One might judge that if he could not bring himself to utter the Dulles words, he should never have allowed them to be included in his text in the first place. He should have honored his own instincts all the way through.

The sensational part of the Eisenhower prepared text read as follows:

"Third, our Government, and for all, with cold finality, must tell the Kremlin that we shall never recognize the slightest pretensions to Russia's position in Eastern Europe and Asia. The day must come when the peoples of the enslaved lands will have the opportunity, in the fullness of freedom and in the light of international scrutiny, to choose their own paths into the future. More than that, we must tell the Soviets with an equally cold finality that never shall we consent until the tidal mass of aggressive Communism has receded within its own borders."

In this message, Eisenhower adopted as his own a curious line of John Foster Dulles has been following since his own resignation from the State Department. It is a curious line because Dulles has been preaching it as a road to peace, and because laymen cannot understand how we could follow that line without undertaking war against Russia ourselves.

Mr. Dulles himself has never succeeded in making it clear how we would carry out such a pledge by means about as effective as an offensive war of liberation.

As this Dulles position appeared in the Eisenhower text, it again seemed to offer one choice—that of inevitable war. If delivered it would have represented the strongest, most sensational statement any individual of prominence has ever made in the western world about Russia. It was like a declaration of war, meeting in the midst of a speech in which Eisenhower promised peace.

Only Eisenhower didn't, in the end, deliver the Dulles paragraph. What he actually said was this: "We can never rest—and we must not rest—until all the world, including the Kremlin—that until the enslaved nations of the world have in the fullness of freedom the right to choose their own path, that then, and then only, can we say that there is a possible way of living peacefully and permanently with Communism in the world."

It is to be pointed out that the "cold finality" of warning, used twice in the original text, is missing, that the phrase "tidal mass of aggressive Communism" has been eliminated, that there is no direct declaration that Russia must "recede within its own borders" and that there is no longer the statement that "we shall never recognize the slightest pretensions in Russia's position in Eastern Europe and Asia." Finally, in the Eisenhower version, there is the addition of the thought and hope of "living peacefully and permanently with Communism in the world," a very far cry from the seemingly irrevocable Dulles declaration of future war.

How nonsensical the original Dulles declaration really was can be judged if we ask what Russian position in Asia is either legally or morally subject to any restriction by us. Where can we put our finger on Russia in Asia in any spot where we do not concede her complete equality?

We can certainly finger the spots in Europe where we would like to drive Communism out. But are we ever going to dedicate ourselves to the task of driving Russia out by the use of military force? The answer is that we are not, and our effort, really, will be limited to encouraging and applauding any new Tito who develops, to trying to make our own way of life so dynamic it is a magnet, to trying to make peace and freedom contagious.

Indeed we won't be happy, and reconciled to peaceful coexistence with Russia, until we see the Russian domination of other countries recede, or alter itself for the better. But in any of which we cannot make it clear that he is not declaring war. Eisenhower does make it clear he is not declaring war.

Unfortunately, it was the Dulles position which, in the early years of the present text, was the trend of the world, creating sensational headlines in European circles, and gave alarm here at home.

But the moral is clear: not even John Foster Dulles is as fit to advise Eisenhower as is Eisenhower himself. Dulles is the supposed "statesman." Eisenhower has the statesmanship. Dulles is the supposed "expert." He is exactly the kind of expert who has led the world into its present mess.

Yes, be yourself! Nobody else!

**Like Be Yourself!**

The best advice to Eisenhower is that he be himself.

The best expert he can consult on the problems he is solving in the course of his campaign is a man named Dwight D. Eisenhower.

It is going to take a struggle of heroic proportions for Eisenhower himself to realize these things and to adhere to them. For so candidate in modern history has been subjected to more violent and insistent pressures, which seek to shift him this way and that. Some of these pressures are from his erstwhile political enemies, demanding that he shout louder and grow more violent. Some of them are from his timid friends—the same people, probably, who were conceding his defeat before the New Hampshire primary.

