LaBelle Slaps County Pledge

State Senate Candidate Charges GOP Violated 1950 Platform Plank

Hartford, Oct. 29—(AP)—State Rep. John LaBelle of Manchester charged in a campaign radio address here last night that the Republicans violated a 1950 pledge to abolish the present county governments.

LaBelle, Democratic candidate for the State Senate in the Fourth District, declared that the Republicans had campaigned in a pledge to create a single supervisor for each county.

Noting that the Democrats "have introduced into the House of Representatives a resolution calling for the election of the county supervisors" but said absolutely nothing about abolishing the present county form of government or doing away with the 34 county commissions.

LaBelle, who explained the operation of the county form of government, said his party offered these alternatives: State judges Department. Jails would be operated by the county sheriff who is elected and holds office under a State Corrections department.

Heavy Vote Seen On Tobacco Quota

Hartford, Oct. 29—(AP)—A heavy vote in the early morning hours today indicated that before nightfall most of the 2,000 eligible voters in the Connecticut valley will have turned out for the annual, federal, referendum on whether to adopt tobacco quotas.

The program won by a slim margin two years ago but was rejected by an equally slim margin last year when the action involved the 1952 crop.

After a year of no support the polling places today gave evidence of greater interest than ever in the referendum. The federal program requires a support of two-thirds of those voting to be adopted.

In the first hour and a half at South Windsor 26 growers had voted out of a possible 150. This was a heavier early vote than last year according to Joseph Kravitz, of Weymouth, Production and Marketing Administration committee member officiating.

On the other hand the voting at the East Hartford polling place, which included the Mansfield tobacco area, was very light with only three farmers casting ballots in the first hour. Nevertheless, PMA Committee member Everett Schaefer of East Hartford said a broadleaf tobacco grower predicted the final vote will be heavier this year.

East Windsor reported a heavy turnout by growers in the past few mornings activity was the fact that the dry weather has prevented growers from working on tobacco in the fields.

