Six Americans Are Assaulted By Iran Reds

(Continued from Page One) street near the Soviet embassy, was struck by the cabbage. The final incident occurred when Master Sgt. Masie Page and Pvt. Stephen I. Langille, riding in an Army truck, were stoned by three persons standing on a sidewalk. Maj. Gen. Wayne Zimmerman, head of the U. S. military mission, said routine measures were being taken to keep Army personnel out of the congested areas and other places where they would be conspicuous. There also were unconfirmed reports that American soldiers had been ordered to "make themselves as scarce as possible" around Tehran so as not to be targets for letists who apparently were working on a definite plan to make it hot for Americans here. There were growing indications that martial law, lifted only last week, would be reimposed shortly. Europe Called The government was forced to call out troops last night to quell Communist youths, wielding knives and rocks, who battled police and soldiers in the center of the city. Two policemen and one soldier were wounded in the skirmish before the rioters fled under a tear gas attack. It was the first time troops had been used since martial law was lifted. The battle climaxed a series of nightly clashes between the Reds and members of Premier Mohammad Mossadegh's nationalist front. So did the farmer writing his neighbor a receipt for grain, and the merchant dictating his last will and testament. Their Greek was quite different from that of Plato and Aristotle.

It's not surprising that their Greek was also used by Paul and the Gospel writers. For certainly the teachings of Jesus were concerned with the behavior of men and women in the market place, toward their neighbors, in their homes, at their places of worship. For hundreds of years, however, Bible translators did not recognize the humble character of New Testament Greek. They tried to apply the classical Greek rules of grammar, word order and idiom. It was not until the dawn of the 19th Century that archeologists digging into lost of ancient papyrus uncovered startling evidence that changed their whole outlook. Research revealed the truth—that the everyday "people's" Greek was the same as that which Paul and the Gospel writers used, and based largely on archeological findings during the past 50 years, has resulted in clearer or more accurate translation of certain Old Testament passages.

The first translation of the Bible to feel the effect of all this recent research is the forthcoming "New Standard Version of the Holy Bible," authorized by some 40 Protestant denominations. Its scholars had archeological discoveries and manuscript resources, such as no group ever had before, to help them discover age-old shades of meaning in the original Hebrew and Greek.

