Former MHS Track Star Has Been in New Air Base in Thule as Surveyor for 3 Months

A former Manchester High School cross country captain, who was this town's first contribution to the new "Operation Blue Jay," the Defense Department's base at Thule, Greenland, Dick Howes, 39, captain of the 1951 varsity team, and coach Pete Wilcox, are in Thule as surveyors for three months, according to Howes.

Two weeks ago The Herald followed up the Defense Department's release on Thule with the announcement that Howes, a 10-year-old former-cable applicator for the Southern New England Telephone Company, had accepted a position to help install a communications system at Thule. Howes, who resides at 75 Linnwood drive, left Friday, Oct. 1, for Thule. It was this announcement that persuaded the Howes, who live at 132 Dewing street, to notify The Herald that Dick was leaving for that month, he was asked to go to Boston for an interview.

Leaves Soon

Waiting for his "greenies" from the president, Dick decided to be interviewed. He went to Boston July 11 and was accepted for the job as a surveyor and as a Greenland that week. The plane left Worcester Field near Boston field, Mass., and made stops at Goose Base in Labrador, Stansfeld from, in lower Greenland, and Thule.
