Tangier, International Zone, Morocco, Dec. 20.—(AP)—Sidney H. Paley, 32, a Jersey City, N. J., man who manufactures nylon panties here, was convicted today of piracy. ## UN to Ask Big 4 Pact On Austria

The Soviet Union and her four Communist allies refused to vote on the subject, declaring the UN had no right to discuss what they claim is strictly the business of the four powers. Roger's more serious condition was the result of his being born with a large brain tumor. Surgeons decided to give it to Rodney "now" they found "no hope" for either.