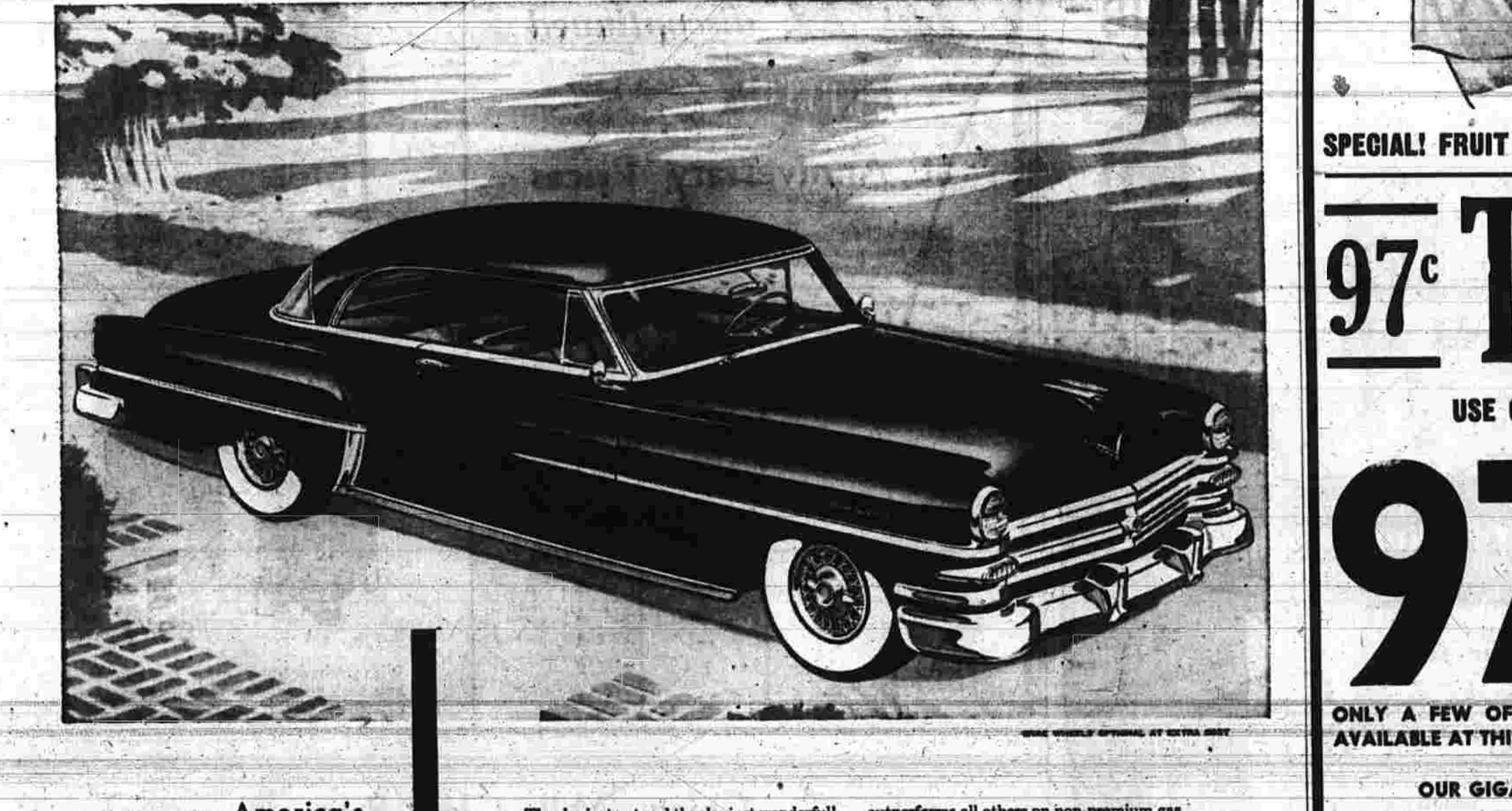

of the state's governmental structure, followed by the accomplishment of forward efficiency and economy found possible. The Lodge record consists, fourth, of plans in process and things it is hoped can be done, and in this area there has been a pattern formulating which is impressive. What it amounts to, in prospect, is an actual carrying out of the sound, more businesslike proposals for reorganization of the state government which have been advanced over the years, in one study or another, but which have never before had a consistent, persuasive, common sense administration—actually making a measured effort to put them into effect. In all aspects of this Lodge record, the attitude of the Democrats in the state legislature, under the leadership of Democratic State Chairman John Bailey, has been such as to set up a sort of cat and mouse game, in which the main object of the Democrats has been to stave any Republican promise of actual accomplishment. If the Republicans were trying to pass some constructive reform measure, the Democrats suddenly were not there. If the Democrats could figure it out that the Republicans would be easy targets for a piece of legislation, then they were for it. They had two concerns—first, that nothing constructive should be done; second, that if something were done, it should be the Democrats who could claim credit for it. Occasionally—as in the dual job bill—the Republicans outwitted the Democrats at this game by pointing out and accepting a Democratic proposal to the chagrin of the Democrats. But, most of the time, the Democrats were playing money politics with the Republicans will to accomplish something.

It is supposed that, realistically speaking, and the game of politics being what it is, there is never likely to be a much different kind of vote for a Democratic legislative opposition in a Republican administration. To harass and embarrass, to oppose what is proposed, and propose what is opposed, to allow just where the administration trying to accomplish something isn't—all that is natural political strategy. That doesn't mean that we voters have to approve it, or reward it, or continue it. What the Lodge administration has been doing, what it has been trying to do, and what it intends to do make up a pattern so remarkable it deserves a special vote of confidence, even in a year when presidential issues dominate our thinking.

On the Manchester machine, three votes can be cast to give the Lodge administration such a vote of confidence, to give its best endeavors legislative support and sympathy rather than Bailey obstructionism. These are the votes for Sherwood Bowers and Ray Warren, Manchester's Republican candidates for the House of Representatives, and for Senator Elmer Watson, Republican candidate for reelection in the Fourth Senatorial District. The best state administration of many years deserves legislators who will help, not hinder, its efforts on behalf of all the people.

Low Moment
To transpose Senator McCarthy, it would be high comedy if it weren't such low tragedy. We realize that one moment of this presidential campaign concerned itself exclusively with the question of how long somebody had known Alger Hiss and who, among two men, began to suspect him first. This was the argument between Adlai Stevenson and John Foster Dulles, each maintaining that the other had maintained faith in Hiss the longest. What in the world difference did it make? Hiss operated behind a perfect exterior. What he did was "keep it secret" to the knowledge of nobody except his fellow conspirators. In public, and in the routine of his official duties, he quite naturally took care never to seem sympathetic to the purposes or the stratagems of Russian diplomacy. He could never afford to attract suspicion to himself by taking sides with the Russians in the realm of policy or sentiment. It was therefore, absolutely impossible for anyone except the Communists themselves to know what he might be doing, and there has never been any record that anybody else at any time ever suspected him of anything. If one of his associates had had finally, denounced him, Alger Hiss would still be undetected today, and probably higher than ever in the esteem of Governor Stevenson and John Foster Dulles, so that each of them would probably consider him suitable for high place in the administration taking over next January.

