Korea Truce Talks Began Year Ago-End Not in Sight

Munma, Korea, July 8—(AP)—One year ago today Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway stood on a dusty helicopter field here and waved goodbye to five men who flew to Redmond Mass. to seek peace for Korea. The papers that make up the historical record of the truce talks now stand seven feet high. Dog tags have come and gone. The original five remain: Gen. James H. Dorn, Gen. William H. Tunnicliffe, Gen. Douglas M. MacArthur, Gen. Mark Clark, and Gen. James H. Dorn. The delegates have worked nearly 800 hours at the Kaesong and Panmunjom conference tables. The shortest session was 15 seconds on April 14. The longest was seven hours and 20 minutes on May 26 when staff officers drew the proposed cease fire line. The negotiators now have agreed on the complete armistice document—except for one monetary issue. That is how to exchange the prisoners. For some 200 hours, the debaters have tried to figure out how to satisfy each side on this sensitive question. The Reds want their men back—forcibly if necessary. The Allies say they will return only those who want to return. The easiest item to settle in principle on the truce agenda was the last one. It took only five hours and 42 minutes to decide to recommend holding a political conference within 90 days after the truce is signed. The politicians will decide whether to sign. —Allied and Chinese—should get

the courtroom at the outset after the prosecution had presented its evidence, "highly secret" evidence. Marshall has pleaded official secrets to prevent the Soviet Embassy from obtaining the information. He has also pleaded that he was acting as a courier for the Soviet Union.

Marshall was arrested by British Secret Service agents in London last September. He was held for several weeks before being released because of diplomatic immunity. The Russian diplomat was then taken to a secret meeting with Marshall. The prosecutor said the information allegedly passed to Marshall is of the highest security.

The youth also faces two other charges—of acquiring information to which he has no right and another of having "recorded" confidential information.

Sir Reginald told the court that "while every 'copy' of the information is a potential source, within the meaning of the Official Secrets Act of 1911, under which Marshall is being tried."

Met Three Times  
Sir Reginald said Marshall met Kuznetsov at least three times between April 25 and June 13, 1952, the day of his arrest and gave information he obtained while working in the diplomatic mission at Hanau.

He said Marshall had lunch with Kuznetsov on April 25, sat with him on a bench on the banks of the Rhine river for nearly two hours and departed looking "very worried and nervous."

"The only possible information such a Russian could have obtained from Marshall while at Hanau had no right to give him," the prosecutor argued.

He said Marshall drew papers from an inside pocket, laid them out on the table and invited Kuznetsov to give an explanation of their contents while the Soviet diplomat looked on.

Whenever anyone approached, said Sir Reginald, Marshall removed the papers and folded them up.

Sir Reginald told of other meetings of the pair in a London doorway and in the "George" pub when Marshall was arrested June 13.

Kuznetsov "made a curious and significant reply" when the prosecutor asked, "What did you do with the papers?"

Sir Reginald said a search of Marshall's clothing revealed a document of "information" used at Hanau.

### Polio 'Season' Is Coming, Here Is Advice of Experts

Again Connecticut faces the approach of the poliovirus "season" and again the problem of how best to protect the public is being discussed.

Keep Dry, Warm  
Keep clean. Wash hands carefully before eating and after using the toilet. Keep food clean and covered from insects. Burn or bury garbage not tightly covered. Since the virus has been found in nose, mouth and bowel discharges, and on flies, general hygienic measures are necessary in this as in other diseases.

Polio nose and throat operations during the poliovirus season. A severe form of poliovirus sometimes follows operations on the nose and throat. Polio routine immunizations against whooping cough, diphtheria and tetanus in children six months of age and older if poliovirus is prevalent. Routine immunizations should therefore be given as usual to infants who are less than six months of age.

Parents should be alert to early signs of illness or changes in the normal state of health of their children. A physician should be called at once if there are symptoms of headache, nausea, vomiting, muscle aches or stiffness during the next few days. Early and prompt treatment are important.

Above all, keep calm, health of official advice. Hysteria never prevented or cured a case of polio.

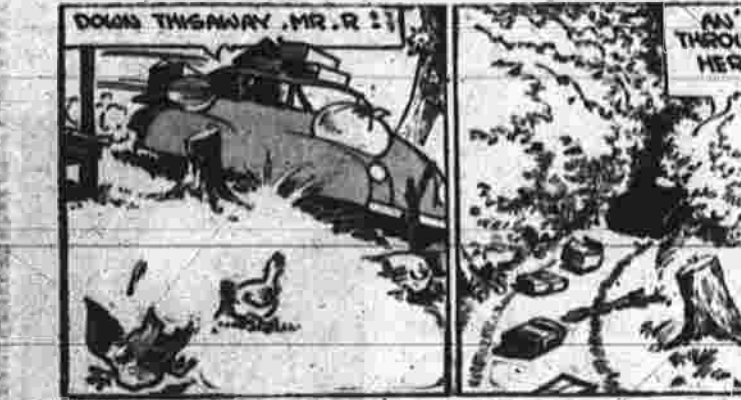

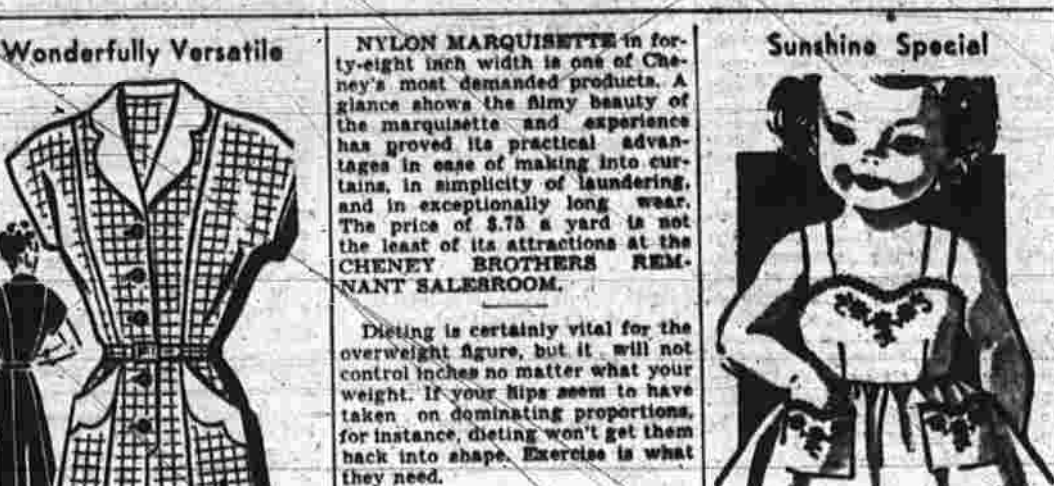
