Heed U. S. Warning Of Aerial Attacks
Seoul, Korea, Sept. 29.—(AP)—U. S. military officials are warning that North Korean targets are being headed by U. S. Information Service said today.

The USIS had learned from "a steady stream of information from civilian refugees, Communist newspapers and prisoners of war" that North Korean forces were planning a bombing by civilians in North Korea.

The government news service said Communist leaders try forcibly to keep North Koreans from fleeing to South Korea. Communist try to head the warnings and take them to their families and wanted to the area of legitimate military targets.

Radio broadcasts, leaflets and airplanes with loudspeakers carry the U. S. warnings to cities housing military targets before Allied planes attack.

Red Planes Show Slight Increase

Tokyo, Sept. 29.—(AP)—The chief of the Far East Forces said tonight the Chinese Communists have more planes than they have ever had before.

Gen. O. C. Weiland estimated the Reds have 2,500 planes, including 1,000 jet fighters and 1,500 bombers. He said the increase over all previous estimates was a slight increase.

Weiland said, however, that Red Air power strength is leveling off. Weiland said Chinese reconnaissance seems to be coming in from the Red Sea.

Weiland declared that Russia maintains an "air capability" on Sakhalin Island, which is within sight of Japan's northern island, Hokkaido.

"It is well known that there are modern fighter bases on Sakhalin."