And, some of these pressures come from men whom he has every reason to respect—every reason, at least, save one. In the last analysis, he himself has more common sense and more real intelligence than the best of those who, at his own request, come to advise him.

His own instincts are the surest guides he will find in devising strategy for this campaign. His own ideas are better than any he can borrow from so-called experts.

For him to realize this, and follow it out, demands some immediate action on his part. If so, it is time he developed it. For the people of this country want Eisenhower—not anything else. He was nothing else but Eisenhower when they nominated him, although it is true that all kinds of experts advised him that he could never get the nomination just by being Eisenhower. The truth is that he himself is good enough to be intelligent enough, was enough to derive his own campaign approach. What he himself thinks and feels, instinctively, from his own knowledge and experience, form the best campaign stand he can possibly take.

If he has some inferiority complex, before the acknowledged "experts" who crowd around him on the theory that he is "new" at this political business, he should discard that inferiority complex. The people want something new. They do not want political experience.

We are moved to these comments by what happened on the day of Eisenhower's appearance before the American Legion. Eisenhower started that day saying that he would not be elected, but John Foster Dulles, certainly one of the most respected and eminent advisers at his disposal.

This news that Eisenhower was John Foster Dulles went out to the press of the nation, and to our friends in Europe, and to Moscow. He was John Foster Dulles in the crucial paragraph of the prepared text of his speech before the Legion, and that prepared text was released, by his campaign managers, hours before he delivered it, so that it could gain maximum coverage in the world press.

This device obtained maximum coverage for something Eisenhower did not say.

What happened was that, as he was faced with the actual moment of being John Foster Dulles, Eisenhower could not stomach it, and went back to being Eisenhower again.

He did it by discarding the John Foster Dulles words in his prepared text and substituting his own.

So doing, he discarded that section of his speech which had received headlines—shrieking headlines around the world.

right to choose their own path, that then and only then can we say that there is a possible way of living peacefully and permanently with Communism in the world."

In his text today, Dulles asserted the Soviet's traditional belief the "road to victory in the West" lay through Asia, particularly China, and that non-white people could not be treated as "second class" expanders. If the West wanted to survive in a free world, the chief architect of the Japanese position and present foreign policy involved "race discrimination on a global scale" by concentrating on the "predominantly white western world."

"That is a wrong policy and, in the face of the Soviet program of encirclement, it is a suicidal policy," he said. "It must be changed."

Dulles said the United States, by aiming for international war and concentrating on Western Europe, enabled Soviet propagandists to portray America as war-mongers interested only in defending white people.

"He said the non-white people did not want the United States to "protect them with gifts" but wanted a sense of moral equality.

"That," Dulles added, "is what, since 1945, our country has done. We have spent nearly 500 days on 19 trips to Europe to confer with Western European leaders. But during this period, no Secretary of State has not been in an Asian country."

