Rockville Driver Arrested in Crash; Hits Car at Rear of House

Rockville, Jan. 30.—(Special)—A local motorist has been arrested on a charge of reckless driving after the car he was operating left the road and traveled more than 400 feet across private property to smash a parked vehicle.

The charge was placed against Carl Gebhardt, 30, of RFD 1, when authorities were summoned to 146 West Main street about 2 1/2 p. m. today. They found that Gebhardt's car had crashed into an auto which was parked in the rear of the West Main street address. The vehicle is owned by Rose Bavier, who lives nearby.

Patrolman Edward Quinn, the arresting officer, theorized that Gebhardt was traveling east on West Main street after returning from his place of employment. 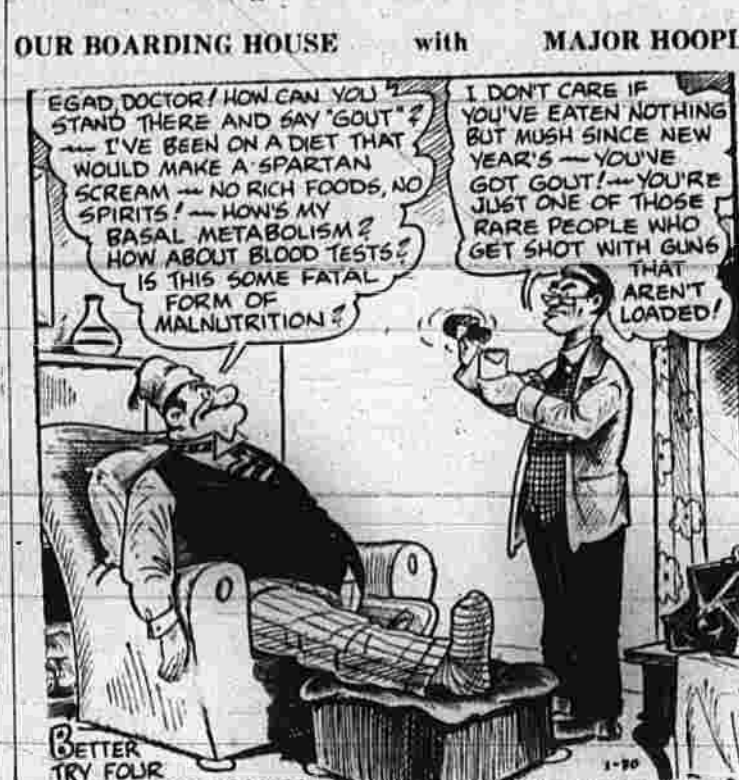
