Marines Smash 4th Red Assault on Hill

Seoul, Korea, Aug. 14.—(AP)—U. S. Marines beat back four Communist assaults Wednesday night and today to retain their newly-won hold on Bunker Hill in western Korea.

The battalion-size Red assaults were the third and fourth in a series of attacks on the hill since Tuesday by the Communists.

A UN briefing officer said Communist casualties were heavy. By mid-day, he said, dead enemy soldiers lay scattered in groups on the steep slopes of the hill, only four miles east of Panmunjom, the truce talks site.

Over 500 Reds Killed Maj. Gen. John Selden, commander of the U. S. First Marine Division, estimated "well over 500" Reds have been killed in four days of fighting on Bunker Hill.

Soul, Korea, Aug. 15—(AP)—American Marines twice today crushed Chinese Communist attacks on Bunker Hill in the latest of a series of western front battles which the corps said has cost the Reds 3,014 in dead and wounded since Saturday. United Nations fighter bombers strafed and blasted Red positions with bombs, rockets and machine guns. The 200 Chinese who tried to advance on the battle-scarred hill were killed or captured. A briefing officer estimated 200 Reds were killed in the one-hour battle, the sixth full Communist attempt to recapture Bunker Hill. Before dawn today, Marines repulsed a 400-man force which launched a sneak attack on the hill from two directions.

Stalin Hails Red Korea War Effort
Moscow, Aug. 15—(AP)—All Moscow newspapers today gave front page display to a message of Prime Minister Stalin to North Korean Premier Kim Il Sung expressing strong support of "The Korean People's Democratic Republic." The occasion was the World War II liberation of Korea from Japan. At the same time Pravda, a official newspaper of the Soviet Union, praised the "brave and peaceful settlement of the Korean problem." It also said the North Koreans were "unwavering in their unanimous struggle to defend the independence of their country and save their nation from the yoke of enslavement by American imperialism."

Truman Bi-Partisan Aid Draws Republican Blast
Washington, Aug. 15—(AP)—President Truman's fresh endorsement of bi-partisan aid to Korea drew a sharp Republican attack today. The President's endorsement was a call by Sen. Styles Bridges today for vigorous Republican campaigning on international issues. Bridges, the GOP Senate leader, said Republicans would not share responsibility for foreign policy decisions and hope to eliminate the issue from the campaign. "It is common to say that foreign policy should be kept out of the campaign," the New Hampshire Senator said. "It is entwined with every important domestic issue that the American people have a right to discuss and know that their foreign policy is being made in a bi-partisan way."

Egypt Imposes Censorship on Outgoing News
Cairo, Egypt, Aug. 15—(AP)—Egypt's new government imposed censorship on all outgoing news stories today after only a few days of free reporting. Premier Aly Maher had granted newsmen freedom from the strict Egyptian laws on news stories. Censorship had been imposed by King Farouk's regime, particularly to stifle criticism of the royal family. "The new government has imposed a complete censorship, even on the news," said a source. "The former censor, said yesterday that censorship would not be reimposed."

Russia Hits Sour Note In Hate U. S. Campaign