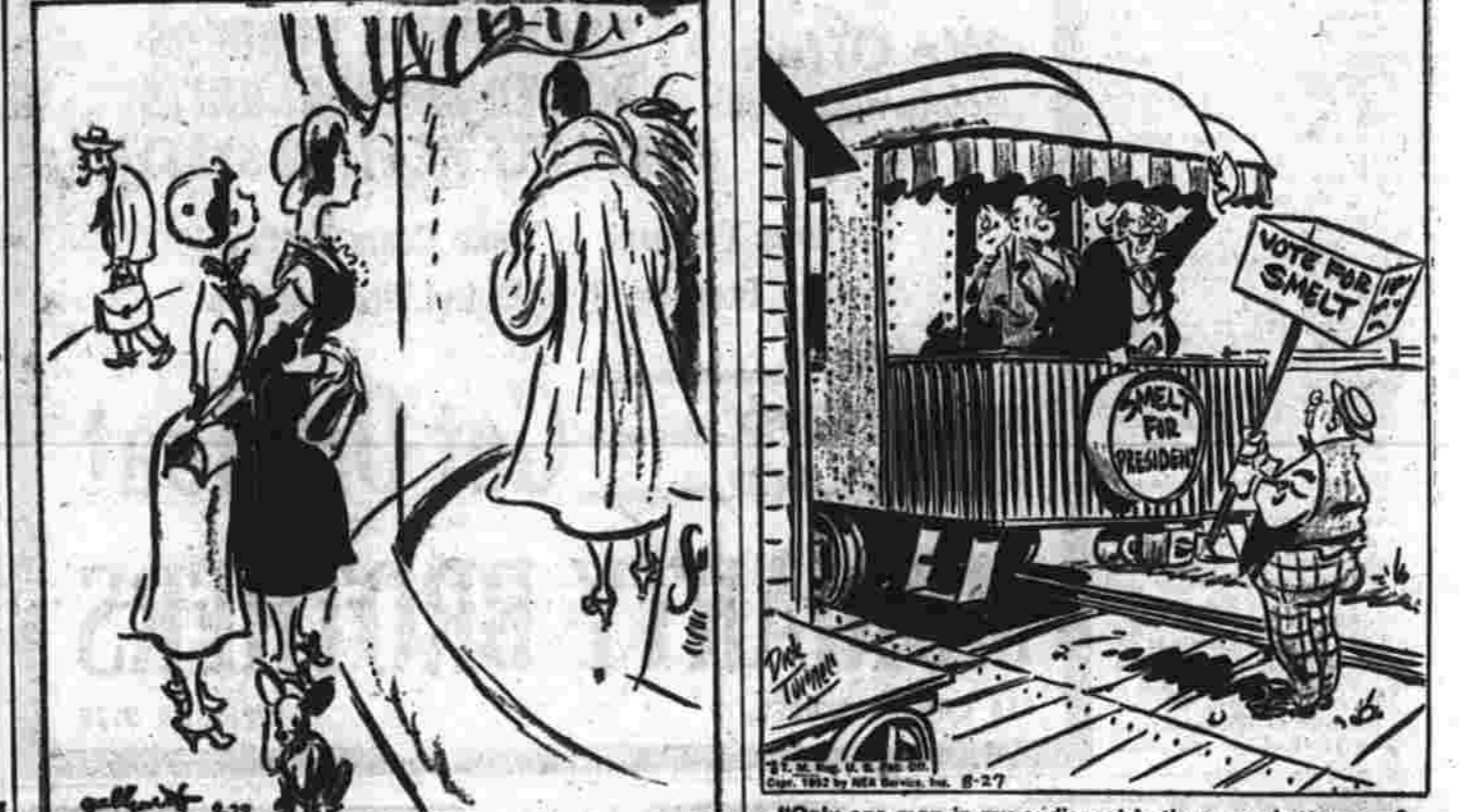

Some of them are from his timid friends—the same people, probably, who were counseling him to defect before the New Hampshire primary. And some of these pressures come from men whom he has every reason to respect—every reason, at least, save one. In the last analysis, he himself has more common sense and more real intelligence than the best of those who, at his own request, come to advise him. His own instincts are the soundest instincts he will find devising strategy for his campaign. His own ideas are better than any he can borrow from so-called experts. For him to realize this and follow it out, demands some measure of self-discipline. It is time he developed it. For the people of this country want Eisenhower—not anything else. He, so doing, discarded that section of his speech which had received headlines—startling headlines around the world.

