Churchmen Dispute on Use Of New Birth Control Pills

Washington, Oct. 10.—(AP)—A Boston doctor's report of successful use of birth control pills in hundreds of patients varying in age from prominent clergymen of the Roman Catholic and Methodist Churches.

"Dr. Benjamin Sieve reported in technical journals the 'science' yesterday that 288 married couples had experienced complete lack of fertility during periods ranging from three to 30 months, including the pills at breakfast, lunch and dinner—and that some are still taking them.

But the Boston researcher emphasized that the drug—prevented used to control bleeding—does not produce permanent sterility. He pointed out that the pills are for women who have had a baby or have become pregnant after they and their husbands quit taking the pills.

Charges Violation

The Rev. Francis J. Connell, a Redemptorist priest and dean of Sacred Theology, was asked to comment on the report. He said that the "direct intent of preventing conception would be in violation of the Divine Law as it affects birth, according to Catholic interpretation of God's law."

"It is because a substance taken in this direct intent to prevent birth in no way differs from any other means of unnatural contraception," he said.

Natural Contraception

Dr. Sieve, who is a member of the Washington, D. C. area of the Methodist Church, also added to comment.

"It is in accord with the moral law to plan procreation in the mind of children. This discovery may enable mothers to have children with due regard for health, education and service to society. The discovery is to be commended, not condemned."

Dr. Sieve, who reported that "many more clinical data must be accumulated before the general use of this anti-fertility factor is warranted."

Declaring the substance "promotes safe and controllable anti-fertility," he said it "can be taken indefinitely without toxic (harmful) effects of permanent inhibition of fertility."

The pills must be taken for 10 consecutive days before their anti-fertility action becomes effective. They must be taken continuously thereafter to assure lack of fertility.

Dr. Sieve added: "Fertility can be restored merely by omitting the drug for a 24-hour period."

The drug is called "phosphorylated spermatase."

Dr. Sieve and other researchers had discovered that the drug showed an anti-fertility action when administered to laboratory animals. He said it confirmed much animal studies and then subjected the tests with humans.

He said the substance, a by-product of the action of a body chemical called "hyaluronidase" which is found in the seminal fluid in the impregnation of the female egg by the male sperm.

We Never Had It So Better
 We have previously noted how the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, last summer, issued a finding that the average city family spent \$400 more than it earned in 1949, and how, after the Republicans showed signs of being quick to take that statistic and apply it to the claim that "you never had it so good" under the federal department was called upon to prove that the \$400 statistic was wrong in the first place.
 Whether right or wrong—and we ourselves tend to doubt its real accuracy—the statistic has found a prominent place in Republican campaign literature and speeches. Perhaps such use of it is a bit dangerous, considering the fact that each family being appealed to on the basis of it will know its own statistics—and, if they differ, consider the Republican argument not too valid.
 But Republican use of the argument has already produced one practical dividend. It has worried the Democratic high command, and the Democratic candidate, enough to drive them into an answer, and the answer, as it was given by Governor Stevenson in St. Louis Thursday night, is really something—actually the most extravagant campaign promise of all time.
 This is the way Governor Stevenson phrased it:
 "Right now there are 62,000,000 Americans at work. During the next ten years, there will be 10,000,000 more Americans ready and able to work. With your help, we can lift our production from 338 billion dollars a year to 470 billion dollars a year."
 "These are astronomical figures. What do they mean to you and me? They mean just this: The amount that each of us can spend can be lifted by some \$500 per year by 1962. This amounts to 400 for a family of four. In other words, we can make the material good, grinding poverty in this country of ours a thing of the past."
 We might say, first, that "material good, grinding poverty" is in itself a contrast to the usual claim that "we never had it so good."
 But our main object is to pause in admiration before the bold and sweeping nature of the Stevenson promise for the future. Does the average American family go \$400 a year in the hole now? With a flick of his speech-writing talent he raises the average family income by \$24,000 a year, not only taking care of that \$400 deficit, but adding \$23,600 gravy.
 But, nasty Republicans may say, this is just a campaign promise.
 How dare they say such a thing about an utterance from Governor Stevenson? Didn't that gentleman promise to be different? Didn't he forbid himself the normal brand of political campaigning? Didn't he say he was going to talk sense to the American people? Isn't he a new Woodrow Wilson, showing any cheap appeal to the pocket-book nerve? Haven't he himself proclaimed, many times, that it is wrong to belittle the intelligence of the average American?
 So he couldn't possibly be making this statement just as a campaign promise, could he?
 Just take your bankbook down to the window, come 1962, and they'll start entering that \$24,000 a year surplus for you.
 The One Hope
 Whatever its shortcomings, whatever the honest criticisms and the sometimes lurid misunderstandings it invokes, the United Nations has one unique and compelling attribute. It is the only hope for the world. If it cannot be made to work, there is no hope