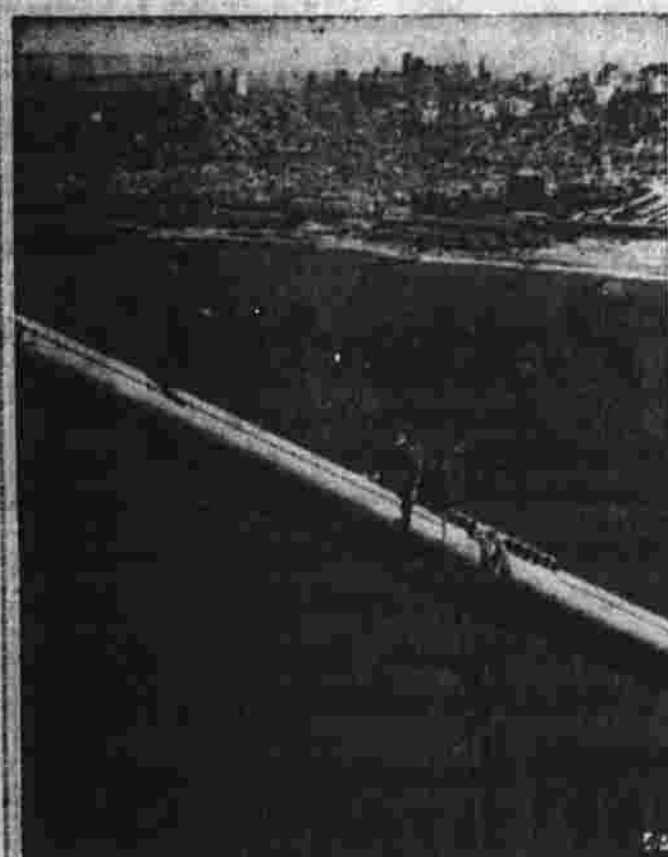

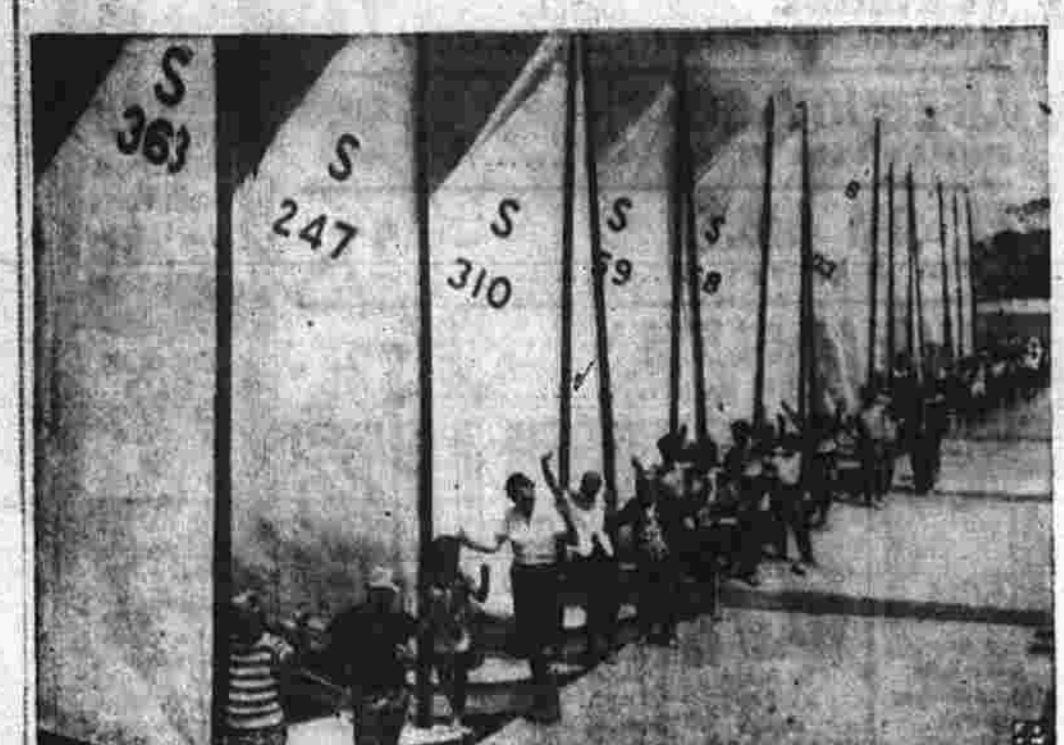

## Manville Fails To Set Record In Marriages

New York, Aug. 20.—(AP)—Manville, sporting a blonde who says she will be Mrs. Manville No. 10, may not have a record on wives—few suitors have beaten him.  
He may not have a record for the amount of money he has spent on divorce either. Some wealthy Americans have put out more on one divorce settlement than Tom Sawyer has on all his divorces put together.  
Just the 34-year-old substance probably has put out more cash for less wedded bliss than any wealthy playboy in recent generations.  
Manville's first marriage to Florence Huber was his longest. It lasted from 1911 to 1917 and it is not known just how much she got when she divorced him.

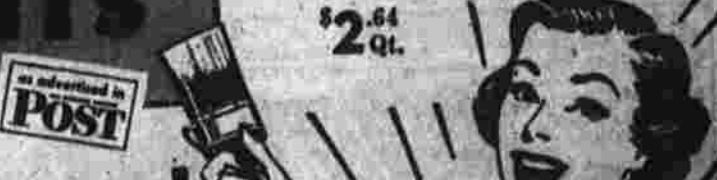

### New Bible Modernizes English of 17th Century

By FRANCES DUNLAP HERON  
New York—(NEA)—The Egyptian housewife of A.D. 100 wrote down a new bread recipe in simple, everyday Greek words. So did the farmer writing his neighbor a receipt for grain, and the merchant dictating his last will and testament. Their Greek was quite different from that of Plato and Socrates.

It's not surprising that their Greek was also used by Paul and the Gospel writers. For certainly the teachings of Jesus were concerned with the behavior of men and women in the market place, toward their neighbors, in their homes, at the place of worship.

For hundreds of years, however, Bible translators did not recognize the humble character of New Testament Greek. They tried to apply the classical Greek of Plato, Aristotle, and the philosophers of the 4th century B.C. to the everyday "people's" Greek.

Research revealed the truth—that the everyday "people's" Greek was the same as that which Paul and the Gospel writers used.

The first revision of the Bible in the English language, the "Living Bible," was the result of research in the field of New Testament Greek. It was the work of a team of scholars who had archaeological discoveries, such as no group ever had before, to help them discover the original meaning of the Bible.

That was one part of their task. The other was to replace more than 200 English words in the King James version that have changed meaning completely.

The new knowledge of Greek naturally colors the whole of the Revised Standard Version (RSV) of the New Testament. At many points new insights contrast with those of the King James Version.

