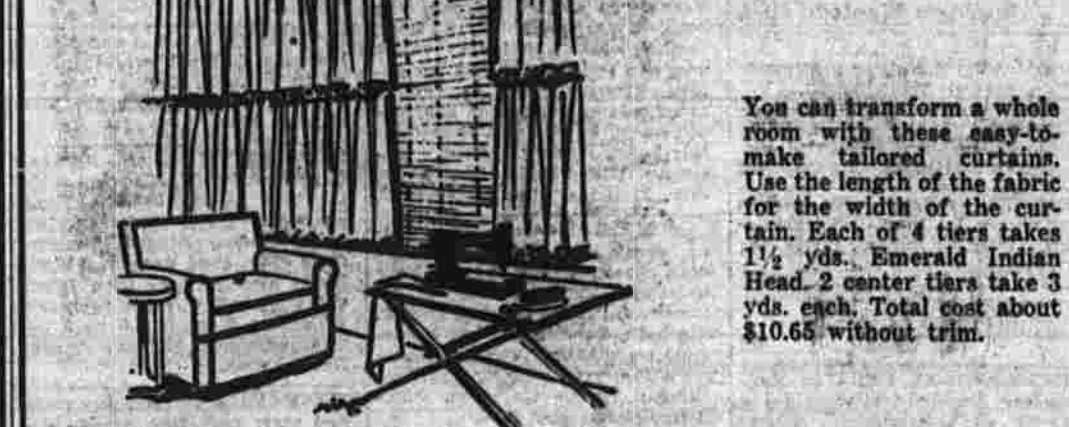
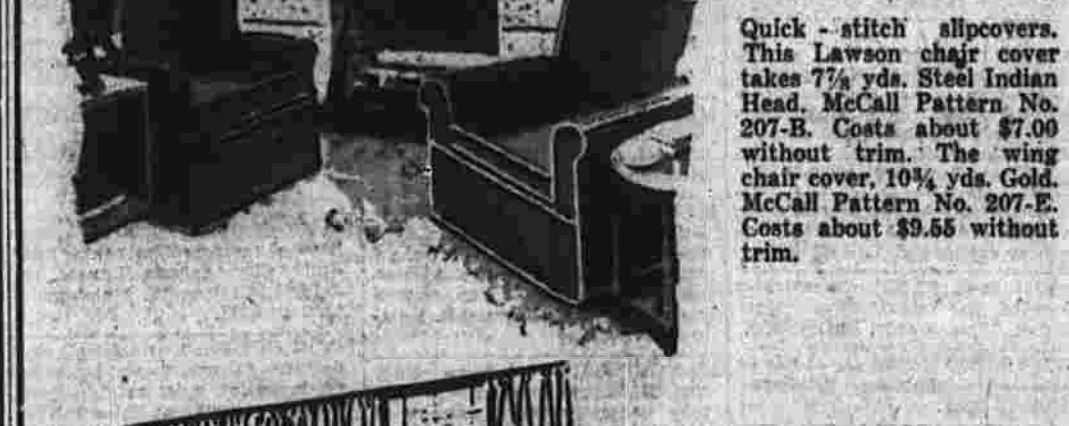

Suspension of Regulation X simply removed the Federal Reserve board as the limit-setter on housing credit.

The amount of down payment which will now be required depends upon banking regulations and business judgment. Treasury rules for national banks prohibit them from lending more than 90 per cent of the appraised value of a house as a first mortgage.

It is only rarely that private lenders, even though they are using their own money and not subject to banking or insurance company regulations, will lend more than two-thirds of the sale price of a house. Regulation X and the credit restrictions on government-backed housing were aimed at preventing home and commercial construction from becoming a laborious, inflationary and from eating up defense hardware.

The 1952 Defense Production act gave authority to the government to continue requiring down payments of at least five per cent even after it lifted Regulation X. But the Federal Reserve board suspended the regulation yesterday without any reference to the five per cent provision. A Federal Reserve source said the board did not feel that a five per cent requirement was realistic or useful since it felt that few lenders, if any, would arrange home sales for as little as five per cent down.

This pointed up the fact that suspension of Regulation X does not mean that the would-be home purchaser has only to select the house he wants and begin monthly payments, without putting up a sizable chunk of his own cash. Suspension of Regulation X simply removed the Federal Reserve board as the limit-setter on housing credit.

The amount of down payment which will now be required depends upon banking regulations and business judgment. Treasury rules for national banks prohibit them from lending more than 90 per cent of the appraised value of a house as a first mortgage.

Many state laws limit insurance companies to two-thirds of the appraised value. It is only rarely that private lenders, even though they are using their own money and not subject to banking or insurance company regulations, will lend more than two-thirds of the sale price of a house. Building and loan associations are usually empowered to lend up to 80 per cent of the appraised value of the property.

However, suspension of Regulation X gives the purchaser of a new property the opportunity to cut his down payment by arranging a second or perhaps even a third mortgage if his credit is good enough.
