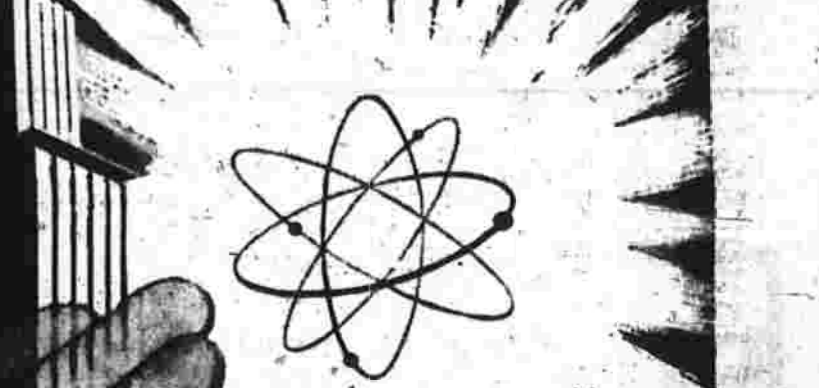

Dancoose Will Appear in Superior Court to Answer Charge of Rape

Wilfred Dancoose, 26, of 2 Hale road, accused of rape, was ordered bound over to the next session of Superior Court by Judge John S. G. Rottner in Town Court this morning.

Dancoose is being represented by Attorney Bernard J. Ackerman of Rockville.

"According to the National Safety Council, in 1951 more than one out of five fatal traffic accidents involved a motorist or pedestrian who had been drinking," Chief Schendel said.

He pointed out that in Manchester last year drinking was a factor in 47 reported accidents.

Winter, with slippery pavements and earlier hours of darkness, makes drinking a real hazard for motorists and pedestrians alike, Chief Schendel said.

He particularly warned motorists about holiday drinking. "Office parties and other celebrations during the holiday season frequently tempt motorists to drink more than they should," he said.

The chief suggested that drivers about to leave social functions where they have been drinking form taxi-cab pools.

"Your share of the cab fare is a small price to pay for your personal welfare," he reminded such motorists.

"Holiday Hazards" is the December traffic safety theme of the Manchester Police Department and the National Safety Council.
