Cites Misconceptions Which Hinder Relations Between U. S. and Britain

American misconceptions of the British Commonwealth of Nations have not helped the relationship between the United States and Great Britain, a Law Club was told last night by Hugh Davies, a native of South Wales and current exchange teacher at East Hartford High School. Davies spoke to the Lions last night.

"The American War of Independence is a big part of your country's history. In your country today, it is generally thought as a fight between the British people. This misconception has not helped our relationship.

"Another misconception is the real meaning of colonialism, as associated with the British Commonwealth of Nations. The days of colonialism when the mother country exploited her colonies is as dead as a door nail," Davies cited the dominions of the British Empire, stating, "They are completely autonomous and independent. Dominion are linked with the Commonwealth of Nations only by a common outlook on life, common blood lines, love of liberty and freedom and such trade arrangements as they may work out with each other."

Davies is a graduate of the University of Wales and now works in England and Africa. He is a teacher of English and is in demand by many organizations in this country as a lecturer on international relations.

Looking Ahead

In looking to the future, Davies predicted, "Within 30 years most of the colonies in the British Commonwealth will have dominion status. Exceptions would be made in those colonies too young to stand on their own feet and those auxiliary in need of financial assistance. Colonies threatened on the international checkerboard outside influence should be kept in the fold."

Davies continued, "Present movement in the British Empire is definitely toward self government for the colonies. Eventually all should have free parliamentary government. Dominion status will be given when the colony is ready and when the time is right. When history is written, the British Em-

pire will take credit for having added more free world nations to the scene than any other nation."

Davies pointed out a major problem of the Commonwealth of Nations is economic. "In spite of various economic conditions at home, Britain has provided \$100,000,000 a year since the war to develop new methods and raise the standards of living in many colonies. This year \$100,000,000 will go to Africa alone. Even with these expenditures, it will be difficult to raise the standards of living.

"Because the United States is one of the most powerful and richest nations in the world," said Davies, "it finds its destiny, as shared by many of the burdens of other nations, receiving little thanks. An example of this is Korea. The United States is assuming many of the responsibilities now that in centuries past were accepted by the British Empire."

Mr. Davies expressed his confidence in the ability of this country to carry on its responsibilities.
