(Continued from Page One) The report was written by the Commerce Department's Office of Business Economics after a six-month study in which other government agencies and the Committee for Economic Development (CED) cooperated.

single North Korean target since last August, struck back at a ground assault on the peninsula from last night. Bug-in UN troops drove and gave the Reds a reprieve from their night-in pre-dawn darkness this morning.

Today the war slackened off to a verbal offensive in which the Reds urged Allied soldiers to surrender or enjoy a "New Year's celebration" in North Korea.

Steady skies and snow squalls grounded most UN warplanes today and gave the Reds a reprieve from hampering Allied air blows.

Four jets patrolled MIG ally but four were shot down.

The Air Force buried a 200-pound bomb in an area where a supply center near Pyongyang, the North Korean capital, Sunday morning.

When the North Korean air force was destroyed, the ally's supply lines were cut off.

The Red ground attack hit Allied positions on Rocky Point, a spur of the main front line, Sunday night. The Reds hit first with two platoons, then built up a major force of about 200 men. For five hours the crack of machine guns and mortar fire rang from the frozen Kumhwa ridges in the face of massed Allied fire.

The Reds had their loudspeakers up and were shouting their night and asked UN troops to surrender.

Previously the Communists have accompanied their demands for a cease-fires with threats, such as the one on Sunday. That warning was repeated on Christmas.

Such warnings were repeated on Monday and Tuesday.

On Monday, the Communists were seen in the face of massed Allied fire.

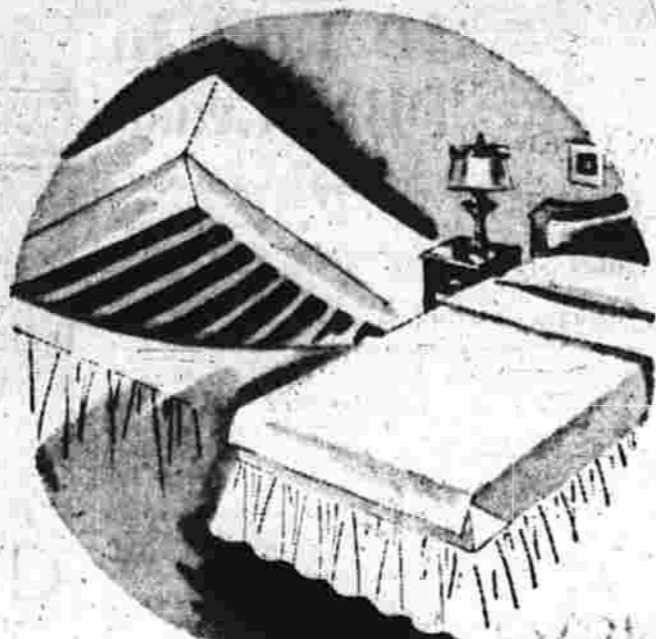
