Hurricane Continues On Course

Miami, Fla., Sept. 3.—(AP)—Gusts of wind estimated at 140 miles per hour were reported today in the severe Atlantic hurricane swirling northward in open ocean 500 miles east of Miami.

The noon advisory said the tropical disturbance probably will continue the present course for the next 12 hours, "with possible intensification."

Forward pass was estimated by a hurricane hunting plane at 124 miles per hour. 112 MPH Winds in Center

It was estimated that the hurricane was 215 miles per hour or more—extended out 200 miles in the northern semi-circle.

The tropical 140 mile per hour gusts were located in the quadrant.

All shipping in the path of the hurricane—the second of the season—was told to get out of the way in a hurry.

The advisory pinpointed the center of the storm at 24.5 degrees north and longitude 67.5 west.

The hurricane was still following a course about parallel to the 24.5 degree north latitude and 67.5 west longitude.

Columbia Man to Appeal Term for Failure to Report for Induction

A two-year prison sentence has been meted out to a Columbia resident whose refusal to recognize Selective Service commitments brought him before a federal grand jury.

The term, handed down in Hartford Federal Court Monday, will be served by John Pekarski, 22, of Columbia, who was one of three members of Jehovah's Witnesses tried in June for failure to report for induction into the armed forces.

Raymond Donovan, of Naugatuck and Joseph Otter of Rockville were acquitted by Judge Joseph Smith on a technicality. Judge Smith maintained the pair had been denied the process of law by the Justice Department and Selective Service system when they were first classified.

Pekarski was found fit for non-combatant military service and legally classified. His failure to report for induction brought charges. Bond has been set at \$2,000 for Pekarski, pending the appeal of Smith's decision to a higher court.

Prohibition was not recommended because, according to the justice, Pekarski completely rejected civil authority.

The Columbia man told the court: "There comes a time when every man must decide whether his first obligation is to God or man. Although I have the greatest respect for this court, I cannot willingly accept its decision."