One might judge that if he could not bring himself to utter the Dulles words, he should never have allowed them to be included in his text in the first place. He should have honored his own instincts all the way through. The sensational part of the Eisenhower prepared text read as follows: "Third, our Government, once and for all with cold finality, must tell the Kremlin that we shall never recognize the slightest permanence in Russia's position in Eastern Europe and Asia. The day must come when the peoples of the enslaved lands will have the opportunity, in the fullness of freedom and in the light of an internationally accepted, to choose their own paths into the future. More than that, we must tell the Soviets with an equally cold finality that never shall we rest content until the tidal mud of aggressive Communism has receded within its own borders." In this passage, Eisenhower adopted as his own a curious line of thought. First, he was suggesting that since his own resignation from the State Department, it is curious that he should be here preaching it as a road to peace, and because laymen cannot understand how we could follow that line without undertaking war against Russia ourselves. Mr. Dulles himself has never succeeded in making it clear how we would carry out such a pledge by methods short of an offensive war of liberation. As this Dulles position appeared in the Eisenhower text, it again seemed to offer only one choice—that of inevitable war. If delivered in the course of his campaign, the strongest, most sensational statement any individual of prominence has ever made in the western world about Russia. It was like a declaration of war, nesting in the middle of a speech in which Eisenhower promised peace. Only Eisenhower didn't, in the end, deliver the Dulles paragraph. What he actually said was this: "We can never rest—and we must so inform all the world, including the Kremlin—that until the enslaved nations of the world have in freedom the right to choose their own paths, that then, and then only, can we say that there is a possible way of living peacefully and permanently with Communism in the world." It is to be pointed that the "cold finality" of warning, used twice in the original text, is missing in the phrase "tidal mud of aggressive Communism" and that there is no longer the statement that "we shall never recognize the slightest permanence in Russia's position in Eastern Europe and Asia." charges made by several Republican leaders that the 1948 Democratic victory in the farm belt was gained by a trumped-up issue. These claims have been made by Gov. Dewey and Sen. George W. Brown of Vermont and John J. Williams of Delaware.

By mid-summer of 1948, it was quite apparent that bumper crops were being produced. Secretary Brannan's out with statements that there was a shortage of storage space for wheat, corn, and other grains. He said the government's price support program for the grains would not be effective because of a shortage of storage space.

Under the support program, farmers could get loans at the rate of support prices provided their grain was stored in acceptable facilities, either commercial or on the farm. This meant, Brannan said, that the farmer who could not get storage would have to accept whatever price he could get in the open market.

The Agriculture Department could have helped such farmers, the Secretary said, had it not been for the 80th Congress which deprived the government of authority to build, erect and own storage facilities.

The fact that the 80th Congress took away this storage authority, Brannan claimed, is proof that Republicans would give a chance, without delay, to any farm program.

At the time, the Republicans largely ignored the Brannan campaign.

However, Dewey, Alken and Williams have come forward this year with the claim that Brannan's deliberately took steps to cause farm prices to fall in 1948 with the hope of trying to fasten responsibility on the GOP for campaign purposes.

"They contend there is no evidence that there was an actual shortage of storage space that year. They say there are no reports of any unusual amounts of grain going to waste because of inadequate storage facilities."

The Republicans also contend that Brannan's talk of a storage shortage had the effect of depressing prices. They further claim that he failed to take other steps permitted him by law to halt price declines. They also charge that he delayed purchases of grain for overseas shipments until after the election. Such purchases, if made during the late summer and early fall, would have had the effect of bolstering prices, the Republicans contend.

Veterans Administration today advised all veterans to have photostatic or certified copies made of their original discharge or separation papers for use in applying for VA benefits.

Veterans with service since June 27, 1950—the start of the Korean conflict—should have these copies made immediately if they plan to attend school under the Korean GI Bill this fall.

Post-Korean veterans can avoid delay in receiving their education and training benefits if they have their report of separation (Form DD 214) papers, which are acceptable to VA, copied before the original is sent to the armed services for processing.

Mastering-out payments are handled by the individual services and not by VA.

For most VA administered benefits photostatic or certified copies of discharge or separation papers are acceptable. The exception is the VA-guaranteed GI loans must present their original discharge or separation papers which
