He also said that policy on a Michigan shovel, taken out in May, 1950, was not cancelled when that shovel was destroyed in the fire house behind the Springfield mill about September 1.

Lappen said that when all operations are moved here about 500 more will be employed. He added that more might be hired later, because he expects the company's television department will speed up production as new machinery is installed.

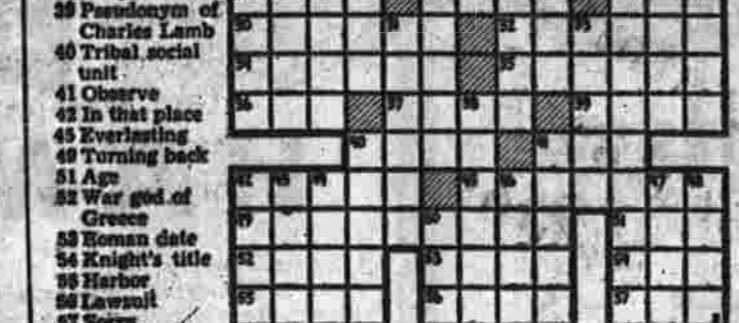

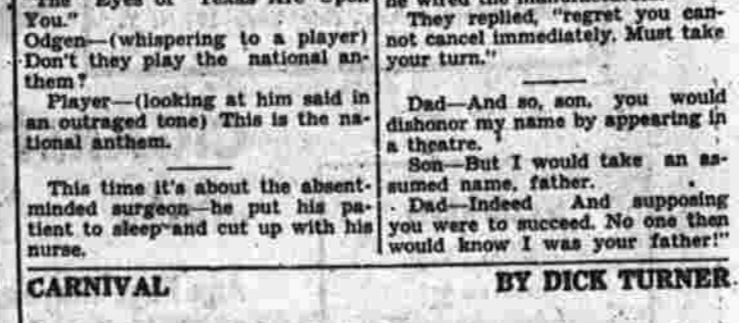

We investigated the procedures and practices with respect to ex-

penditures, including payroll, and made full inspection of paid vouchers for at least one month of each fiscal period being covered.

In this connection we also inquired into the purchase and receipt of materials and supplies and the issuance thereof and the inventory handling.

Numerous general ledger accounts were analyzed and inquiry made into matters relating to the department under review in four of the purposes of the examination.

Inquiry was made as to the procedure for making water and sewer assessments.

The report turned over to General Manager Edward J. Respage, last night, was made public today afternoon, when the Board of Directors met in its regular session.

The directors met July 15 with the auditor to discuss their findings.

The auditor's report, which resulted in the commissioning of the Hartford accounting firm to do the department's audit, was made up to the Board of Directors last night, when it was decided to refer the report to another body, the cash committee, to study the report.

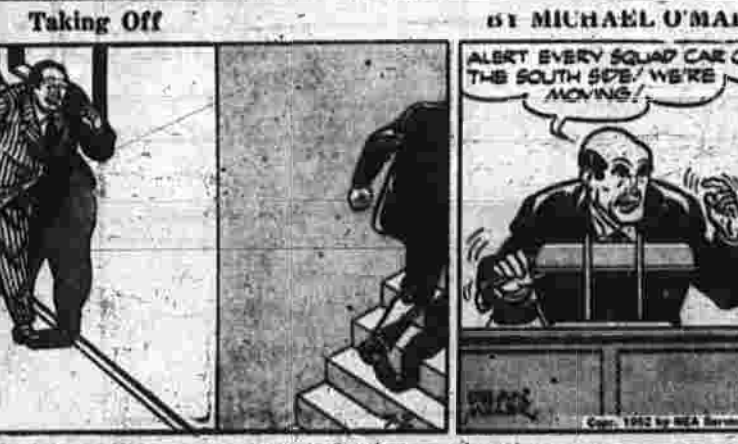
