original policy of unleashing a new war. "For those purposes," the newspaper continued, "the war-mongers put into circulation by their false gossamer lies, deceit and shameless vaunts as enemies of peace and the security of Peoples' Prays asserted the poster was based on real facts—"In all these years, uninvited guests were given a needed lesson. It serves as one more warning to the U. S. that the Soviet people will not tolerate the inviolability of Soviet borders."

"The Soviet people liked the poster," it added, "because 'by example' they saw that the U. S. showed how 'Soviet border guards' they shot their sacred duty in Germany."

The State Department in Washington said last week Kennan had told the Russians the posters were an admission that Soviet officers deliberately attacked the American position. Kennan had stated that charge in the past.

Two of the three incidents depicted on the posters involved heavy planes, each with 10 men on board. The planes were shot down by Russian fighters over the Korean peninsula. ment with the "Big Six" companies. It now is negotiating a complete contract. Negotiation sessions are underway with U. S. Steel and other firms which supply raw materials. The agreement will include a new rate procedure for buying raw materials. There was no report of progress from yesterday's first meeting with U. S. Steel and it was indicated the negotiations may be lengthy.

Meanwhile, the union is negotiating with some firms which thus far have not gone along with the agreement which ended the 55-day strike against the big producers. Among them are Algonquin Luminum Steel Corp. which has plants in Brockton and Leominster, Mass., and Dunstable and Waterville, N. Y.

In addition to some 10,000 Allied Luminum employees who are on strike, about 15,000 employed by Wheeling, (W. Va.) remain on strike. The union of the steel industry's big three producers—General Motors, Chrysler and Ford—announced plans for stepping up logging production.

Chrysler said it will retool its factories next week and hopes to have 60,000 employees—most of it personnel in the factories—the following week.
