Rockville, March 13.—(Special)—Dr. Adam Clayton Powell, Jr., pastor of the largest Negro church in America, the Abyssinian Baptist Church of Harlem, N. Y., will be speaker at the 7:30 p.m. Sunday Lenten service at Union Congregational Church. He is a United States Representative in Congress and has become a national figure in his crusade for civil rights.

Lenten Lecturer

Dr. Powell was the first Negro to be elected to Council of New York, the first Negro Congressman from the East, and the first Negro to be elected delegate-at-large at the Democratic national convention. In 1945 he was appointed by Congress to study labor conditions in Europe.

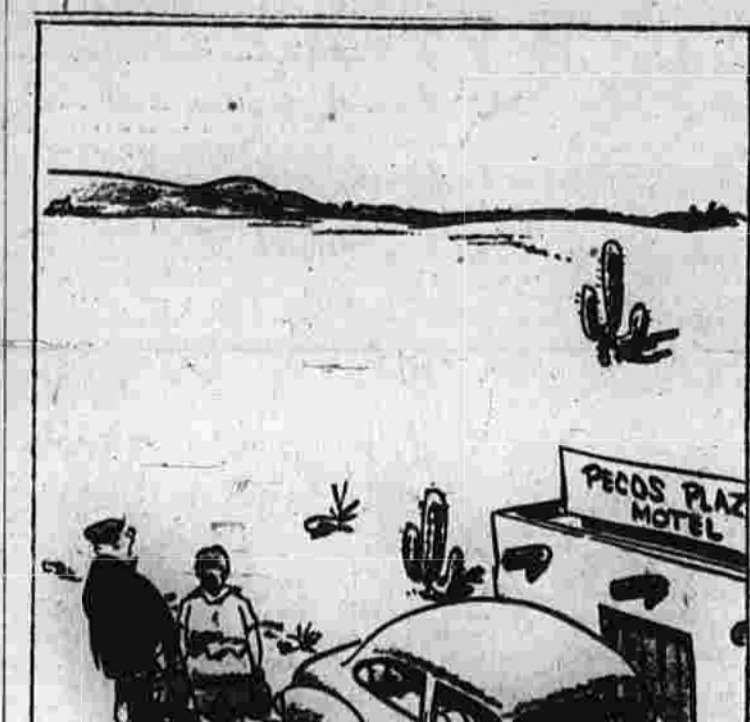

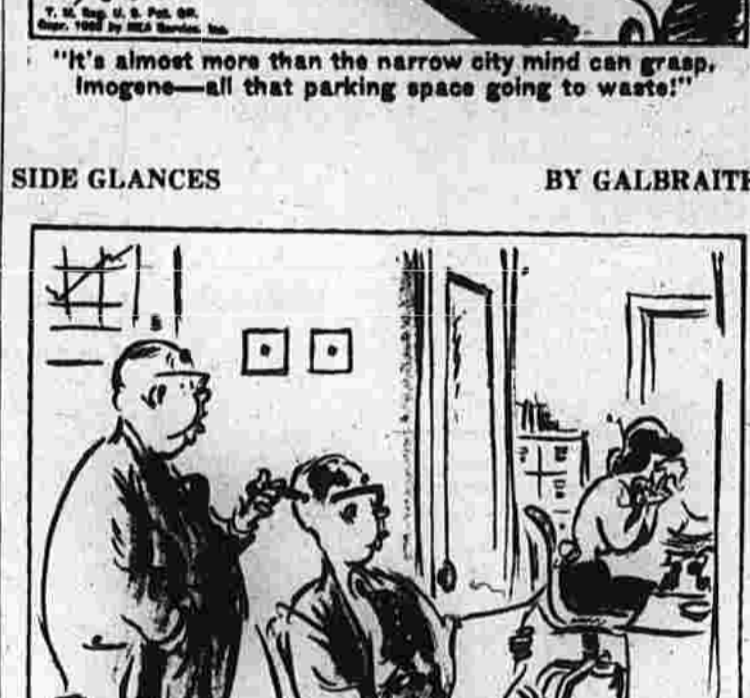

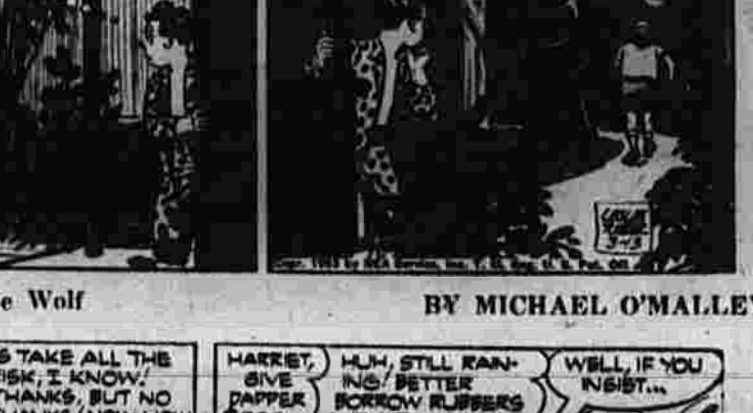
