**The Alps On The Bomb**  
 The Alps in the Harford County Monday, presented their doubts about the destructiveness of the hydrogen bomb. The country was not, however, as terrified. They guessed that the bomb would kill all unprotected life within an area of 10 square miles. That the explosion would severely blast an area of 140 square miles, leaving a trail of destruction and more spots ruin through an area of 260 square miles, that the heat of the bomb would ignite combustible material and cause a fire three degrees burns on exposed skin, within a area of 300 square miles, that the bomb would leave behind it a forest of fire which would kill by exhausting the oxygen in the air throughout an unpredictable area, and finally that the new bomb would contribute, in a small but quite measurable way, to the heating of the earth's envelope of air known to the higher forms of life.
