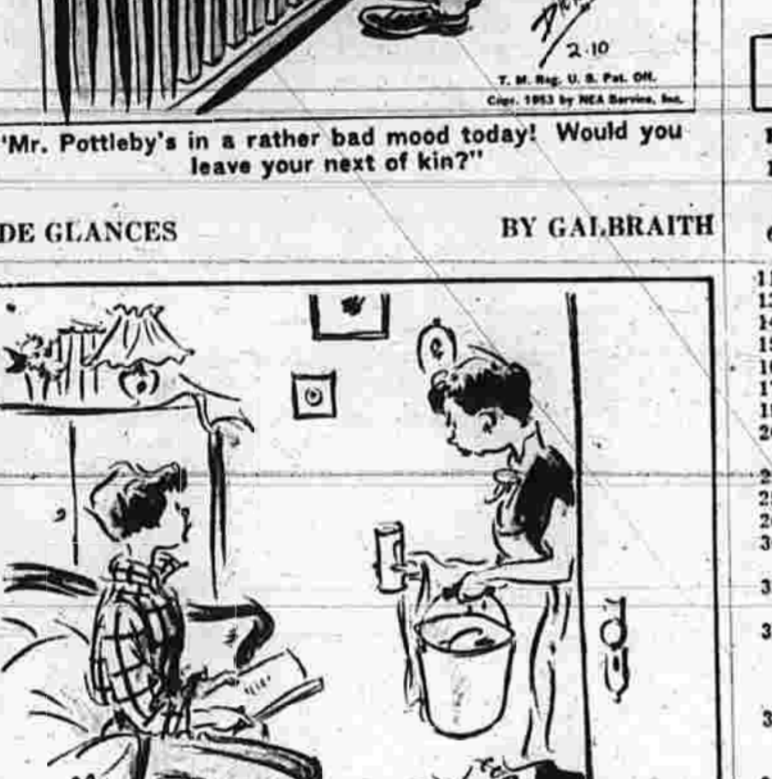

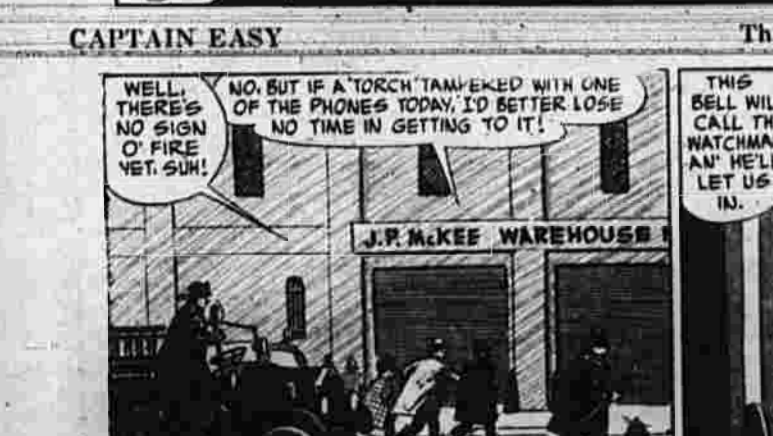

The U. S. tried some protective buying of neutral country goods which might otherwise have gone to the Axis nations. But that procedure is expensive and might result in accumulation of stocks which this country has no need to stockpile.  
An even more difficult problem is that presented by the British Crown colony of Hong Kong on the coast of South China.  
Hong Kong is a middleman's post. Formerly much of the trade arriving there was transhipped for movement into other Chinese ports. Goods shipped to Hong Kong normally were consigned to some British or British-approved firm, and would therefore be difficult to intercept before reaching Hong Kong.  
The tightest naval blockade of China probably could not plug this gap. This is true because the mainland section of the colony is the terminus of a branch railroad which connects with the mainland. The same situation would be true, although to a lesser extent, at the nearby Portuguese colony of Macao.  
International law provides that a blockade must be effective and enforceable if it is to be recognized by the community of nations. Ironically, a blockade of China by the U. S. would be rendered more difficult to enforce because Red China has virtually no sea-going fleet. The Chinese trade would be by the vast of U. S. friends.
