it is clean, healthy and strong ingredient in our world test tube.

**That Mousstrap At Last**  
 We are pleased to note that somebody has finally actually done it—built a better mousstrap, that is.

For generations, it would seem, we have been mutually exhorting each other to do just this. Orator after orator, gathering after gathering, has described the sure fame and fortune which would await the man who did it. If there seemed one thing worth doing, this was it. If there was one project worthy of our national and individual imaginations, this was it. Yet, for oration after oration, nothing happened. Nobody actually went out and did it.

Now somebody has done it. Our relief to have it done at last is so great that we will give it a free commercial. The inventor is one A. G. Burns, who runs an electric and radio repair business, in Farmland, Indiana. His better mousstrap is being manufactured by the Jalo Motor Company, of Union City, Indiana. And the world is beginning to beat a path to the door.

The better mousstrap is called the "Electric-Cat." It offers to the mouse an electric shock which cannot possibly be transmitted to humans. After the mouse has been electrocuted, the better mousstrap trap grabs the victim and stores the body away in a special drawer compartment. The happy householder pulls out the drawer and disposes of the body without having to touch it. The entire operation is completely automatic. The trap resets itself within a fraction of a second after each catch.

Now that, at last, we have the better-mousstrap out of the way, we can look forward to the oratorical designation of our next piece of progress. It is good to know that, if we talk something long enough, it eventually will happen.