This would be no reflection on either of them, any more than there is any reflection upon hundreds of people of all kinds who know Hiss in many activities and never once suspected him. What Dulles and Stevenson were arguing about the other day, was, of course, how long it took each of them, after the first charges against Hiss had been made by Chambers, to reach the conclusion that Hiss was guilty. Both seemed to claim that the developments of the first trial convinced them, which was more than happened for the jurors, who disagreed. All this, as we say, would be ridiculous, if it weren't so tragic. In the present context of our affairs, it seems a deadly serious business, and that we should elevate such a question to a position of serious importance in a presidential campaign is tragic. On such a basis, we ought to run Chambers for president. He knew Hiss was guilty all the time.

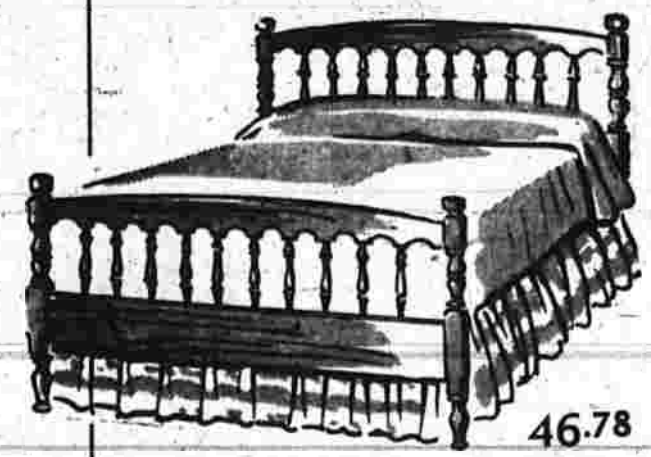

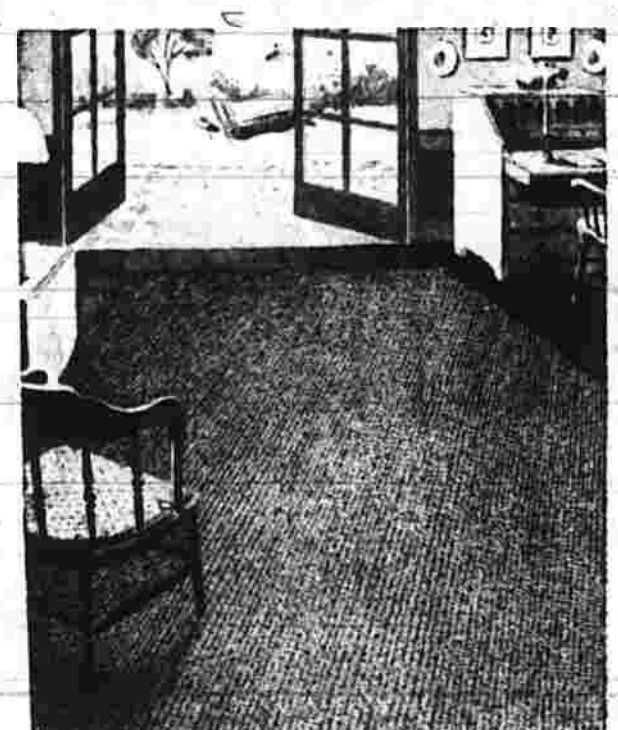

Long Political Campaigns Held Dangerous, Senseless

Washington, Oct. 28.—(AP)—May be it will take a tragedy in some future campaign—like a presidential candidate collapsing or dying from exhaustion—to awaken the politicians to a realization that the campaigns are too long. In British candidates campaign for about three weeks. That may be too short in a country that's so big. But here the campaigns spread over almost three months and that seems too long and too unbusinesslike. There hasn't been a candidate in any American campaign, including this, who couldn't say all he had to say in a lot less time. In the United States it is a fine example of why every four years our presidential races are too long. General Eisenhower and Governor Stevenson are repeating themselves.

But politicians who can't be accused of originality if it means tinkering with something that worked before, are firm believers in some things as they were always done. But this campaign, unique in American politics, will set the pattern for the future unless serious thought is given to the simple human problems involved. Young men doing it as an honor traditionally reserved for men of some standing are being exhausted younger men.

In the midst of this campaign news made known that Governor Stevenson and Eisenhower had been examined by doctors and found to be in excellent health. They've needed all of it in this campaign, which was expected to exhaust younger men. It has been the toughest campaign in history. Both men have felt an almost unbelievable pace. Crossing and re-crossing the country by plane and train, making radio and TV appearances, and listening to the news of the campaign year both the plane and TV came into big use. By both means the candidates have made more people, and often, than any others in history.

