UN To Debate Korea
 We are now getting ready to do something we have hitherto refused to do—the possibilities of a solution of the Korean situation come into the jurisdiction of the United Nations.
 Until our change of mind, we had been insisting that the question of a solution of Korea belonged to the true trustees being conducted by the military in Korea. It was our policy to preserve the dignity of the United Nations by not allowing the military to be used as a tool for the purpose of a solution of Korea.
 Now we have not quite agreed to that, but we have indicated that we are preparing for a kind of a General Assembly debate on Korea which would amount to a preliminary negotiation between East and West. We are, for instance, aware of the fact that Mexico is already proposing one possible solution of the true fact situation, and we are not, in public, least, pouring any cold water on it.
 The Mexican proposal is that the United Nations should guarantee refuge and asylum to Korean refugees who do not want to go back to their own country.
 As for the reasons for our change of attitude, they can only be guessed at. Possibly we are propagandists who are not simply for the sake of the fact, but we are not to blame for that fact. Or it may be that we have finally come to the realization that the return of refugees, which denotes the truth (also, representation) of the Korean people, is a thing which we carried out in a haphazard way. We are now trying to do it in a more planned, consistent, principled effort in all the history of diplomacy.
 After the fact, contrary to our course, create two alternative policies. The first touch on makes the policy seem ordered and consistent, as if a group of master minds had not down many years ago and devised a program which has since been followed out to the letter. The second touch on makes the same policy appear as a well-considered, consistent enough, but treacherous.
 The truth lies in between, but not on either side. The truth about our foreign policy is that it has been one of open expediency, and that it has been one of hidden principle.
 Our policy in the world in this post-war era has been a policy of expediency. We have not had in Washington the best of the world's best, but we have specialized in playing a match game and a chess game. We have presented a fragment of this and a fragment of that. It has been a mixed-up policy.
 We have flouted the United Nations, openly and secretly, and then tried to appear as if we had honored the dignity of our nation. We have proclaimed our eagerness to help others, and then refused to help others in their need. We have proclaimed our dedication to the cause of freedom, and then backed reactionary dictators.
 And in all this, we have not governed only by the circumstances of the moment, but by a selfish sense of what would be easiest to do at one specific moment, by impulses which were never stated rather than fundamental and sound, in short—expediency has been our major policy.
 The Washington scheme, this expediency—is not the chief policy maker on the domestic scene.
