Rockville Zoning Commission to Mull New Fire District Rulings

Rockville, June 23 (Special)—When the jurors were excused, a public hearing will be held by the Zoning Commission of the Vernon Fire District tomorrow at 8 p.m. at the Vernon Center Church in connection with proposed changes in zoning regulations.

It is planned to have two zones in the Vernon Fire District: a rural-residential area called Zone A and a commercial-industrial area called Zone B.

The zoning regulations are being revised to include a strip of land 200 feet deep on each side of Route 201 starting at the rotary northeast to the State Police for a distance of about 1/2 mile.

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Only Four Cases On Court Docket

Rockville, June 23 (Special)—Four cases were disposed of in what was termed this morning one of the shortest sessions ever held in City Court. Judge Robert A. Pagon presided.

The disposition: Frederick A. Robinson, 26, of Harrison, R. 