In earlier days—the days of the train only, before the plane, TV and radio—candidates would have felt they needed three months to get to the people in the majority of the four corners and out of the way places. What time is past, if they knew they had less time, the candidates say into less time. And the fewer the words—by them and all others in the campaign—the less the confusion. Eisenhower and Stevenson have been working steadily—except for about a week's vacation each—since the political campaign last July. August was used mostly in meeting people and preparing for September and October.

The speaking and trips to political headquarters have continued unabated. The endless speeches aren't all that wear and tear a candidate. Handshaking the local politicians at every stop is enough to beat a doctor's mind down. Stevenson looked tired. He said himself last week the campaigning is tiring. Physical fatigue was probably a big factor in dragging this campaign down from its original high plane to the present slum-banging and counter-charges.

When the campaign is over the winner will need a rest. Whether or not the fatigue of this campaign shortened his life won't be known until he gets into the White House. In short, the present kind of long-run political campaign is outdated and dangerous. There's no need for it any more. But it's taking too much to expect the professional politicians to do anything about it.

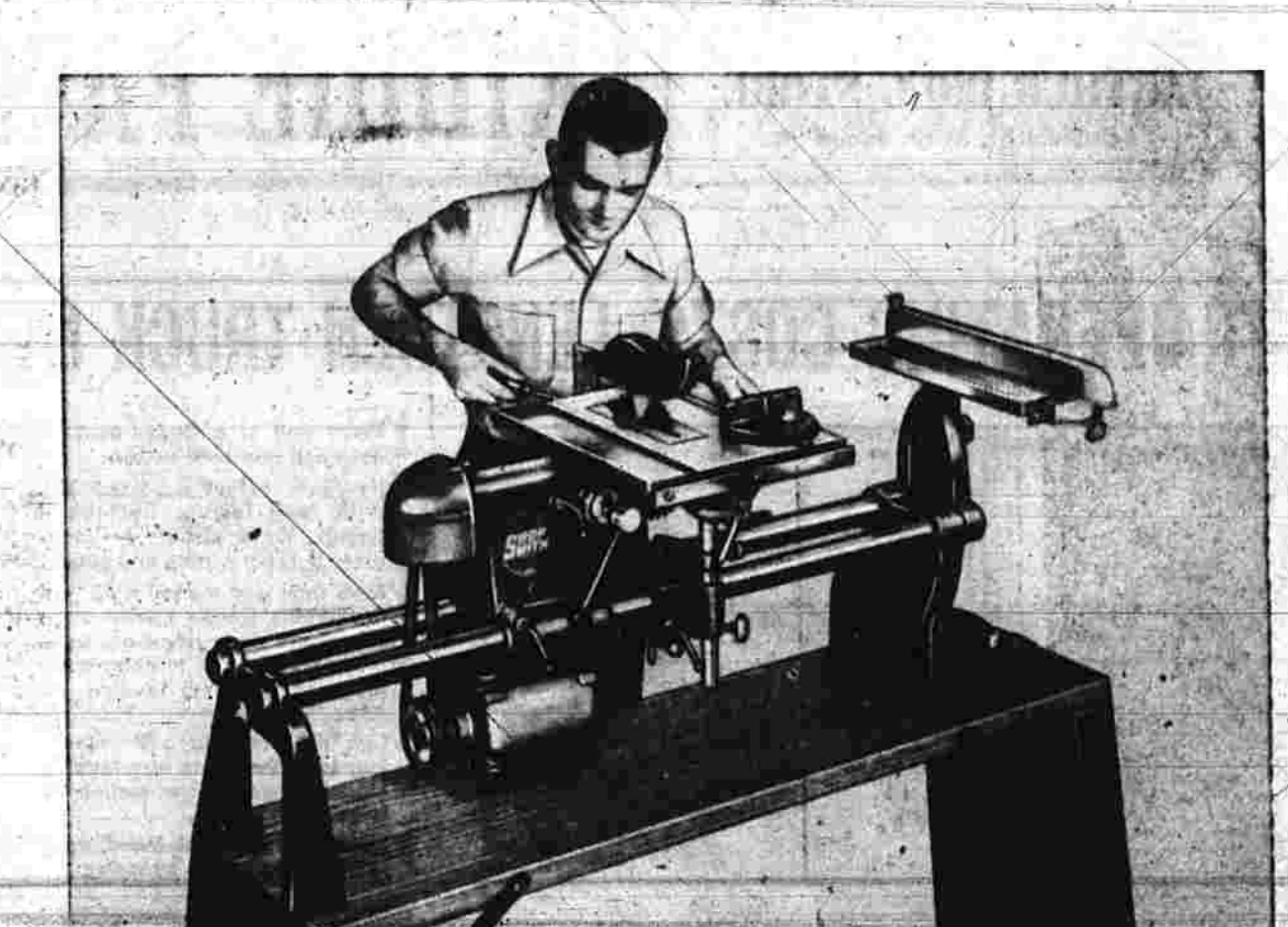

Dodd, Lupton Lock Horns at Rally As Debate Marks Spirited Session

National, State Issues Weighed by Political Candidates for Group At Verplanck School

With the grueling political campaign coming down to the wire, Democrats and Republicans clashed last night at the Verplanck School at the West. The candidates rally during which Tom Dodd, Democratic candidate for Congress from the First District, declared that "history is on my side" in his question for election, and John Mather Lupton, West Republican, asserted that "the country is sick" after 20 years of Democratic rule.

The rally, which was sponsored, originally, by the Manchester Federation of Democratic Women as a non-partisan effort to present both sides of the campaign issue, featured talks by State Representative John D. LaBelle, Democratic candidate for state senator from the Fourth District, Mrs. Katherine D. Bourne and Attorney Anthony J. Gryk, Democratic candidate for state representative.

Five Sherwood G. Rowers, Republican, who is running for reelection, as well as by Dodd and Lupton.

About 150 persons attended. Lupton, who plunged into Congress in 1946, said that he had not been elected in 1948 because of an "inflation which has broken the back of the economy," and he derived what he said was the Democratic party's claim that it was the party of prosperity or that it created prosperity.

Turning to the principals involved in the Presidential race and the Democratic ticket made on General Eisenhower for his association with the right wing of the Republican party, Lupton said that "if Eisenhower is to be asked to disavow Senator Jenner and Senator McCarthy, Stevenson should be asked to disavow Representative Kennedy of Massachusetts, whose foreign policy is far to the right of Bob Taft," and President Truman, whose campaign has been worse than McCarthy's, and all the Democrats who supported the McCarran Act.