ing a UN growing in power and influence and prestige, or it's one more year spent in the United Nations Charter."
 As the new world organization's first executive officer, it is Mr. Lee's duty to remember and remind others of the concept involved in the UN, merely add to the essential malignancy of the disease they profess to be trying to cure.
 Nothing could be more important, then, than for every man being on the face of the globe to understand the role, the importance, the promise, the need, and the future of the United Nations.
 It is in awareness of this, we think, that Secretary General Trygve Lie wrote his annual report to the UN General Assembly, and especially took care to present a clear analysis of what is now the first supreme test of the life or death of the United Nations principle—the situation in Korea.
 "The Korean question," said the Secretary General, "is the most important of the issues to be dealt with by the General Assembly at its seventh session. It is important that the peoples of the world be made aware of the crucial nature of the Korean situation and the political objectives of the United Nations, but only by peaceful means."
 "The use of military force against ideologies or to achieve political objectives."
 "The military action in Korea, therefore, has been undertaken and fought by the United Nations to throw back the aggression and to bring the Korean peninsula to a state of peace and security. Until there is an armistice, it is the part of wisdom and honor to be too close for comfort to stand there, too high for conditions, the state itself is inviting crash and death."
 "One might say that the speed on these modern high-speed highways and they lose their purpose, you might just as well throw them away. They're built to accommodate crowds who want to go long distances swiftly."
 "But, so far as we can see, we have our hard-baked choice. Either we throttle down the peak traffic on these highways, or we keep throwing human lives away.



Says No School Aid Funds Until Action by Congress

Martin Receives Letter Further Explaining Rejection of Town Query

A letter presenting a further explanation of the facts surrounding the federal government's disapproval of the town's request for aid for school construction, and indicating that the town will not get any aid for school building unless and until the Congress appropriates additional funds for this purpose, was received by General Manager Richard Martin this morning.

Martin had written the Federal Security Agency, Office of Education, requesting further information after the Manchester application had been turned down last month. In his letter, he said that the Connecticut State Board of Education had received aid under circumstances similar to those under which Manchester had made its request.

Martin, whose "entitlement" had been estimated by school officials at \$328,701, had applied for reimbursement to the Federal Security Agency in the amount he had been granted under the construction of the 18-room Vernon-Lyall elementary school, which was not yet under construction. The revision of the town's application was made on the recommendation of a representative of the Federal Security Agency's Boston office and under his direction.

As a result, the government's refusal to grant aid was based on the fact that the town's application had been changed from one for reimbursement to one for new school construction, which made it impossible to grant aid also because it had been received after June 30 when the law authorizing federal aid for school construction expired for new applications.

Martin, in his letter two weeks ago, stated it was his understanding that other Connecticut communities, such as East Hartford, Eastford and Plainfield, had been allowed to change their applications and he wanted to know why Manchester could not.

The letter received from the agency today stated that these other Connecticut communities had not substituted one application for another but had applications of both types, for schools already completed and paid for by local funds and for schools proposed but not yet built, on file with the agency prior to June 30 deadline.

