The Keynote State

We Set On Their Hands

There is nothing unusual about this. It is the nature of the beast, the nature of the street corner, the nature of the herd, of business on main street, and of nations following nationalistic destinies. It is the routine game of checks and balances which has featured world life ever since the first two nations combined against the one tribe which was stronger than either. Yet the routine product of all such instances has, in the field of the life of nations, been war. That's the trouble with all this natural and instinctive behavior. The basic law involved is that Russia and China together are likely to seek, who recognize it from becoming stronger than both of them put together, and that we are likely to seek to prevent Russia and China together from growing stronger than we are. It is the basic law of the world which makes it so difficult to keep from killing each other.
