

Municipal Bond Man Slated For Discussion on Funds

General Manager Aims To Dispel Myths Regarding Borrowing

General Manager Richard Martin is in an effort to dispel what he feels town officials and the general public regard as the "conventional wisdom" involved in issuing bonds and borrowing money on a long-term basis, he said today in a letter to the Board of Directors meeting Tuesday night. The discussion will precede the regular meeting, getting underway in the hearing room of the Municipal Building at 7:30.

In a memorandum to the members of the board, Martin said he would be helpful in view of the town's annual borrowing on short-term notes in anticipation of taxes, the probability of having to issue new bonds before too long for the proposed high school, and the necessity of another year of refunding the half million dollar mortgage bond of the Water Department.

Martin hopes that the "public opinion" which has developed in the past few years, and which he feels is a hindrance to the town's financial progress, will be dispelled by his discussion.

Reds Miss In 7th Try To Win Hill

Seoul, Korea, Aug. 16.—U. S. Marines battled Chinese Reds with flares and grenades in the pre-dawn darkness today in breaking up the seventh Red counter-attack against Bunker Hill on the Korean western front.

The Reds threw 400 men against the position in their latest desperate bid to regain the dome-shaped hill.

We were hit fighting and there were dozens of hand grenades flying around," one Marine sergeant related.

Four hundred Chinese charged to within 30 yards of Marine positions on the blood-soaked ridge before dawn, a U. S. Signal Army staff officer said.

Red artillery and mortars raked Allied positions in support of the attack.

Fresh Marines were rushed forward at the height of the battle. The Reds pulled back less than half hour later.

Later the Communists traded shots with the Marines for 10 minutes from a distance, but made no charge.

The seventh Communist assault on the hill started early Tuesday by the Reds. It was a top priority charge shortly after midnight.

First Communist casualties numbered 220 Red killed or wounded by the time the attack was repelled.

The Marines estimated Communist losses during the week of bloody fighting near Panmunjom, site of the Korean armistice talks, at 3,735 killed or wounded.

Eisenhower on the front it was relatively quiet.

Civilians warned United Nations turned a Red supply train at Chingwa, 100 miles from the front.

Civilians had been warned by Radio Seoul to evacuate the capital of Pyongyang.

Five U. S. jets and six Soviet bombers were shot down during the week.
