Cracks Solid South In Flood of Ballots

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower smashed old voting records today as he won the presidency in a sprawling landslide that left control of Congress teetering in the balance between Republicans and Democrats.

With about 2,000 precincts yet to be tabulated, Eisenhower already had rolled up 27,716,106 votes—well over the previous record of 27,751,577 set by Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1936 and for our distant Wendell L. Willkie's Republican highwater mark of 22,305,198 in 1940.

But despite the Eisenhower sweep through the length and breadth of the land—including a deep ballot wedge into the no-longer-solid South—the two major parties fought down to the final count.

Republicans had a slight edge in the struggle to organize the two houses and thus control the committee. But there was nothing certain in the outcome despite the general's more than 5,000,000 popular vote advantage over Stevenson.

Stevenson, who conceded defeat in the early morning hours, lost Missouri and seemed likely to have to contend himself with the tattered remnants of once-impenetrable Dixie.

He won or was leading in only nine southern states with a meager 89 electoral votes. Eisenhower had clinched or was leading in 38 states with 442 votes—178 more than the 266 needed for election.

News of Eisenhower's victory came from the five world capitals, as indicating a continuation of American policy of resisting Communism.