In what amounted to a rebuttal to Lupton's "inflation," Dodd denied the country was corrupt. We admitted being "upset by the faithfulness" of a few government employees, but maintained that "the majority are honest, sincere people." He added that the Republicans are not interested so much in effecting a change as they are in getting in office themselves.

"If they were really interested in a change," he said at a later point in his talk, "they would let us in the lower house of the state legislature, which has been dominated by Republicans since the state constitution was adopted in 1842."

On Civil Rights He denied also that the Democrats have "inflamed anybody," and turning directly to the question of civil rights, which the matter of "inflation" referred to, he said "it was only good Christian and Jewish doctrine."

In this connection, Dodd, who usually speaks of the Negro problem when he discusses civil rights, expressed the view that "the Southern Democrats would get out of the party."

He charged that the worst elements in the Republican party join with the worst elements in his own to create a situation which prevents effective civil rights legislation.

He also claimed credit for the

Democratic party for the labor legislation which he said "resolves differences rather than creates them" between workers and bosses.

Dodd denied also that there are "pink eyes" in the state department and said it was "reckless to suggest that there were." He said we "should face the menace of Communism" together rather than "hang labels on each other."

As for the value of the dollar, Dodd said "it's up to the people to decide whether they are better off now" than they were under Hoover.

The local candidates devoted themselves primarily to state issues. LaBelle came out strongly for the abolition of county government, which he said is wasteful, inefficient and unnecessary.

He attacked the Republicans on this point, charging that while their 1950 state platform contained a plank calling for the abolition of county government, the only legislation involving county government that they introduced was a bill that would have created the post of county commissioner.

LaBelle also claimed credit for the Democrats for the 15-cent minimum wage law, which he said, General Eisenhower during his recent visit to Hartford miserably created, the efforts of the Lodge administration. The Republican administration in 1950, LaBelle said, did not contain a promise for a minimum wage law, and "the Republicans never introduced such a bill but the Democrats did." He said the bill had to be "forced on the Republican House of Representatives" who finally adopted "a watered-down law."

County government also came in for criticism from Attorney Gryk, who said many of its functions overlap with those of the state. He said the abolition of county government would save Manchester \$45,000 in taxes, since the town has to contribute to its support.

Mrs. Bourne, who favored more state aid to schools, recommended "re-examining the state constitution," either adopting a new one or revising drastically the present one.

She said enough money could be saved through revamping the state government to provide more