Thinking to the average reader, the replacement of more than 200 words that have changed meaning since 1611, if there were no other reason for the revision of the King James than that, it would be sufficient.

Consider some of the significant transformations of meaning that come from bringing it up-to-date. There's the psalmist chanting in Ps. 119:147 (KJ), "I prevented the dawning of the morning, and

Rephrasing that verse accordingly, the revision committee now gives us in RSV: "I rise before the dawn and cry for help."

"In thy words I do hope."

Now the picture is clear—the psalmist getting up early to begin the day with meditation and prayer.

The words "thought," "carefulness" and "careful" in the 17th Century were all sound translations of the Greek word for "anxiety."

When Jesus, therefore, advised "take no thought for the morrow" (Matt. 6:24 KJ), he was not advising a happy-go-lucky attitude. Instead, as RSV translates, "Do not be anxious about tomorrow."

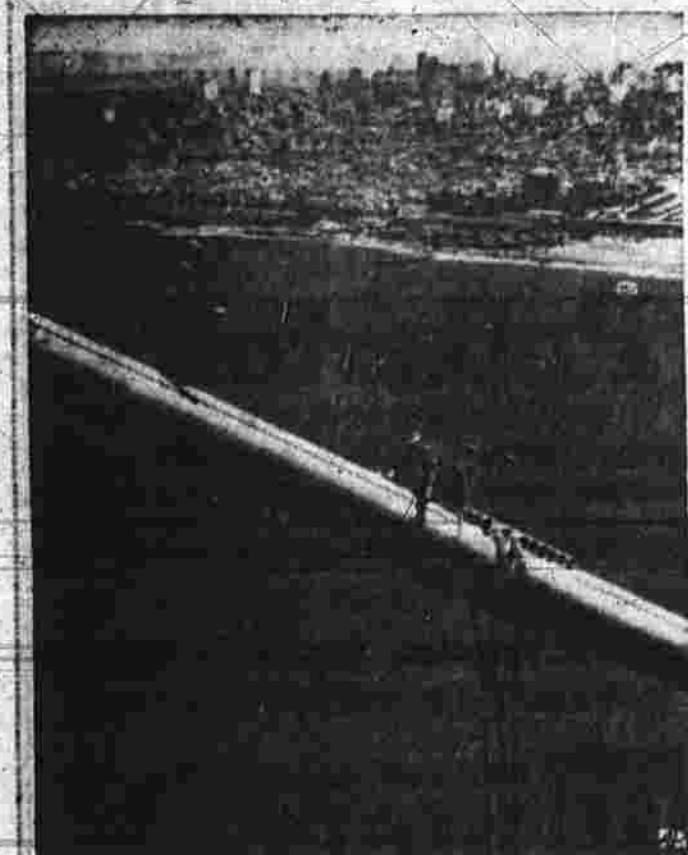

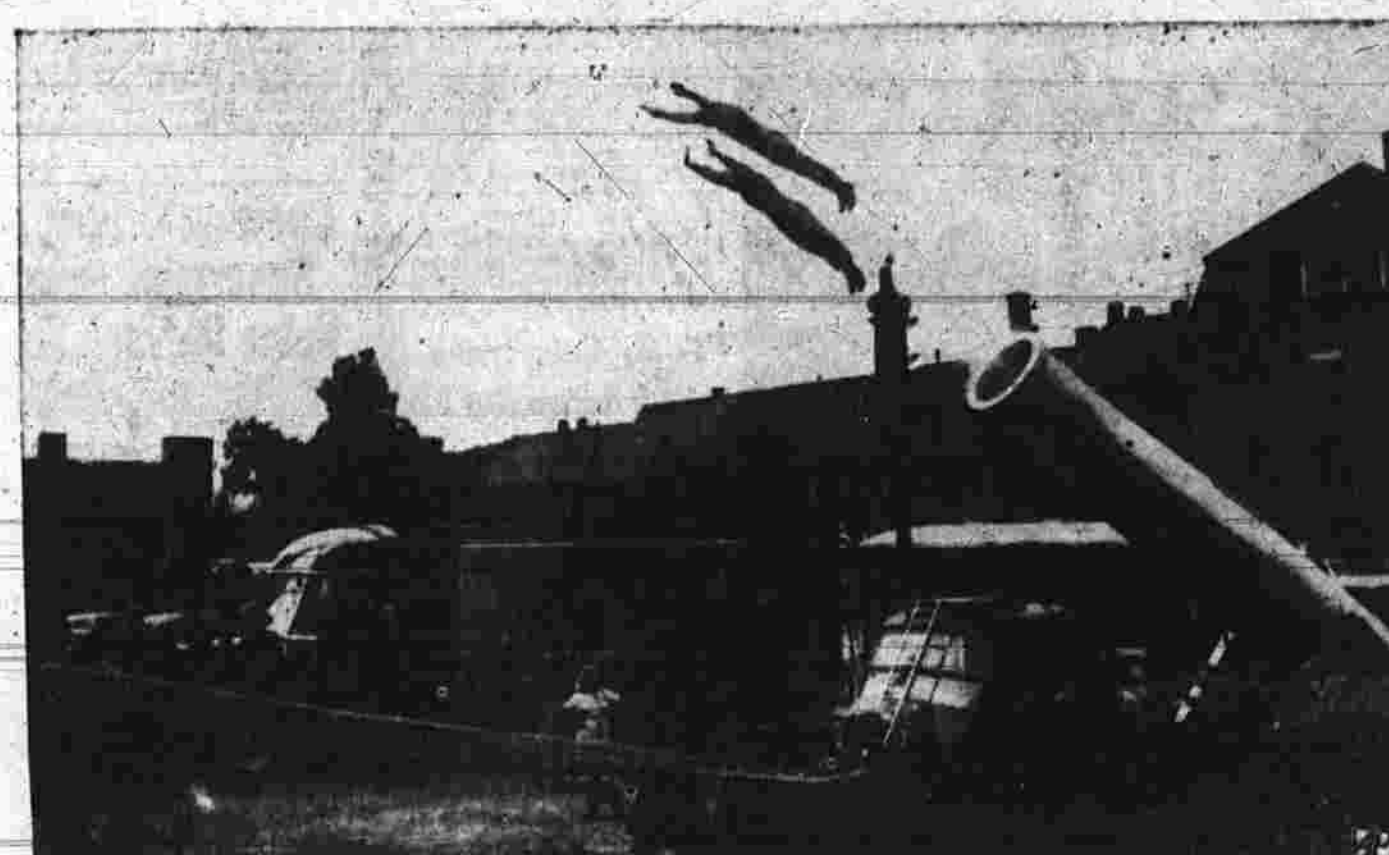

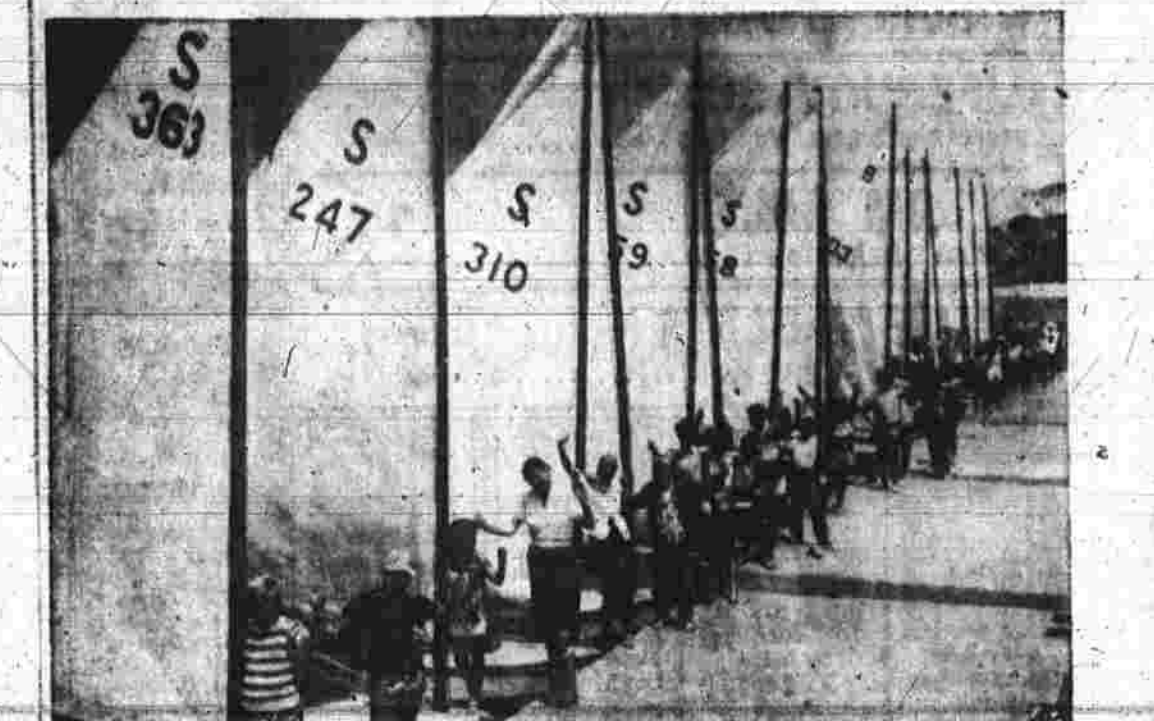

No lie or curse is too low for the Kremlin's use in this Hate America campaign. "Who is merely suspected of seeking truth in his capitalistic world gets liquidated," "executed," "plains."

