Rockville Bedside Nursing Fees Up 50 Cents over Last Year

Rockville, Jan. 9. — (Special) — Miss Lucille Kuhnly, of the board of directors of the Rockville Public Health Nursing association announced that as of Jan. 1, 1953, the fee has been increased from \$1.50 a visit to \$2.00 for bedside nursing care.

Miss Kuhnly states that the board was most reluctant to increase the fee, but an increase in cost for almost all items of operation and a decrease in income makes it necessary.

Metropolitan Commission Meets

The second meeting of the committee appointed by Mayor Frederick S. Berger was held last evening to further study the proposed Metropolitan district for Rockville and vicinity. Representatives from the State Board of Health and the State Water Commission were present to tell the state's side of the story to the committee.

No Action Taken

It was announced after the meeting that no definite progress or action has been taken by the committee who are going to continue their studies of the problem confronting the establishment of a Metropolitan district.

Horowitz Foundation Fund

The William Horowitz Foundation Swimming Pool fund has reached a total of Jan. 5 of \$4,828. This includes a contribution of \$1,000 from Harry Lieberman and \$500 from William Horowitz of the Hartford Connecticut Trust Company and \$250 from Clyde Gil of the Clyde Chevrolet-Buick Company.

An analysis of the total collections to date indicates that the \$10,122 contributed from outside the community represents 149 separate contributions; that 17 organizations are reflected in the \$10,122 which has come from community organizations; and that 220 individuals have come from individuals and companies in Rockville in the total of \$8,766.88. In all 40 contributions are reflected in the total to date.

Court Rules AIOC To Get Oil Cargo

charter company, the A. G. Bubenberger Company of Switzerland, applied for an order staying execution of the court order.

The Rose Mary was carrying 1,000 tons of oil when she left from Abadan. She was defying the British, who had served notice upon prospective buyers that AIOC claimed title to oil in storage in Iraq pending settlement of the nationalization dispute.

The oil purchased at 18 per cent below the prevailing world price, was consigned to a Swiss purchaser.

The British acted quickly when a small tanker put into Aden last June 17. Police went aboard immediately.

On the next day the British obtained a temporary injunction banning the tanker from leaving Aden. An armed guard was posted aboard the tanker to see that the injunction was not violated.

Hearing on a final decision opened Dec. 10. Representing the British was Sir Hartley Shawcross, attorney general in the former-Labour government. He argued before the court that AIOC had not accepted nationalization and still held title to the oil.

Attorneys for the Italian firm that chartered the tanker took the view that the oil was Iran's to sell to any purchaser and the British were acting illegally in trying to prevent the oil from reaching its destination.

In Rome, Count Ettore Della Zocca, chairman of the Itala Oil Company, assailed today's verdict as unjust and said an appeal would be filed as soon as the findings can be studied. He estimated the value of the cargo at about \$40,000.
