**Connecticut Yankee**

This is being written in another of those unavoidable situations which confronts a candidate for the office of Governor of the Connecticut Republic. The actual result, however, whatever it has been, has not altered the validity of our comments about the clutch performance of one Connecticut candidate.

As the campaign opened, Congressman Abe Ribicoff had won two elections by a process of following his own high notions of what campaigning should be. It was quite obvious that in his campaign for election as Senator, he would, by the process of his own intellect, and by his sense of loyalty to himself and to his opinion of the voters, attempt to adhere to similar standards in his quest for the higher office.

This obvious intention on his part was, however, frustrated by the fact that the Republican Party in the State had decided to support Senator Lodge, the leading Republican strategist at that convention. They made open league with the man who had been a Democrat, although a conservative and reactionary, than Senator Lodge, a relatively progressive Republican.

In Ohio, a somewhat similar situation existed. The Republican state machine, with which Senator Lodge was allied, and which Senator Ribicoff had opposed, was in the end, however, to support him for nomination. After Charles Taft was nominated, nonetheless, in the Ohio primary, the organization voted to support Governor Lausche, who although nominally a Democrat, is considered reactionary and conservative in comparison to Charles Taft.

In these two instances, General Eisenhower failed to pull his own weight in the Republican through-out his own home state. He was pulled into the Republican through can-campaigns in Massachusetts.

General Eisenhower has, of course, the consolation that he is not a candidate for Governor of Connecticut as a whole, as for Charles Taft he will apparently just head back to being a leading representative of the cause of civic reform and good government in Ohio, without office.