## Manville Fails To Set Record In Marriages

By HENRIETTA LEVY, New York, Aug. 20.—(P)—Tommy Manville, acquiring a blonde who says she will be Mrs. Manville, may not have a record on wives—a few suitors have beaten him.

He may not have a record for the amount of money he has spent on divorce, either. Some wealthy Americans have put out more on one divorce settlement than Tommy has on all his divorces put together.

But the 55-year-old asbestos heir probably has put out more cash for playboy in recent generations.

Manville's first marriage to Patricia, girl Florence Huber was his longest. It lasted from 1913 to 1917 and it is not known just how much she got when she divorced him.

From then on the marriages grew shorter and Manville's complaints about the cost became more public.

Here is a tabulation, based on partial information from "Manville himself" and from the records:

No. 1—Lola McCoin, married him in 1923. Left him after three months. Divorced him in 1924, receiving \$1,000 a month for life. Manville paid in 1941 she had a baby, getting a reported \$50,000 cash settlement.

No. 2—Marcella Edwards, married in 1925. Divorced in 1927 after a long period of wandering that cost Manville \$5,000 to one lawyer, \$100,000 to another, and reportedly \$200,000 to Marcella.

No. 4—Wilhelmina Bone, married him Oct. 11, 1942. Lived with him two months; divorced him Feb. 10, 1943, getting \$2,500 expenses to go Reno and reportedly by retaining Alimony.

No. 5—Mae Marie, "Sunny" Almonzo, married Aug. 23, 1943. Lived with him seven hours and 45 minutes with Manville before he abandoned her at 22 Moore with a scratched face and without Sunny; Divorced Oct. 13, 1943, getting a check for \$18,000.

No. 6—Georgina Campbell, married

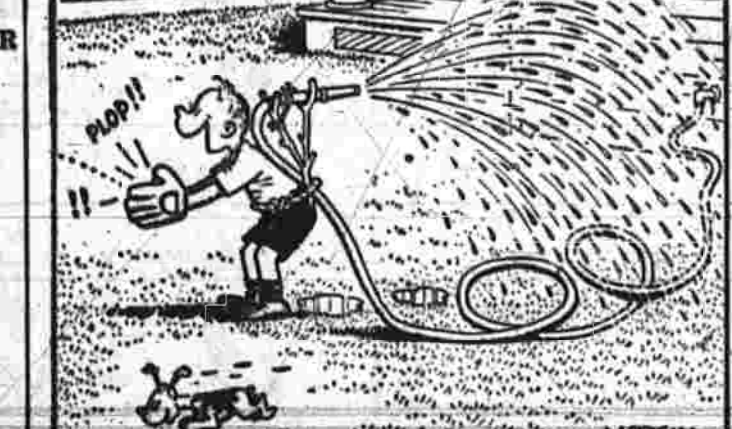
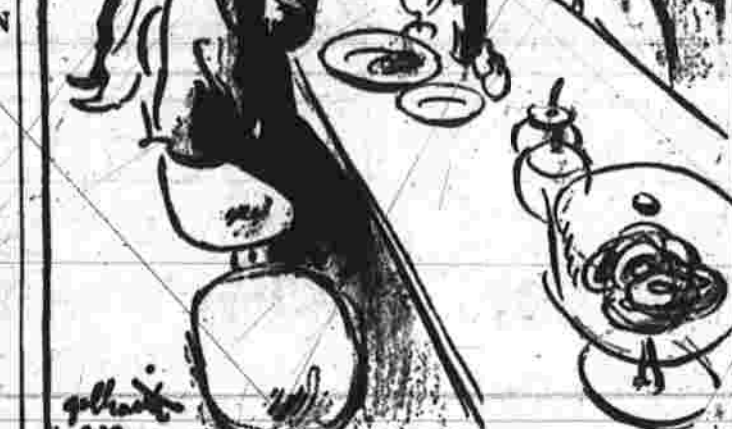