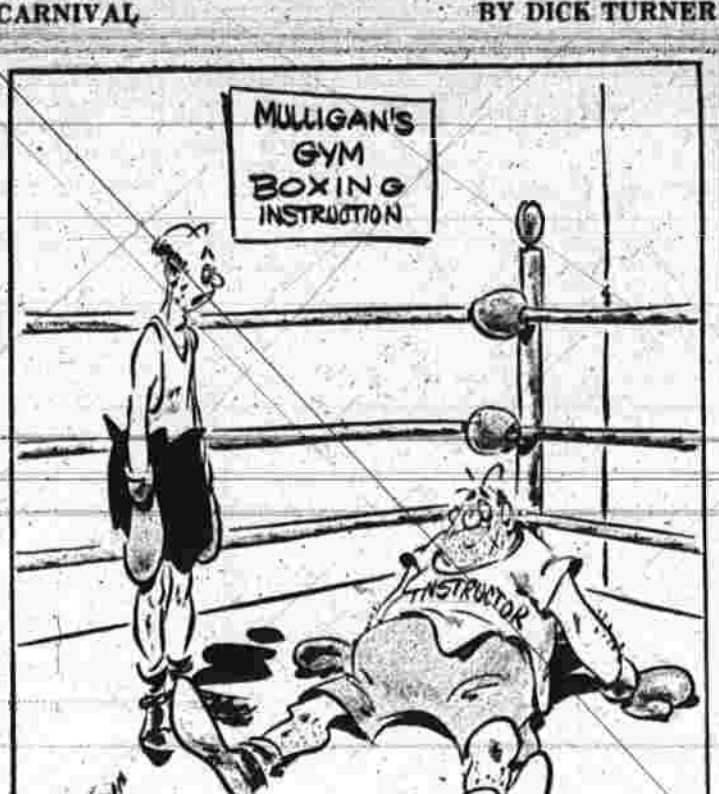

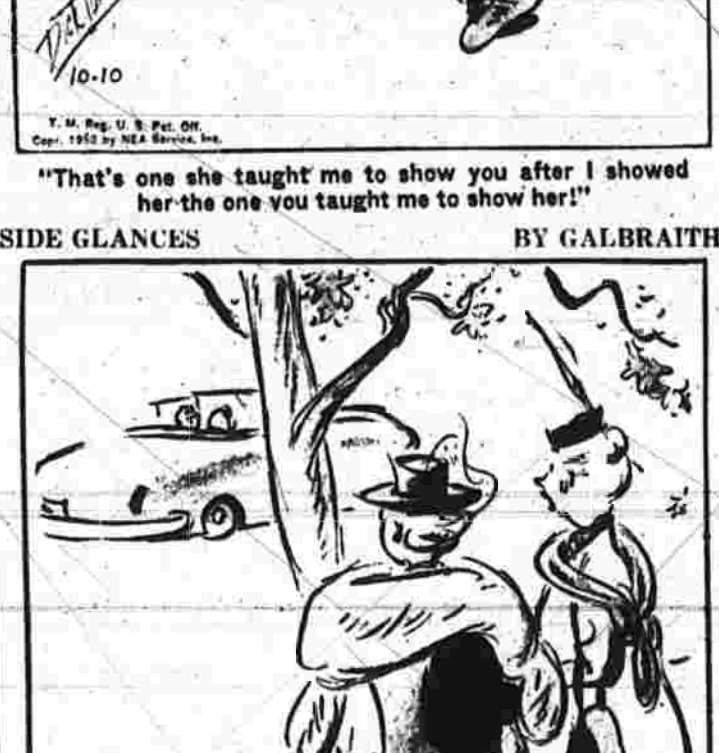

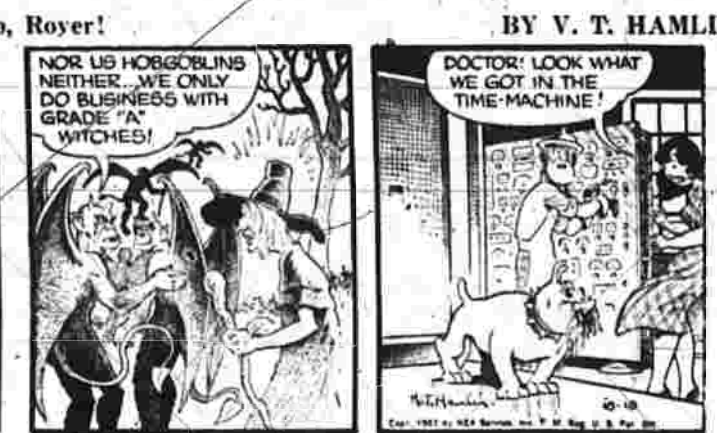

Miami, Fla., Oct. 10 (AP)—A thorough investigation was underway today to determine how \$300,000 in cash disappeared from a Miami bank.
"Rusted officials of Pan-American Airways said the money might have been stolen in flight or while the four-engine DC-6 was en route.
W. F. Lewis, assistant treasurer of the airline, who came here from New York to head the investigation, said there was also a possibility the cash might have been "misdirected."
The misdirection of the package depends on whether the trip in the mouth was accidental, which officials concede was also possible.
The package was found in Miami and the captain of the plane was arrested.
The values of money was placed as \$300,000 in the big DC-6. The fastest schedule between Miami and the capitals of South America. The inside of the aircraft, unlike two other mail and express compartments under the plane, can be entered during flight.
The money was fully insured. It remained the property of the Chase National Bank of New York while undelivered at its destination.

He told the crowd he had returned politics because he became convinced the people would accept a change from too many "hot" and too much machine politics.

"I still think you would welcome that change," he said, "a total change from the prevailing political practice of divide, exploit, tax, spend and rule."

He went on to forward to the right or to the left, but straight forward. We want to get rid of extremes and extremes and back on the middle way."
