The Pope's letter—dated July 2, 1952, text of the Holy Scriptures and the Gospels—was made public by the Vatican's press office today and printed in L'Osservatore Romano.

The letter, entitled from its first Latin words "Sacro vergerie anno," while the Holy year (1950) was in progress, was a pastoral exhortation by the Catholic church for renewal of religion in Russia.

## Eddie Yost Spoils Trucks' Bid for No-Hitter

### Broad Jump Mark Shattered Today

Helsinki, July 22.—(AP)—Another Olympic record fell today as the fourth day of track and field competition began in the big Olympic stadium with qualifying trials in three events.

The women's broad jump mark of 5.99 meters (19 feet 8.2 inches) was shattered by a mass assault and was smashed by four girls, one an American, within a short time.

Yvette Williams of New Zealand, got off the best jump of the early trials, clearing 6.15 meters (20 feet 2.2 inches), nearly two feet beyond the old Olympic standard, established in 1948 by Olga Gyarmati of Hungary. The women's broad jump was added to the Olympic program for the 1948 games in London.

Eight behind Miss Williams in the qualifying for this afternoon's final came Mabel Landry of Chicago with a jump of 5.99 meters (19 feet 8.2 inches), held by another American, and Nils Dierckx of the Netherlands. Records have been broken as follows:

Men's 100 meter dash: Eddie Yost of Washington Senators, 1:11.87. Yost's throw was a record of 56.62 meters (185 feet 9.5 inches). Connolly, who finished second, also bettered the previous record which he set at London four years ago.

Bob Richards of Leavenworth, Kan., raised the pole vault record to within a fraction of 15 feet when he cleared 4.55 meters.

And Herbert Schade, six-foot-five, less runner from West Germany, chopped three full seconds off the 2,000 meter record when he won his final in 14:15.4.