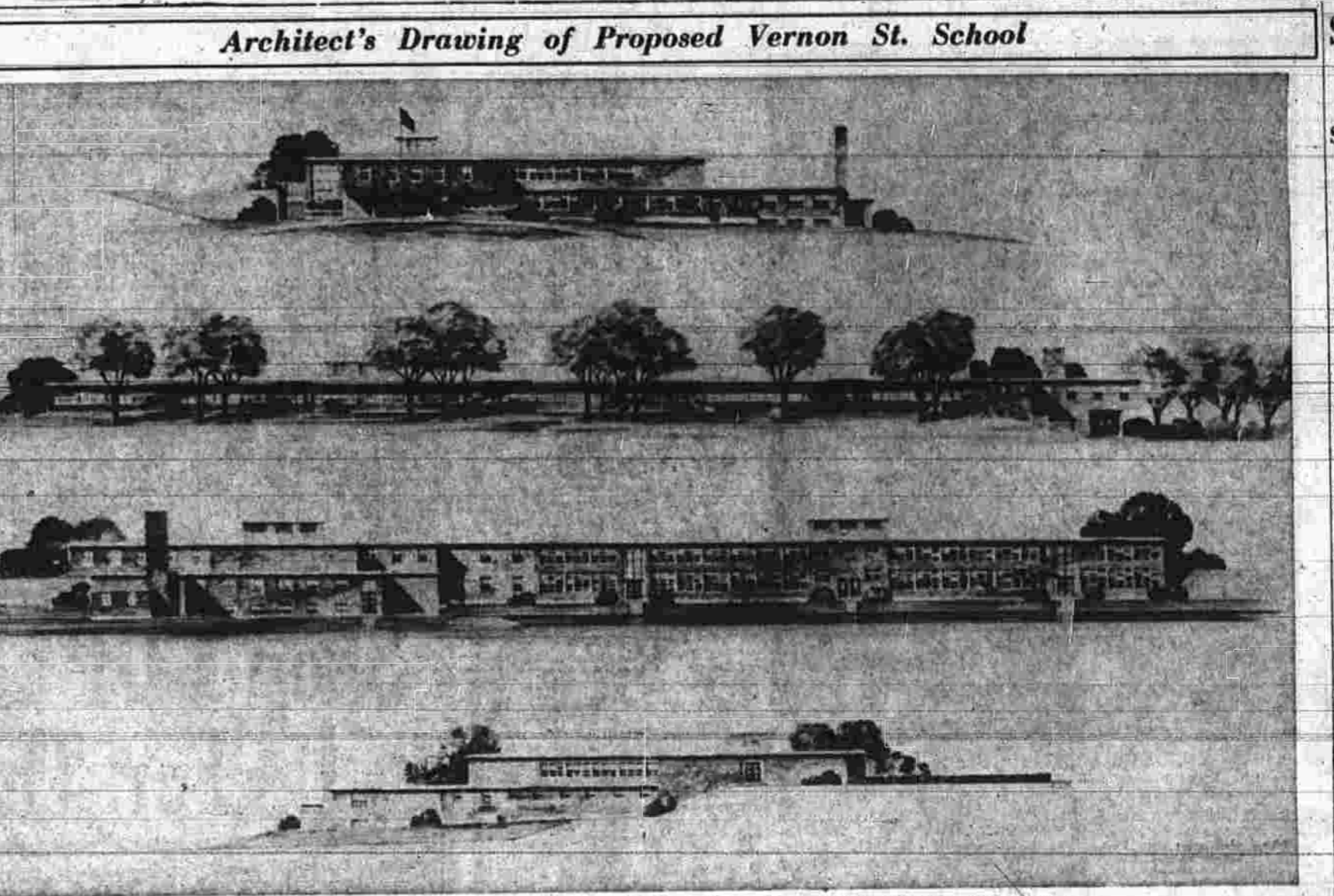

**Growing Youngsters' Desire For Independence Is Natural**

Writes a worried mother: "My fifteen-year-old daughter seems almost like a stranger to her father and me."

"If we ask her a direct question she is vague. If I try to get her to confide in me she shrugs away. She doesn't seem to want to be close to us."

"This, of course, worries us as a great deal. It must be our fault, but I honestly can't figure out how we have failed her. We have always been interested in everything she does. We try to be tolerant of her and her friends. We aren't more strict than other parents in her group. Yet she seems to be growing away from us. What can we do?"

Not much at this point. It sounds as though your daughter is just beginning to assert her independence as a person. Perhaps she feels no need to be faithful with her parents at this point because she is sharing secrets with friends of her own age in at the moment far more important than sharing them with you.

Just a Phase of Growing Up  
Don't let that hurt you. It is just a phase of growing up. And so long as you feel sure that you are understanding and tolerant, you really have nothing to be afraid of. In that case, she will come to you if she really needs you. Meanwhile, be thankful that she isn't too dependent on you—that she is busy figuring out things for herself and establishing her own individuality.

She'll come back to you in time. You may even busy that time by cutting your questions to a minimum, letting her understand that you are there if she needs you but that you aren't going to try to force confidences.

And above all don't get hurt because she seems to prefer the companionship of her "crowd" to your company. That is right and natural, and parents should never make their children feel guilty for their perfectly normal reactions.

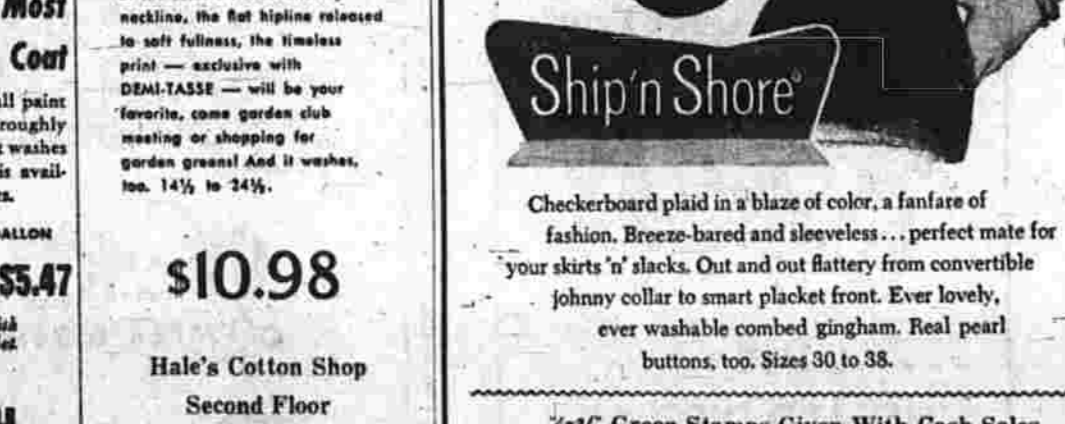
